THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1888.

COUNTY BOROUGHS OF DEVONPORT AND PLYMOUTH AND URBAN DISTRICT OF EAST STONEHOUSE.

Whereas in pursuance of section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1888, a representation has been made to the Local Government Board by the Council of the County Borough of Plymouth that it is desirable that by a Provisional Order under the said Act the County Borough of Devonport should be united with the said County Borough of Plymouth, and that the boundary of the said County Borough of Plymouth should otherwise be altered so as to include therein the Urban District of East Stonehouse:

And whereas a Provisional Order issued under the said Act may be made for any of the purposes mentioned in sections 54 and 59 of the said Act, and may also amend any Local and Personal Act:

And whereas by section 297 of the Public Health Act, 1875, any Act confirming any

Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of that Act, may be repealed, altered or amended by Provisional Order made by the said Board, and confirmed by Parliament:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be made by the Local Government Board for carrying into effect the proposal contained in the said representation, or such other proposal as the said Board may deem expedient, and that such Order should provide for the amalgamation for Poor Law purposes of the Parishes of Devonport, East Stonehouse and Plymouth:

And whereas it is also proposed that such Order should, so far as seems necessary or proper for the purpose thereof, otherwise provide for the matters specified in section 54 or section 59 of the said Local Government Act, 1888, or some of them, and should, so far as appears to be necessary, amend the provisions of the Local Acts in force in the County Borough of Plymouth or in any area to be affected by such Order, and of the Acts confirming Provisional Orders made under the Sanitary Acts or the Public Health Act, 1875, and relating to the said County Borough or any area to be affected, or of some such Acts:

Norton, R.E., one of the Inspectors of the said Board, will attend at the Guildhall, Plymouth, on Wednesday, the twenty-eighth day of January, 1914, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said proposals and all other matters relating thereto:
