His Majesty the KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Thomas Thomas under the following circumstances:—

On the 27th April, 1913, walling was in progress in a shaft, over 500 yards deep and 20 feet wide, in the Llewelyn Sinking Pit, belonging to the Britannic Merthyr Coal Company Limited, Gilfach Goch, Glamorganshire. Seven men were working on a stage suspended by ropes, about 10 yards from the bottom of the shaft, when a heavy fall occurred, smashing the stage and precipitating the seven men to the bottom of the shaft. As the winding rope had become entangled in the débris it was impossible to descend the shaft direct from the surface. Thomas, a mechanic employed at the colliery, and others accordingly descended another shaft to a seam where there was an inset from the Llewelyn shaft, about 70 yards from the bottom. Thomas volunteered to go down the shaft, and was let down by a rope with a loop at the end, although small falls were occurring at intervals and there was a risk of a larger fall at any moment. Successfully reaching the bottom, he found three men alive and tied them to the rope and they were drawn up separately, after which he himself was drawn up.

He ran considerable risk to his own life by his plucky conduct in descending to the rescue of his comrades.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Matthew Withers under the following circumstances:—

On the 19th August, 1913, William Brough-

ton, a dataller at the Annesley Colliery, near Nottingham, was engaged under the directions of Withers, who is a deputy, when a fall of roof took place and buried him. Withers, who was near at hand, heard the noise of the fall, and, being unable to reach the place, went round to the opposite side of the fall and managed to clear away the dirt with his hands until he reached Broughton's head, which he protected by placing a piece of timber across large stones. Another fall of roof then occurred, burying both men and extinguishing the lamp. Withers' arms, fortunately, were free, and, being able to extricate himself, he started again to rescue Broughton. Though help had arrived in the meantime, there was only room for one man to work. Withers persisted in his efforts, in spite of the injuries he had himself received, and did not stop until he had uncovered his fellow-workman sufficiently to admit of his being hauled to a place of safety.

Withers was engaged in the work of rescue for about three-quarters of an hour, during which he ran great risk of being killed or severely injured by falls of roof. Had it not been for his courage and determination, Broughton would probably have lost his life.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Devon) Order, 1913.

Dated 7th November, 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of

the Administrative County of Devon, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Devon) Order, 1913."

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Devon, so far as the undermentioned birds are concerned, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in each year:—

Bittern, Curlew or Whaup, Dotterel, Dunlin (Ploverspage, Purre or Sealark), Gannet or Solan Goose, Grebe, Hobby, Lark, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Oriole, Richard's Pipit, Water Pipit, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), Razorbill, Sanderling, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe or Otterling), Stone Curlew or Thick Knee, Tern or Sea Swallow, Whimbrel.

The close time for Wild Duck throughout the said Administrative County is hereby extended so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Devon to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the said Act:—

Snow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hobby, Kestrel, Merlin, Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Osprey, Richard's Pipit, Water Pipit, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Wild Swan, Bearded Titmouse (Reedling or Reed Pheasant).

The Shag and Cormorant deprived of protection.

IV. The whole of the Administrative County of Devon is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the undermentioned Birds are concerned:—

Shag, Cormorant.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Devon:—

Cirl Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chough, Goldfinch, Guillemot or Willock, Gulls, Hawfinch, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Osprey, Owls, Oyster Catcher, Lesser Redpole, Reeve or Ruff, Wild Swan, Bearded Titmouse (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Woodpecker, Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is pro-

hibited throughout the Administrative County of Devon:—

Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Bittern, Little Bittern, Chough, Common Crossbill, Dipper, Dunlin (Ploverspage, Purre or Sealark), Rock Dove, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Gannet, Goldfinch, Common Guillemot, Great Black-backed Gull, Lesser Black-backed Gull, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hawfinch, Night Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Ring Ouzel, Osprey, Oyster Catcher, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Tawny Owl, Rose-coloured Pastor, Quail, Raven, Razorbill, Redstart, Green Sandpiper, Common Snipe, Wild Swan, White Wagtail, Black-headed Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Woodcock, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Fire-crested Wren.

All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the following areas for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

- (i.) Lundy Island and the neighbouring islets.
- (ii.) Baggy Point district, situate in the parish of Georgeham, and bounded by the sea from the coast off Croyde Bay House to that off Vention Cottages, and thence by the roads passing near Croyde Village, by way of Vention-lane, Stentaway-lane and Moor-lane, to the coast off Croyde Bay House.
- (iii.) Clovelly district, being the parishes of Abbotsham, Alwington, Clovelly, Hartland, Parkham, Welcombe, and Woolfardisworthy (West).
- (iv.) Lynton district, being the parishes of Lynton and Countisbury.
- (v.) Slapton Ley and Start district, being the parishes of Stokenham, Slapton and Blackawton.

Repeal of former Order.

VIII. The Order of the 22nd January, 1913, is hereby repealed.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Dorset to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—Cirl Bunting, Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Crossbill, Peregrine Falcon, Red-footed Falcon, Spotted Flycatcher, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Osprey, Raven, Red-backed Shrike, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Wood Warbler, Whinchat, Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate, Snake Bird).

The Schedule above referred to includes the following birds:—American Quail, Auk, Avocet, Bee-Eater, Bittern, Bonxie, Colin, Cornish Chough, Coulterneb, Cuckoo, Curlew, Diver, Dotterel, Dunbird, Dunlin, Eider Duck, Fern Owl, Fulmar, Gannet, Goatsucker, Godwit, Goldfinch, Grebe, Greenshank, Guillemot, Gull (except Black-backed Gull), Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake, Lapwing, Lark, Loon, Mallard, Marrot, Merganser, Murre, Night Hawk, Nightjar, Nightingale, Oriole, Owl, Ox Bird, Oyster Catcher, Peewit, Petrel, Phalarope, Plover, Ploverspage, Pochard, Puffin, Purre, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper, Scout, Sealark, Seamew, Sea Parrot, Sea Swallow, Shearwater, Sheldrake, Shoveller, Skua, Smew, Snipe, Solan Goose, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew, Stonehatch, Summer Snipe, Tarrock, Teal, Tern, Thick-knee, Tystey, Whaup, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Wild Duck, Willock, Woodcock, Woodpecker.

Extension of Close Time throughout the County.

III.—(a) The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Dorset, so far as regards the Birds added to the Schedule of the said Act by Clause II of this Order, and all the Birds mentioned in the said Schedule, except Golden Plover, Snipe, Wild Duck (all species) and Woodcock, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in any year.

(b) The close time for Golden Plover, Snipe, Wild Duck (all species), and Woodcock shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year.

Certain Birds deprived of protection.

IV. The whole of the Administrative County of Dorset is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880,

as to the undermentioned Birds:—Cormorant, Wood Pigeon, Shag, House Sparrow.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause III (a) of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Dorset:—Bittern, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chough, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Thick-knee), Red-footed Falcon, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Wood Lark, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Night Hawk, Fern Owl), Golden Oriole, Osprey, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Tawny or Wood Owl, Raven, Spoonbill, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Dartford Warbler, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Dorset:—Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Chough, Coot, Curlew, Stone Curlew (Thick-knee), Dipper or Water Ouzel, Wild Duck, Peregrine Falcon, Spotted Flycatcher, Guillemot, Hen Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Sky Lark, Wood Lark, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goatsucker, Night Hawk, Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Tawny or Wood Owl, Oyster Catcher, Pochard, Raven, Razorbill, Puffin, Ringed Plover, Sheldrake, Red-backed Shrike, Snipe, Dartford Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Whinchat, Woodcock, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Green Woodpecker, and (after April 15th in each year) Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover).

All Eggs protected in Certain Areas.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited within the undermentioned areas for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

(a) The districts or areas known as the Chesil Bank, commencing at the south-west corner of the Abbotsbury Swannery, together with East and West Fleet, to the south-eastern end of the said East Fleet. The coast from Bincleave Rocks, thence around the Weymouth Backwater and Lodmoor to the old Coastguard Station at the end of Preston Beach road.

And in every case a distance of 2 furlongs inland from the nearest point of high water mark or edge of marsh land.

(b) The district or area within a line drawn from the coast at the South end of Little Sea to Claywell, thence to a point in the road opposite the South end of Wyth Fir Pound, thence along the road to Corfe Castle, thence through Wareham to Stroud Bridge along the Bere and Wareham main road (including Green Pond, situate on the Rempstone Estate, Corfe Castle), thence to a point, on the Poole and Dorchester main road about 3 furlongs west-

ward from Morden Mill, thence along the said Poole and Dorchester main road to Morden Mill, Park Corner, Slepe, North Holton Farm, Lytchett Minster through Upton to Fleets Corner, Longfleet and Poole, thence along the main road from Poole to the county boundary at Bournemouth, and along such boundary to the coast; which said districts and areas are outlined in red on five Ordnance Sheets, numbered 328, 329, 341, 342 and 343 respectively, deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, each sheet being sealed with the seal of the Secretary of State, and dated the 7th November, 1913.

(Purchase of the Undertaking of the Mexbrough and District Water Company Limited, and vesting same in the Council; Restricting Expenditure of Company; Supply of Water; Limits of Supply; Maintenance and Improvement of Existing Works; Provisions for Protection of Waterworks; Rates and Charges; Supply of Fittings; General Provisions with regard to the Supply of Water; Power to Acquire Lands and Easements; Borrowing of Money; Financial Provisions; Bye-laws and Penalties; Incorporation, Amendment, and Repeal of Acts, &c.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the urban district council of the urban district of Mexbrough, in the West Riding of the county of York (in this Notice referred to as "the Council"), for leave to bring in a Bill for all or some of the following purposes, namely:—

1. To empower the Council to purchase and acquire and to provide for the transfer to and vesting in the Council of the undertaking, works, mains, lands, pipes, easements, property (both real and personal), rights, powers and authorities of the Mexbrough and District Water Company Limited (in this Notice referred to as "the Company"), for such price or consideration, and upon and subject to such terms, conditions, and stipulations as may be prescribed by the Bill, or as may be agreed upon between the Council and the Company, or as may be settled by arbitration or otherwise, and to provide that the Company shall sell and transfer the same accordingly, and to define what is to be comprised in the expression "the water undertaking" of the Company.

2. To make further provision with regard to the transfer of the undertaking of the Company and other properties proposed to be acquired by the Council from the Company, and to provide for the payment of the purchase money, the discharge of all debts and liabilities, the payment of outgoings up to the completion of the purchase, the continuance of contracts, and generally to provide for the maintenance of the undertaking until the transfer.

3. To provide that any liability or expense incurred by the Company after the first day of November, 1913, on capital account or in the promotion of any Bill in Parliament or any Provisional Order shall be discharged and paid by the Company out of the purchase price of the undertaking, and shall not fall upon the Council, and otherwise to restrict the powers of the Company.

4. To provide that no person shall, without the consent of the Council, sink or make any well, shaft, bore or other excavation, or work in any lands adjoining the waterworks of the Company, whereby any springs of water may be tapped or interfered with, and to impose penalties in respect of any breach thereof.

5. To authorize the Council to supply water

for all purposes within the urban district of Mexborough.

6. To authorize the Council to maintain, renew, extend, enlarge, alter and repair the waterworks comprised in the water undertaking of the Company, and to construct such subsidiary works as may be necessary or convenient in connection therewith, and to use the same for the purpose of taking, intercepting and impounding any water that can be taken, intercepted or impounded by means of any of such works.

7. To authorize the Council to purchase and take on lease lands and easements for any of the purposes of the intended Act, and to enter into and carry into effect agreements with respect to the drainage of any lands within the drainage area of the reservoirs and other waterworks authorized to be acquired by them under the intended Act, and to hold, let, sell or dispose of any lands, houses, buildings or works for the time being belonging to them, and not required for the purposes of their undertaking, and on such sale or disposal to reserve water and other rights.

8. To empower the Council to make bye-laws for the prevention of pollution of the sources of supply and to enable them to discharge water from their waterworks into any stream or watercourse.

9. To make general provisions in regard to the supply of water by the Council, and particularly with respect to the following matters:

Limiting the powers of the Council to abstract water; the pressure at which water is to be supplied; the provision of cisterns for high-level supplies; the detection of waste; the power to make bye-laws for preventing waste of water; the terms on which water may be supplied for domestic purposes or by meter, and the supply to houses partly used for trade; the connecting and disconnecting of meters; the laying of mains and pipes in private streets; the purchase, sale, supply, letting, fixing, altering and repair by the Council of meters, baths, cisterns, pipes, sanitary and other fittings; the provision of separate communication pipes for each house; agreements for supply in bulk; requiring notice to be given by consumers of discontinuance of supply; authorizing the removal of stand pipes; imposing penalties for the injuring of meters; making provision as to owners paying water charges on small houses; and with regard to the proper registration of meters; empowering Council to enter houses to remove meters and fittings; and to require that houses shall not be occupied without a proper water supply.

10. To authorize the Council to levy and recover rates, rents, and charges for the supply of water for domestic or other purposes by a charge fixed according to the rateable or annual value of the house supplied, or by a charge per thousand gallons for the water consumed or taken by a supply by meter, prescribing an additional charge for water supplied for washing horses, carriages or motor-cars, or for other purposes in stables or premises where horses, carriages, or motor-cars are kept, or for garden purposes, or if a hose pipe or similar apparatus

is used; to levy and recover charges for the supply of meters and fittings, to increase, reduce or alter such rates, rents or charges, and to allow discounts and to compound for the payment of rates on small houses.

11. To enable the Council to raise money by mortgage or otherwise for any of the purposes of the intended Act, and to charge the moneys so borrowed on the revenues of any of their undertakings and on the district fund and general district rate or other funds, rates and properties of or under the control of the Council, to prescribe the period within which such moneys shall be repaid, and to provide that the provisions of section 234 of the Public Health Act, 1875, shall not apply to moneys so borrowed.

12. To empower the Council to use one form of mortgage for all purposes, and to include in all mortgages granted by them all the rates, properties and revenues of the Council, and to confer further financial powers upon the Council.

13. To make provision for the application of the revenues arising from the water undertaking of the Council, and that any deficiency in that revenue and any expense incurred in carrying out the powers to be conferred by the intended Act shall be charged upon the district fund and general district rate of the district.

14. To prescribe the terms and conditions upon which any arbitration between the Company and the Council shall proceed and to limit the expenses to be incurred at any such arbitration.

15. To make further provision with regard to the evidence of appointment of officers of the Council, the confirmation of bye-laws, the recovery of demands and penalties, the right of appeal, the authentication and service of notices, the application of penalties, the indemnification of persons acting under the powers of the Bill, the saving for indictments, that justices shall not be disqualified, and other provisions of a general character.

16. To incorporate and apply with or without modification or render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the following Acts—namely, the Lands Clauses Acts, the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863, the Local Loans Act, 1875, and the Arbitration Act, 1889, and any Act amending those Acts respectively.

17. To repeal, alter or amend all or any of the provisions of the Mexborough and District Water Order, 1879, and any other Act or Order relating to the Company.
