ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

EAST SUSSEX (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1913.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.-(1) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thorough-fare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place

outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) partly within and partly without the Sheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Sheduled District.

Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

2.--(1) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:

(i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions hereby imposed.

(3) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall-place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

4.—(1) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Disease of Animals Act, 1894.

(3) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the EAST SUSSEX (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1913.



SOUTH METROPOLITAN CEMETERY COMPANY.

(Establishment of Crematorium in the South Metropolitan Cemetery, in the Parish of Lambeth in the County of Surrey; Bye-Laws; Penalties for Contravention Thereof; Charges and Fees for Cremations; Repeal and Amendment of Certain Provisions of Act 6 and 7 William IV, cap. 129; Application of Moneys; Other Purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the South Metropolitan Cemetery Company (hereinafter called "the Company") for leave to bring in a Bill for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorize the Company to set apart a. site for, and build, provide, fit up, equip and maintain a crematorium for the cremation of human remains on the following lands (that is to say):---

A piece of land containing two thousand one hundred and four superficial feet six: inches or thereabouts in the parish of Lambeth and county of Surrey, belonging or reputed to belong to the Company, and situate: immediately on and adjoining the south-west side of the Nonconformist Chapel, and one hundred and sixty-five feet or thereabouts measured in a northerly direction from the south-east corner of the Episcopal Chapel in the said Cemetery,

and in connection therewith to make byelaws regulating the conditions of cremations, to exact penalties for the contravention of such bye-laws, to demand and recover charges or fees in respect of such cremations, and to prescribe the fees to be paid to Incumbents in the case of the permanent interment within the South Metropolitan Cemetery of the ashes of persons after cremation.

2. To empower the Company to apply to the purposes of the Bill any funds or moneys which they now or may hereafter have in their hands, or any moneys which they are authorized to raise by shares or by mortgage.

3. To amend section 52 of the Act 6 and 7 William IV, chapter 129, intituled "An Act for establishing a Cemetery for the Interment of the Dead southward of the Metropolis, to be called 'The South Metropolitan Cemetery '" (which Act is hereinafter called "the Act of 1836), and enable the Company to raise money by mortgage, freed from the restriction imposed by that section.

4. To repeal, alter or amend sections 72, 73 and 77 of the Act of 1836, and make provision as to the qualification, appointment and retirement of auditors of the Company.

5. To vary or extinguish all existing rights or privileges connected with the lands proposed to be acquired or interfered with under the powers of the intended Act or which would in any manner impede or interfere with the objects or purposes of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

7. To enable the Council to purchase or acquire so much only of any property as may be required for the purposes of the intended Act, and to exempt the Council from the liability imposed by section 92 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and from the provisions of the said Act with respect to the sale of superfluous lands, and to the making good

of deficiencies in assessments, rates and charges and otherwise.

8. To make provision as to the correction of errors in deposited plans, the payment of costs in certain cases of disputed compensation by persons claiming compensation from the Council, and as to determining the purchase money and compensation payable in respect of lands and property required for the purposes of the intended Act, and for limiting the amount thereof and for setting off the value of benefits arising from by or under the intended Act in estimating such compensation and by limiting claims therefor in cases of recent improvements, alterations and buildings, and recently created interests in such lands or property.

To prohibit the use of the new roads and other works for the purpose of tramway, light railway, trolley vehicle, motor or other omnibus services, and to provide that no application shall be made for powers to work or run any such service or to construct any tramway or light railway on any part of the intended new roads and other works except in each case with the consent of the Council, and to authorize the Council and any authority, company, body or person desiring to work or run any such service or to make application for any such powers as aforesaid to enter into and carry into effect agreements and arrangements with reference to any of the matters aforesaid,

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and to empower any tribunal in granting such application or the Council in granting any such consent to prescribe terms and conditions as to payments to be made in respect of any such service to the Council or towards the maintenance and upkeep of such roads or works or any part thereof or otherwise as such tribunal or the Council may determine or as may be provided for by or under the intended Act.

14. To authorize the Council to use temporarily or permanently any sewer, drain, stream or watercourse for the purpose of receiving, carrying away or removing any water pumped or found by them in connection with or during the construction of the new roads and other works and for the purpose of draining or carrying away surface water from the said roads and other works after completion thereof or any other purpose in connection with such roads or works or any of them, and to empower the Council for those and other purposes to lay down, take up, alter, maintain and remove mains, pipes, conduits and other works within the parishes aforesaid, and to open and make temporary or permanent con-nections with or means of access to any such sewer, drain, stream or watercourse.

15. To provide that all or any of the intended works or any part or parts thereof respectively as the intended Act may prescribe shall, when completed and opened for traffic, be and become main or county roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1888, under the control and management of the Council or (if thought fit) to provide that the same or any part or parts thereof respectively shall vest in and be maintained by the local or road authorities of the several parishes or districts in which they shall be respectively situate, in the same manner and by the same means as other public roads within those parishes and districts are maintained by them, or otherwise as may be prescribed or provided by the intended Act, and to authorize the Council to issue certificates of completion of the intended works and to make provision as to the validity of any such certificate and the acceptance of the same as evidence of the contents thereof.

18. To make provision with reference to the . lighting of the new road and other works, and as to the authorities by whom the same shall be lighted, and to empower, and, if thought fit, to require the Brentford and Heston and Isleworth Urban District Councils to construct, maintain, repair or improve or to contribute to the cost of the construction, maintenance, repair and improvement thereof, or any part or parts of the same respectively, or to any of such purposes in such proportions or to such amounts as may have been or may be agreed upon, or as may be prescribed or provided for by the intended Act, and to empower the Council and the said local authorities or either of them to make and carry out agreements with reference to such matters, and to provide for the maintenance by the local authority or otherwise of any culvert, sewer, drain or other work laid down, constructed and whether in substitution for existing works or not, under the powers of the intended Act.

19. To make provision as to the payment of any costs, liabilities or expenses incurred or undertaken, or any payments made or required to be made by the said Urban District Councils respectively, under or in pursuance of the intended Act, and as to the rates, revenues and funds upon which such costs, liabilities, expenses or payments shall be charged, and to enable the said Urban District Councils respectively to levy further and increase existing rates, rents and charges, and to borrow or raise or re-borrow money by the issue of stock or otherwise to such amount as may be necessary or provided by the intended Act, and to apply their rates, revenues and funds for any of the objects and purposes aforesaid or of the intended Act, and to provide that all powers to borrow or raise moneys for such purposes conferred by the intended Act upon the said Councils shall be distinct from or additional to their borrowing powers under the Public . Health Act, 1875, or otherwise.

20. To enable the Council to borrow money by the issue of stock or otherwise for all or any of the purposes of the intended Act (including the costs and expenses of and incidental to its promotion), on the security of the county fund and county rate, or all or any of the rates, funds, revenues or property belonging to them or under their control, and to levy further rates and alter and increase existing rates, and to apply all or any such funds, rates and revenues to all or any of the said purposes, or to provide that all or any part of the costs and expenses to be incurred by the Council in or relating to the promotion of or under the powers of the intended Act shall be defrayed wholly or partially, and in such proportions as the Council may determine, out of the county fund or as expenses for general or special county purposes, to provide that all powers to borrow moneys for the aforesaid purposes shall be distinct from or in addition to the borrowing powers of the Council under the Local Government Act, 1888, or any other Act relating to borrowing by the Council, and to make provision for the application of moneys received by the Council under or in pursuance of the intended Act.

21. To make such variation and modification of any of the provisions and in particular of section 69 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and any Act amending the same so far as relates to their application to the Council as may be provided by the intended Act and to provide in so far as relates to the Council for the repeal of the period of 30 years in subsection 5 of that section, or for the substitution therefor of the period of 60 years or such other period as the intended Act may prescribe and to authorize and empower the Council to repay to the Local Government Board or any other Authority prescribed by the intended Act notwithstanding the provisions of that section to consent to the repayment by the Council of any moneys borrowed or re-borrowed by them within such periods or at such times or in such manner as may be determined by the board or as may be authorized or provided for by or under the intended Act.
