The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries,

in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts,
1894 to 1911, and of every other power
enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it
is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The premises mentioned in the Schedule
hereto are hereby declared to be a place in-
fected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Description and Limits of Infected Place.

So much of the premises known as Street
Farm, in the parish of Westham, in the ad-
ministrative county of East Sussex, as lies
within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at Ketchem Corner, thence

proceeding in a south-easterly direction along
Gallows Lane, thence in a south-easterly,
easterly, and north-easterly, direction along the
road to Pevensey to the junction of that road
with the lane from Westham to Mill Hill via
the Smithy, and thence along that lane to the
point of commencement.

Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the
Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order
of 1908.

2. This Order shall come into operation on
the nineteenth day of November, nineteen
hundred and thirteen.
