said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council; and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with

cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only."

And whereas the Right Honourable and
Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the pro-

visions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the nineteenth day of April, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words following:—

"We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Bertram, Lord Bishop of Norwich, as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the vicarage or perpetual curacy of West Bilney, and the vicarage or perpetual curacy of Pentney, both in the county of Norfolk, having represented unto Us that the said benefices, being contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population does not exceed fifteen hundred persons, might, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, We inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to Us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that William Herring, of Narborough House, in the said county of Norfolk, retired Lieutenant-Colonel in His Majesty's Army, being the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the vicarage or perpetual curacy of West Bilney, and also to the vicarage or perpetual curacy of Pentney, if the same or either of them were now vacant, has consented to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council We caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to Us the said Archbishop, and no such cause has been shown.

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Norwich, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the said patron, and the copies of the representation and notices before mentioned, are hereunto annexed.

"That the net annual value of the benefice of Wychling is one hundred and seventy-nine pounds seventeen shillings and ten pence or thereabouts, and the net annual value of the benefice of Dodington is two hundred and thirty-nine pounds fifteen shillings and six

pence or thereabouts.

"That the patronage of both the said benefices of Wychling and Dodington belongs to the Right Reverend William Walsh, D.D., Lord Bishop of Dover, Archdeacon of Canter-

bury, by virtue of his archdeaconry, and he consents as such patron to the union of the

said two benefices.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council We caused a statement in writing of the facts to be affixed to the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing, under his, her, or their hand or hands, to Us the said Archbishop against such union, and no such cause has been shown.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and four-teenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint George, Waterlooville, in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council, bearing date the thirteenth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint George, Waterlooville, situate in the extra parochial place or liberty called Waterloo, in the said county and diocese, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint George, Waterlooville.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint George, Waterlooville, has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint George, Waterlooville, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council, ratifying this Scheme or Representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint George, Waterlooville, shall be altered so that all that portion of the parish of Farlington, in the said county of Southampton and in the said diocese of Winchester, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such parish, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint George, Waterlooville.

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"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the parish of Farlington, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester, and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint George, Waterlooville, in the same county and diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said parish of Farlington which is bounded upon the north by the said new parish of Saint George, Waterlooville, upon the west by the parish of Southwick, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said parish of Southwick from the said parish of Farlington crosses the middle of the footpath leading from the house and premises known as Plant Farm into the road which runs from Purbrook to Waterlooville, at a point opposite to the house and premises known as Wheatlane End, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the said road, leading from Purbrook to Waterlooville, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 69 upon the Ordnance Map of the civil parish of Farlington, published in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, upon the scale of twenty-five inches to a mile, and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Scheme or Representation from the close numbered 70 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southwestward to and then first south-westward, and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 69, and the closes numbered 71, 86, 81 and 78 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 70, and the closes numbered 62, 72, 85 and 74 upon the same maps for a distance of forty chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 78 from the said close numbered 74 meets the south-western side of Stakes Hill Road, and extending thence eastward diagonally across Stakes Hill Road for a distance of fifteen yards or thereabouts to the south-western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 77 upon the said maps from the close numbered 76 upon the same maps, and extending thence north-eastward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 77 and the closes numbered 55, 12, 11 and 8 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 76, and the closes numbered 57, 58, 10 and 9 upon the same maps for a distance of twenty-four chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Farlington from the said new parish of Saint George, Waterlooville."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints, Woodlands, situate within the parish of Adwick le Street, in the county of York and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Adwick le Street, the parish of Brodsworth, and the parish of Doncaster, both in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Adwick le Street, the said parish of Brodsworth, and the said parish of Doncaster, should be formed

into a consolidated chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of All Saints, Woodlands, situate as aforesaid.

'Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, as diocesan and also as the patron in right of his see as well of the vicarage of the said parish of Brodsworth, as of the vicarage of the said parish of Don-caster, and with the consent of John Skipwith Herbert Fullerton, of Thrybergh Park, Rotherham, in the said county of York, Esquire, one of Your Majesty's Justices of the Peace, as the patron of the rectory of the said parish of Adwick le Street (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Adwick le Street, of the said parish of Brodsworth, and of the said parish of Doncaster, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of All Saints, Woodlands, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Woodlands.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall

seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Woodlands, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the parish of Adwick le Street, of the parish of Brodsworth, and of the parish of Doncaster, all in the county of York and in the diocese of York, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Adwick le Street from the said parish of Brodsworth at the junction of the Wakefield Road with the road called Roman Ridge, and extending thence first north-westward and then south-westward along the said boundary (thereby following in part the middle of the Wakefield Road, and in part the middle of Red House Lane) for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary diverges westward from the middle of Red House Lane, and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of Red House Lane for a distance of seventy-eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Long Lands Lane and with the road leading to Pickburn, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the line of the Brodsworth Colliery Railway, and extending thence first eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of such line of railway for a distance of seventy-one chains or thereabouts

to the point where the said line of railway crosses the middle of Roman Ridge, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Roman Ridge (thereby following in two parts the boundary which divides the said parish of Brodsworth from a detached portion of the said parish of Doncaster) for a distance of seventy-two chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the northern side of Green Lane where the last-mentioned boundary meets the boundary which divides the parish of Arksey, in the said county and diocese, from the said detached portion of the parish of Doncaster, and extending thence first north-eastward and then in various directions along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following in one part the northern side of Green Lane and in another part the northern side of Long Edge Lane) for a distance of one mile and fifty-three chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of the stream called Langthwaite Dike where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said parish of Adwick le Street from the said detached portion of the parish of Doncaster, and extending thence first westward and then generally north-westward along the lastmentioned boundary (thereby following the course of the Langthwaite Dike) for a distance of one mile and ten chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the Great North Road at or near its junction with Doncaster Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of Doncaster Lane for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the fence forming the northern boundary of the Hanging Wood Quarry, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the northeastern boundary of the Woodlands Recreation Ground, and extending thence north-westward along the said wall or fence for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to its northern end, and extending thence northwestward in a straight line for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the southwestern boundary of the Adwick le Street Cemetery, and extending thence north-westward along such wall or fence for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern side of Windmill Balk Lane, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line (thereby crossing Windmill Balk Lane) for a distance of eighteen chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Tenter Balk Lane distant twelve chains precisely from its junction with the Great North Road, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line for a distance of fifty-four chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Red House Lane distant five chains precisely from its junction with the Great North Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Red House Lane for a distance of five chains precisely to its junction with the Great North Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the Great North Road for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Wakefield Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the Wakefield Road for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Roman Ridge upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Adwick le Street from the said parish of Brodsworth, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

WHEREAS by "The Foreign Marriage Act, 1892," His Majesty the King in Council is authorized to make Regulations for the purposes therein specified:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893," have been complied with in respect of the Regula-

tions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Foreign Marriage Act, 1892," or otherwise enabling Him in this behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1.—(1) Where a marriage according to the local law of a foreign country is valid by English law, then before the marriage is solemnized in that country under the Foreign Marriage Act the marriage officer must be satisfied either-
 - (a) That both the parties are British sub-

jects; or

(b) If only one of the parties is a British

the other is not a subject or

citizen of the country; or

(c) If one of the parties is a British subject and the other a subject or citizen of the country, that sufficient facilities do not exist for the solemnization of the marriage in the foreign country in accordance with the law of that country; or

- (d) If the man about to be married is a British subject and the woman a subject or citizen of the country, that no objection will be taken by the authorities of the country to the solemnization of the marriage under the Foreign Marriage Act.
- (2) If a marriage officer, by reason of anything in this article, refuses to solemnize or allow to be solemnized in his presence the marriage of any person requiring such marriage to be solemnized, that person shall have the same right of appeal to a Secretary of State as

is given by section 5 of the Foreign Marriage Act.

2. In the case of any marriage under the Foreign Marriage Act, if it appears to the marriage officer that the woman about to be married is a British subject, and that the man is a foreigner, he must be satisfied-

That the marriage will be recognized by the law of the country to which the

foreigner belongs; or

(b) That some other marriage ceremony, in addition to that under the Foreign Marriage Act, has taken place, or is about to take place, between the parties, and that such other ceremony is recognized by the law of the country to which the foreigner belongs; or

(c) That the leave of the Secretary of

State has been obtained.

3. For the purpose of the Foreign Marriage Act and these Regulations, the house in which a British Ambassador resides in the foreign country to the Government of which he is accredited, or which is occupied by him in that country for the purposes of his embassy, shall be deemed to be the official house of such Ambassador, and is in these Regulations referred to as the embassy house, and every place within the precincts or curtilage of any such house, and any church or chapel annexed to such house, or for the time being used with the consent of the Government to which the Ambassador is accredited as the chapel thereof, shall be deemed to form part of the embassy house.

For the purpose of marriages in an embassy house, the expression "office," when used with respect to the place where any act or thing shall or may be done, shall be construed to refer to such part of the embassy house as the Ambassador may from time to time appoint as being sufficiently accessible to the public.

- 4. The person before and by whom a marriage under the Foreign Marriage Act may be solemnized and registered in an embassy house in a foreign country shall either be the Ambassador or any member of the diplomatic service not below the rank of secretary, who is attached to the embassy, and who is from time to time appointed for the purpose in writing by the Ambassador; and for the purpose of marriages solemnized in such embassy house, such Ambassador or member of the diplomatic service shall, without any marriage warrant, be a marriage
- 5. Where a marriage can be solemnized at a British consulate in a foreign country, the leave of the Ambassador shall be obtained before the marriage is solemnized in the embassy house in that country.
- 6. For the purpose of marriages to be solemnized by or before a consular officer who is a marriage officer, every place within the curtilage or precincts of the house in which such officer is for the time being resident, or of the building which is for the time being used for the purpose of his office, shall be part of the official house of such marriage officer, and every place to which the public have ordinary access in such official house shall be deemed to be part of the office of such marriage officer.

7.—(1) The modifications contained in articles 8 to 17 of these Regulations of the requirements of the Foreign Marriage Act as to residence and notice shall have effect in cases where both parties have not dwelt within the district of the marriage officer by or before whom the intended marriage is to be solemnized.

(2) Where the provisions of these Regulations as to residence and notice have been complied with, or where the permission of the Secretary of State has been given, the marriage may be solemnized under the said Act in the

official house of a marriage officer.

8. Where one party only has resided for a period of not less than one week within the district of the marriage officer by or before whom the intended marriage is to be solemnized, notice shall be given by that party to such marriage officer. The notice shall state the particulars, and be in the form given in Form No. 1 of the Schedule to this Order.

- 9. If the non-resident party has dwelt in a place in the United Kingdom, notice shall be given by that party in like manner and on payment of the like fee as if that party were about to be married in that place, and in England or Ireland shall be given to the Superintendent Registrar or Registrar, and in Scotland shall be given by proclamation of banns; and the Superintendent Registrar or Registrar shall deal with the notice and give a certificate for marriage in like manner and on payment of the like fee as in the case of a marriage in his district: and the Session Clerk of the parish in which the banns were proclaimed in Scotland shall, in like manner and on payment of the like fee as in the case of a marriage in his district, give a certificate of proclamation of such banns.
- 10. If the non-resident party has dwelt in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the British Islands, notice shall be given by that party—
 - (a) In accordance with any law of that part of His Majesty's dominions or, in the case of India, of the Governor-General of India in Council, as the case may be, giving effect to these Regulations, or to any repealed or future Order in Council under the Foreign Marriage Act; or
 - (b) In like manner as if the party were about to be married in that place;

and a certificate by a marriage registrar or other like officer, of the giving of such notice, shall be obtained by such party, subject always to the law in force permitting of such notice being given and to the said officer being empowered to issue such certificate.

11. A law enacted by the Governor-General of India in Council or by the Parliament or Legislature of any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the British Islands other than British India shall be deemed to give effect to these Regulations or to any repealed or future Order in Council under the Foreign

Marriage Act if it makes provision (in whatever terms expressed) as follows:—

(1) That a notice of a marriage intended to be solemnized under the Foreign Marriage Act may be given by one of the parties intending such marriage who has had his or her usual place of abode for a period of not less than one week immediately preceding in some place in India or in such part of His Majesty's dominions (as the case may be) to such marriage registrar or other officer as may be designated by the law in this behalf;

(2) That such notice shall be published either by proclamation of banns or in such other manner as the law may provide; and

- (3) That such marriage registrar or other officer, unless he is aware of any impediment or objection which should obstruct the solemnization of the marriage, shall, on payment of such fee, if any, as the law may provide, give a certificate that the said notice has been so given and published as aforesaid.
- 12. If the non-resident party has dwelt in the district of a marriage officer in a foreign country, notice shall be given by that party and entered and posted up by the marriage officer in the manner and during the period provided by the Foreign Marriage Act, in like manner as if the marriage were to be solemnized by or before such marriage officer, and such marriage officer shall, on payment of the proper fee, give a certificate that the notice has been so given and posted up, and that he is unaware of any impediment which should obstruct the solemnization of the marriage.
- 13. If the place in a foreign country at which the non-resident party has dwelt is not within the district of a marriage officer, the notice to be given by that party may be given to any person authorized by the Secretary of State to receive such notices; and such person may receive, enter, and post up such notice and give a certificate that the notice has been so given and posted up and that he is unaware of any impediment, as if he were a marriage officer.
- 14. Where neither party has resided for a period of not less than one week within the district of the marriage officer by or before whom the intended marriage is to be solemnized and (a) the marriage cannot conveniently be solemnized under the Foreign Marriage Act at the place where either of the parties has had his or her usual place of abode, or (b) the permission of the Secretary of State has been obtained, notice shall be given by each of the parties in the place where he or she has had his or her usual place of abode for a period of not less than one week immediately preceding the giving of such notice in the manner provided by articles 9-13 of these Regulations and a certificate of the giving of such notice shall be obtained, and one of the parties shall give or transmit to the marriage officer by or before whom the marriage is to be solemnized a notice stating the particulars and in the form given in Form No. 1 of the Schedule to these Regulations, and the marriage officer, if satisfied that the marriage cannot conveniently be solemnized under the Foreign Marriage Act at the place where either of the parties has had his or her usual place of abode or that the permission of the Secretary of State has been obtained, may accept the notice as if both parties had been resident within his
- 15. Where the Secretary of State is satisfied that for some good cause a party to an intended marriage has not been able to comply with the requirements of these Regulations as to notice, and is satisfied that the intended marriage is not clandestine, and that adequate notice has been given, he may give permission for the intended marriage to be solemnized.
- 16. In cases falling under articles 8 to 15 of these Regulations the oath, affirmation or declaration under section 7 of the Foreign Marriage Act shall in addition to the matters specified in sub-sections (a) and (c) of that section state the place where each of the parties has had his or her usual place of abode, and

the notice, if any, which has been given in that

place, or to the marriage officer.

17. At or before the time when a nonresident party appears before the marriage officer and makes the oath under section 7 of the Foreign Marriage Act, he or she shall, unless the marriage is solemnized with the permission of the Secretary of State, give or transmit to the marriage officer the certificate that the notice prescribed by these Regulations has been given at the place where such party has had his or her usual place of abode.

18.—(1) A marriage solemnized in accordance with the local law of a foreign country shall not be registered under section 18 of the Foreign Marriage Act, except by a consular officer, who is a marriage officer, or is for the time being authorized by the Secretary of

State to register such marriages.

(2) A consular officer shall not be required to satisfy himself by personal attendance that a marriage has been duly solemnized in accordance with the local law unless the marriage is solemnized at the place where he is appointed to reside, or unless the proper fee has been previously paid to him.

(3) The consular officer shall forthwith, after he has by personal attendance satisfied himself as to the solemnization of the marriage, register the marriage in duplicate in books furnished to him for the purpose by the Registrar-General through a Secretary of State separate from any register books provided for marriages solemnized by him, and shall register the same in accordance with section 9 of the Foreign Marriage Act, save that if the person by whom the marriage has been solemnized declines to sign the same, the consular officer shall enter the name of that person, and the

fact that he declines to sign the same.
(4) The consular officer shall copies and the certificate and the book when filled in manner provided by section 10 of the

Foreign Marriage Act.

19.—(1) A Secretary of State, by a written authority under section 11 of the Foreign Marriage Act, may authorize a person to act in the place of a High Commissioner or Resident mentioned in that section, outside of His

Majesty's dominions.

- (2) If a Secretary of State gives such authority, or, in pursuance of the said section, authorizes any High Commissioner, Resident, other officer outside ${f His}$ Majesty's dominions, not being an Ambassador or a consular officer, to be a marriage officer, then, for the purpose of marriages solemnized and registered by or before any High Commissioner, Resident, or officer, or person so authorized, expressions in the Foreign Marriage Act shall be construed as follows:
 - (a) Expressions referring to the district of a marriage officer shall be construed to refer to the district for which such High Commissioner, Resident, officer, or person is authorized to act for the purpose of the

Foreign Marriage Act;
(b) The expression "official house of a marriage officer "shall be construed to refer to the building or part of a building or place specified in the document by which he

is authorized to act;

(c) The expression "office," when used with respect to the place at which any act or thing shall or may be done, shall be construed to refer to such portion of the building, part, or place so specified as is ordinarily accessible to the public.

- 20.—(1) Marriages, under the Foreign Marriage Act, on board one of His Majesty's vessels may be solemnized by or before a commanding officer of such rank and of such vessel as is for the time being authorized for that purpose by or in pursuance of any Admiralty instructions; and for the purpose of any such marriages a commanding officer so authorized shall, without any written warrant, be a marriage officer, and for the purpose of such marriages expressions in the Foreign Marriage Act shall be construed as follows:
 - (a) Expressions referring to a district of a marriage officer shall be construed to refer to such parts of the foreign station to which the commanding officer is attached as may be specified in that behalf by Admiralty

(b) The expression "official house of a marriage officer" shall be construed to refer

- to the vessel of the said commanding officer.
 (c) The expression "office," when used with respect to the place where any act or thing shall or may be done, shall be construed to refer to the part of the ship on which public notices are affixed.
- (2) The commanding officer, before he solemnizes a marriage, shall be satisfied that, at the port or place where the marriage is solemnized, sufficient facilities do not exist for the solemnization of the marriage on land, either in accordance with the local law of the country or in accordance with the Foreign Marriage Act.
- (3) The requirements of the Foreign Marriage Act as to residence and notice shall be modified as follows, namely, not less than three weeks' notice of the intended marriage must have been given in such public manner, or to such relatives or friends of the parties, as satisfies the commanding officer that as much notice of the intended marriage has been given as would be given if the marriage took place in England, and that the marriage is not clandestine.

21. The forms in the Schedule to this Order, or forms to the like effect, shall be used in all

cases to which they are applicable.

22. In these Regulations the expression Ambassador "includes Minister and chargé affaires; "embassy" includes legation; d'affaires; "consular officer" includes a consul-general, consul, vice-consul, pro-consul, consular-agent, and any person for the time being authorized to discharge the duties of consul-general, consul, vice-consul, or consular agent; "British Islands," "British India," and "India" have the same respective meanings as are given to these expressions by section 18 of the Interpretation Act, 1889.

Other expressions have the same meaning as

in the Foreign Marriage Act.

23. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of March, 1914, and from and after that day "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1892," "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1895," and "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1903," are repealed.

Provided that (a) any notice of an intended marriage, any caveat, any consent, or any permission of the Secretary of State, given under one of the above Orders shall be deemed to be good under these Regulations; (b) any proceedings taken with reference to a marriage, any register book kept, and any warrant or authority issued in pursuance of any of the above Orders shall have effect as if taken, kept, or issued under these Regulations.

24. This Order may be cited as "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1913."

On the 11th of January, 1913, a number of native "boys" were engaged in building up the ends of old roads in No. 2 North Main Haulage of the Hatting Spruit Colliery, Natal, in order to prevent the fumes of a gob fire from coming out into the haulage. A brattice cloth screen had been placed across the road to keep back the fumes at one point, while work was proceeding at other points.
The air was quite pure outside the screen, but
very poisonous on the inside. In the absence of Hepburn, who was in charge of the party, two of the "boys" went through the screen, contrary to orders, to get a shovel, and, as they returned, first one and then the other fell unconscious. Hepburn was informed, and with another "boy" went in search of the two. His first search of the workings had the two. His first search of the workings had no result, and he returned through the screen thinking that he had been misinformed. On being assured that there was no mistake, he went in a second time accompanied by a native, Mbuzimaceba, and an Indian named Munian, and found the two missing "boys." They dragged one for six or seven yards, when Hepburn collapsed, and Mbuzimaceba carried him on his shoulder almost as far as the screen, a distance of at least 100 yards. The attention of those outside the screen was attracted, and assistance arrived to carry Hepburn into safety. Mbuzimaceba became Munian in the meantime reunconscious. mained behind with the missing "boys."
Hepburn, though suffering from the effects of gas, managed to tell Easton what had happened. Easton shouted for Henderson, who was near at hand, and both penetrated into the danger area and succeeded in bringing out the missing "boys," one of whom unfortunately died from the effects of the gas.

They were able in their return down the working to discover a shorter way back to the screen, otherwise in all probability they would have lost their lives.

The native Mbuzimaceba and the Indian Munian showed great bravery. A letter of appreciation, together with a suitable present, has been sent to them by the Governor-General.

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Cambridge) Order, 1913.

Dated 27th November, 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of

the Administrative County of Cambridge, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Cambridge) Order, 1913."

BIRDS.

Addition to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Cambridge to the Great Bustard in the same manner as if that species of bird were included in the Schedule to the Act.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Cambridge:—

Common Bittern, Great Bustard, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Owl (except Little Owl).

Eggs.

All Eggs protected within a certain Area.

IV. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' Eggs is prohibited within that part of the Administrative County of Cambridge known as Wicken Sedge Fen for a period of three years from the date of this Order.

Repeal of former Order.

V. The Order of the 21st December, 1910, is hereby repealed.

EAST SUSSEX (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1913 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling

them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Modification of Orders.

1. The East Sussex (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1913 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") and the East Sussex (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1913 (No. 2), hereinafter referred to as Order (No. 2), are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Movement into and within Zone II; Contraction of Limits of Scheduled District.

2.—(1.) The provisions of Order (No. 2) applicable to the Zone described in the First Schedule thereto shall cease to apply to that Zone, and shall apply to the Zone II described in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply only to the Zone I and the Zone II described in the Schedule hereto, which together shall be the Scheduled District for the purposes of the above mentioned Orders instead of the Scheduled District therein referred to.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in Zone I.

3. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply without modification to the Zone I described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that the movement of animals for immediate slaughter into the county borough of Eastbourne and into that part of the borough of Bexhill which is comprised in the Liberty of the Sluice Cinque Port Liberty of Hastings from outside the new Scheduled District and from the Zone II hereby constituted, shall be permissible under and in accordance with Article 5 of the Order (No. 2) as if such Scheduled District and Zone were the Scheduled District and Zone referred to in that Article.

Movement of Animals through Zones by Railway.

4. For the purposes of this Order an animal shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Zone where it is moved through such Zone by railway from a place outside such Zone to another place outside such Zone without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked within such Zone except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animal within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

Provisions as to Farms on borders of Zones.

5. If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Zone, and where the farm extends to two Zones the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner Zone.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of November, nineteen hundred and thirteen.

Short Title, &c.

7. This Order may be cited as the East Sussex (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of

1913 (No. 3), and shall be read with the principal Order and Order (No. 2).
