

1913 and the Hertfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1913 (Nos. 2 and 3) and the Hertfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914, shall cease to operate, and instead of those provisions the following provisions shall take effect.

*Prohibition of Movement out of certain Area.*

2. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals out of such Area where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

4. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Commencement.*

5. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

*Short Title, &c.*

6. This Order may be cited as the HERTFORDSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 2).

**BRISTOL (CUMBERLAND BASIN)  
IRISH ANIMALS LANDING PLACE  
ORDER OF 1914.**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Landing of Irish Animals at Bristol  
(Cumberland Basin).*

1. The part of the port of Bristol described in the Schedule hereto is hereby defined as a Landing Place for Irish animals.

*Special Provisions applicable to Landing Place.*

2. Such part of the Landing Place as is not coloured pink on the plan may be used for the landing of animals other than Irish animals if such part has since it was last used for the landing of Irish animals been cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Board.

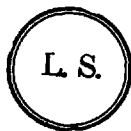
*Revocation.*
