DOCKYARD PORTS REGULATION ACT, 1865.

Notice is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, the drafts of two Orders in Council defining the limits of the Dockyard Ports of (1) Berehaven and (2) Queenstown, respectively, and making Regulations with respect to the said Dockyard Ports.

And notice is hereby further given that, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, copies of either of the proposed draft Orders in Council can be obtained by any public body, within forty days of the date of this notice, at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

Whereas by an Act passed in the Fourth Year of Our Reign intituled "An Act to make further and better provision for the care of Feeble-minded and other Mentally Defective Persons and to amend the Lunacy Acts" it is amongst other things enacted that there shall be constituted a Board of Control charged with the general superintendence of matters relating to the supervision, protection, and control of defectives, which Board shall consist of not more than fifteen Commissioners to be appointed by Us, of whom not more than twelve shall be paid Commissioners:

Now know ye, that We, pursuant to the powers vested in Us by the said recited Act, and on the recommendation of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, have appointed, and do by these Presents
