1.—(1) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place

outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

#### *Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.*

2.—(1) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

(i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.



(2) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions hereby imposed.

(3) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall-place, London, S.W.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

4.—(1) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Disease of Animals Act, 1894.

(3) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Short Title.*

5. This Order may be cited as the EAST SUSSEX (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1913.

WHEREAS a church has lately been built within the limits of the parish of Westbury on Trym, in the county of Gloucester and in the diocese of Bristol, by and at the expense of certain well disposed persons, who have, with the approbation of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and of the said George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol, secured to the said new church an Endowment Fund and a Repair Fund in accordance with the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament called "The Church Building Acts" or of some of them, and particularly of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-seven.

1. To authorize the Company to set apart a site for, and build, provide, fit up, equip and maintain a crematorium for the cremation of human remains on the following lands (that is to say):—

A piece of land containing two thousand one hundred and four superficial feet six inches or thereabouts in the parish of Lambeth and county of Surrey, belonging or reputed to belong to the Company, and situate

immediately on and adjoining the south-west side of the Nonconformist Chapel, and one hundred and sixty-five feet or thereabouts measured in a northerly direction from the south-east corner of the Episcopal Chapel in the said Cemetery,

To confer upon the Company all rights, powers, authorities and privileges which are or may become necessary for carrying into effect the objects and purposes of the Bill, and to vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might in any manner impede or interfere with any such objects or purposes, and to confer other exemptions, rights and privileges.

9. To alter, amend, repeal or vary all or some of the provisions of the Act of 1836 and any other Act relating to or affecting the Company.

To consolidate or convert or provide for the consolidation or conversion of all or any of the shares in the existing capital of the Company into one or more class or classes of shares or stock of such nominal amount as the Bill may define, and if and so far as may be necessary to provide for the redemption or extinction of any existing shares of the Company, to fix and define or provide for the fixing and defining of the rates of dividend on such consolidated or converted shares or stock or any class thereof, to make all necessary provision for giving effect to such consolidation or conversion and for enabling the same to be carried out, and to increase, alter, define and regulate the capital of the Company and the rights of the holders thereof.

4. To enable the Company to apply their corporate funds and revenues for all or any of the purposes of the Bill and to empower the Company to raise additional capital either by increase of any class or classes of consolidated or converted shares or stock or by the creation of new shares or stock either ordinary or preferential, or by borrowing on mortgage or by the creation and issue of debenture stock or by any one or more of those methods, and to attach to any such new shares or stock, mortgages or debenture stock such preference or priority of principal, interest or dividends or other advantages or rights as the Bill may define, and to make special provision with re-

gard to the issue of such capital and the rights of shareholders and consumers of gas and employees of the Company on such issue, and to define, alter, and increase the borrowing powers of the Company.

5. To empower the Company to form and create a special purposes fund out of the revenue of the Company and to provide for the application of such fund and for the investment of the moneys forming the same, and to make further provision with reference to the formation of a reserve fund by the Company and the application of such fund and the application of the excess profits of the Company, and to repeal or amend sections 33, 34 and 35 of the Act of 1895.

6. To authorize the Company or their directors to establish a fund or funds for the purposes of securing pensions, allowances, payments, gratuities and other benefits to and to the widows, families or dependents of the weekly servants or employees of the Company to make provision with respect to the terms and conditions upon and subject to which such servants and persons may become entitled to any such pensions, allowances, or other benefits, to enable the Company to apply their funds for the purposes of and in aid of any such funds, and to make agreements and arrangements with insurance companies and others for securing any such pensions, allowances, and other benefits, to provide for the investment of any moneys forming part of any such fund, and to apply to any such fund with or without modification or variation all or any of the provisions of the Friendly Societies Act, 1896, and to enable the directors of the Company to grant pensions and retiring allowances to officers and servants of the Company with or without the establishment of any such fund as aforesaid.

7. To enable the Company to make and recover rates, rents and charges (differential or otherwise) for the supply of gas and the supply or hire of meters and fittings and to prescribe the standard prices for gas in the different parts of the gas limits, to increase or otherwise alter the rates, rents and charges now levied or leviable by the Company and the existing standard price within the limits of the Act of 1895 or any part thereof, and to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from the payments of any rates, rents or charges.

8. To make new and further provision with reference to the dividends payable by the Company and the increase or decrease of such dividends upon the system known as the sliding scale, and to repeal, vary or amend the provisions of section 60 of the Act of 1895.

9. To make provision with reference to the charge to be made by the Company for gas supplied by means of prepayment meters, and for the hire of such meters and fittings to be used therewith, and for gas supplied to any person or premises having a separate supply of gas or electricity, and the terms and conditions upon which such supply is to be given by the Company, the construction, placing, specification and inspection of pipes and other apparatus and appliances, the use, repair, testing and inspection of anti-fluctuators in the case of gas engines, the exemption from liability to distress or to the landlords' remedy for rent, or to be taken in execution under process of any court or proceedings in bankruptcy of any meters, burners, tubes, pipes, stoves, ranges, engines, machinery, fittings and other materials let by the Company on hire, the service of notice on and by the Company by and on consumers of gas, and the authentication of such notices.

12. To confer further powers on the Company with reference to the entry on premises and the removal of pipes, meters, fittings and apparatus, the cutting off of supplies to consumers, and to impose on the occupiers of premises the payment of the expenses of re-connecting a discontinued supply.

13. To enable the Company to lay down, repair, take up, alter, relay and renew mains, pipes and culverts within the gas limits for the purpose of procuring, conducting or disposing of any oil or other materials used by them in or resulting from the manufacture of gas or any residual products thereof or for any purpose connected with their business, and to apply to such purposes the provisions or some of the provisions of the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847, with respect to the breaking up of streets for the purpose of laying pipes and for the protection of pipes when laid.

14. To empower the Council in connection with and for the purposes of the aforesaid works, or any of them, or of the intended Act to cross, stop up, break up, remove, divert, alter the lines and levels of, raise, sink, and otherwise interfere with, either temporarily or permanently, and to make junctions and communications with all roads, streets, courts, stairs, passages, highways, bridges, footpaths, buildings and other erections, boundary walls, cellars, railings, steps, windows, pavement lights, gratings, ways and rights of way, railways, tramways, rivers, canals, navigations, streams, gas, water, telegraphic, telephonic, electric lighting and other electrical and hydraulic mains, pipes, wires and other apparatus, sewers, drains, and watercourses, within or adjoining the aforesaid parishes and other places, or any of them, which it may be necessary to cross, stop up, break up, remove, divert, alter, or otherwise interfere with, or make junctions or communications with for the purposes of the intended works, or other purposes, of the intended Act; to provide temporary accommodation for traffic and to regulate traffic and to appropriate the site and soil of, and extinguish all rights of way over, any roads, streets, courts, stairs, passages, highways, bridges and footpaths so stopped up.

4. To enable the Council to construct and maintain on and over the new roads, and other works, such carriageways, footways, refuges, gas or electric lighting posts, or standards and other conveniences as they may think desirable.

5. To authorize the Council for the aforesaid and other the purposes (including recoupment and exchange) of the intended Act to acquire by compulsion or agreement lands, houses and buildings in the beforementioned parishes and elsewhere and any rights or easements (temporary or otherwise) on, in, over or under lands without being required to purchase any further or greater rights therein than such easements, and to exchange any such lands.

6. To vary or extinguish all existing rights or privileges connected with the lands proposed to be acquired or interfered with under the powers of the intended Act or which would in any manner impede or interfere with the objects or purposes of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

7. To enable the Council to purchase or acquire so much only of any property as may be required for the purposes of the intended Act, and to exempt the Council from the liability imposed by section 92 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and from the provisions of the said Act with respect to the sale of superfluous lands, and to the making good

of deficiencies in assessments, rates and charges and otherwise.

8. To make provision as to the correction of errors in deposited plans, the payment of costs in certain cases of disputed compensation by persons claiming compensation from the Council, and as to determining the purchase money and compensation payable in respect of lands and property required for the purposes of the intended Act, and for limiting the amount thereof and for setting off the value of benefits arising from by or under the intended Act in estimating such compensation and by limiting claims therefor in cases of recent improvements, alterations and buildings, and recently created interests in such lands or property.

To prohibit the use of the new roads and other works for the purpose of tramway, light railway, trolley vehicle, motor or other omnibus services, and to provide that no application shall be made for powers to work or run any such service or to construct any tramway or light railway on any part of the intended new roads and other works except in each case with the consent of the Council, and to authorize the Council and any authority, company, body or person desiring to work or run any such service or to make application for any such powers as aforesaid to enter into and carry into effect agreements and arrangements with reference to any of the matters aforesaid,



and to empower any tribunal in granting such application or the Council in granting any such consent to prescribe terms and conditions as to payments to be made in respect of any such service to the Council or towards the maintenance and upkeep of such roads or works or any part thereof or otherwise as such tribunal or the Council may determine or as may be provided for by or under the intended Act.

14. To authorize the Council to use temporarily or permanently any sewer, drain, stream or watercourse for the purpose of receiving, carrying away or removing any water pumped or found by them in connection with or during the construction of the new roads and other works and for the purpose of draining or carrying away surface water from the said roads and other works after completion thereof or any other purpose in connection with such roads or works or any of them, and to empower the Council for those and other purposes to lay down, take up, alter, maintain and remove mains, pipes, conduits and other works within the parishes aforesaid, and to open and make temporary or permanent connections with or means of access to any such sewer, drain, stream or watercourse.

To provide that all or any of the intended works or any part or parts thereof respectively as the intended Act may prescribe shall, when completed and opened for traffic, be and become main or county roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1888, under the control and management of the Council or (if thought fit) to provide that the same or any part or parts thereof respectively shall vest in and be maintained by the local or road authorities of the several parishes or districts in which they shall be respectively situate, in the same manner and by the same means as other public roads within those parishes and districts are maintained by them, or otherwise as may be prescribed or provided by the intended Act, and to authorize the Council to issue certificates of completion of the intended works and to make provision as to the validity of any such certificate and the acceptance of the same as evidence of the contents thereof.

18. To make provision with reference to the lighting of the new road and other works, and as to the authorities by whom the same shall be lighted, and to empower, and, if thought fit, to require the Brentford and Heston and Isleworth Urban District Councils to construct, maintain, repair or improve or to contribute to the cost of the construction, maintenance, repair and improvement thereof, or any part or parts of the same respectively, or to any of such purposes in such proportions or to such amounts as may have been or may be agreed upon, or as may be prescribed or provided for by the intended Act, and to empower the Council and the said local authorities or either of them to make and carry out agreements with reference to such matters, and to provide for the maintenance by the local authority or otherwise of any culvert, sewer, drain or other work laid down, constructed and whether in substitution for existing works or not, under the powers of the intended Act.

19. To make provision as to the payment of any costs, liabilities or expenses incurred or undertaken, or any payments made or required to be made by the said Urban District Councils respectively, under or in pursuance of the intended Act, and as to the rates, revenues and funds upon which such costs, liabilities, expenses or payments shall be charged, and to enable the said Urban District Councils respectively to levy further and increase existing rates, rents and charges, and to borrow or raise or re-borrow money by the issue of stock or otherwise to such amount as may be necessary or provided by the intended Act, and to apply their rates, revenues and funds for any of the objects and purposes aforesaid or of the intended Act, and to provide that all powers to borrow or raise moneys for such purposes conferred by the intended Act upon the said Councils shall be distinct from or additional to their borrowing powers under the Public Health Act, 1875, or otherwise.

20. To enable the Council to borrow money by the issue of stock or otherwise for all or any of the purposes of the intended Act (including the costs and expenses of and incidental to its promotion), on the security of the county fund and county rate, or all or any of the rates, funds, revenues or property belonging to them or under their control, and to levy further rates and alter and increase existing rates, and to apply all or any such funds, rates and revenues to all or any of the said purposes, or to provide that all or any part of the costs and expenses to be incurred by the Council in or relating to the promotion of or under the powers of the intended Act shall be defrayed wholly or partially, and in such proportions as the Council may determine, out of the county fund or as expenses for general or special county purposes, to provide that all powers to borrow moneys for the aforesaid purposes shall be distinct from or in addition to the borrowing powers of the Council under the Local Government Act, 1888, or any other Act relating to borrowing by the Council, and to make provision for the application of moneys received by the Council under or in pursuance of the intended Act.

21. To make such variation and modification of any of the provisions and in particular of section 69 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and any Act amending the same so far as relates to their application to the Council
