COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice, that on the 25th November, 1913, he made an Order, under section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, entitled "The Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 25th November, 1913." The effect of the Order is to add the following explosives—viz., "Expedite," "Negro Powder No. 2," "New Fortex," "Permon Powder," "Pitsea Powder No. 2," "Sheppey Powder," and "Sunderite" to the permitted explosives named and defined in the First Schedule to the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 1st September, 1913, and to change the name of the permitted explosive "Stanford Powder" in that Schedule to "Ammonite No. 3."

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Cambridge) Order, 1913.

Dated 27th November, 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of

the Administrative County of Cambridge, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Cambridge) Order, 1913."

BIRDS.

Addition to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Cambridge to the Great Bustard in the same manner as if that species of bird were included in the Schedule to the Act.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Cambridge:—

Common Bittern, Great Bustard, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Owl (except Little Owl).

Eggs.

All Eggs protected within a certain Area.

IV. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' Eggs is prohibited within that part of the Administrative County of Cambridge known as Wicken Sedge Fen for a period of three years from the date of this Order.

Repeal of former Order.

V. The Order of the 21st December, 1910, is hereby repealed.
