All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the following areas for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

- (i.) Lundy Island and the neighbouring islets.
- (ii.) Baggy Point district, situate in the parish of Georgeham, and bounded by the sea from the coast off Croyde Bay House to that off Vention Cottages, and thence by the roads passing near Croyde Village, by way of Vention-lane, Stentaway-lane and Moor-lane, to the coast off Croyde Bay House.
- (iii.) Clovelly district, being the parishes of Abbotsham, Alwington, Clovelly, Hartland, Parkham, Welcombe, and Woolfardisworthy (West).
- (iv.) Lynton district, being the parishes of Lynton and Countisbury.
- (v.) Slapton Ley and Start district, being the parishes of Stokenham, Slapton and Blackawton.

Repeal of former Order.

VIII. The Order of the 22nd January, 1913, is hereby repealed.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Dorset) Order, 1913.

Dated 7th November, 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of

the Administrative County of Dorset, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Dorset) Order, 1913."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Dorset to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—Cirl Bunting, Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Crossbill, Peregrine Falcon, Red-footed Falcon, Spotted Flycatcher, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Osprey, Raven, Red-backed Shrike, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Wood Warbler, Whinchat, Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate, Snake Bird).

The Schedule above referred to includes the following birds:—American Quail, Auk, Avocet, Bee-Eater, Bittern, Bonxie, Colin, Cornish Chough, Coulterneb, Cuckoo, Curlew, Diver, Dotterel, Dunbird, Dunlin, Eider Duck, Fern Owl, Fulmar, Gannet, Goatsucker, Godwit, Goldfinch, Grebe, Greenshank, Guillemot, Gull (except Black-backed Gull), Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake, Lapwing, Lark, Loon, Mallard, Marrot, Merganser, Murre, Night Hawk, Nightjar, Nightingale, Oriole, Owl, Ox Bird, Oyster Catcher, Peewit, Petrel, Phalarope, Plover, Ploverspage, Pochard, Puffin, Purre, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper, Scout, Sealark, Seamew, Sea Parrot, Sea Swallow, Shearwater, Sheldrake, Shoveller, Skua, Smew, Snipe, Solan Goose, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew, Stonehatch, Summer Snipe, Tarrock, Teal, Tern, Thick-knee, Tystey, Whaup, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Wild Duck, Willock, Woodcock, Woodpecker.

Extension of Close Time throughout the County.

III.—(a) The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Dorset, so far as regards the Birds added to the Schedule of the said Act by Clause II of this Order, and all the Birds mentioned in the said Schedule, except Golden Plover, Snipe, Wild Duck (all species) and Woodcock, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in any year.

(b) The close time for Golden Plover, Snipe, Wild Duck (all species), and Woodcock shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year.

Certain Birds deprived of protection.

IV. The whole of the Administrative County of Dorset is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880,
