In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Victoria, cap. 110), we, the Bromboro Port Estate Limited, of 1, Water Street, Liverpool, hereby give you notice that we propose to construct at Bromborough, Cheshire, in accordance with plans and sections deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy, a reinforced-concrete or hardwood structure River Jetty upon the foreshore of the River Mersey, and the formation of beds for barges unloading alongside this Jetty.

The work will not exclude any tidal waters, and, being open in construction, will not impede the tides.

The object of the work is for estate development, to admit of railway connection to the river front.

The Estate Company is, generally, the owner of the land and river frontage extending from Job's Ferry to Messrs. Price's candle works.

It is proposed to commence this work immediately after the date of permission being granted.
