In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Board of Trade and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for the Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain-making trade have given notice, as required by Section 4 of the above Act, that they have varied the minimum timefor Hand-hammered Chain-making fixed by them on 22nd August, 1910, as follows:

By increasing the minimum or lowest time-rate for making from iron supplied by the employer Hand-hammered Chain up to and including 11/32 inch:

Where the employer provides (in addition to the iron) the workshop where the work is carried on and the tools and the fuel-from 2½d. per hour to 2¾d. per hour (free and clear of all deductions).

Vhere the worker provides (in respect of iron provided by the employer) the workshop where the work is carried on and the tools and the fuel, or any one of these three heads of outlay—from 3 1/3d. per hour to 3 2/3d. per hour (free and clear of all deductions).

The latter rate is on the basis that any carriage to or from the premises of the employer is performed by the worker; or that

if performed by the employer the latter is entitled to receive 1d. per cwt. either way.

The Trade Board have also given similar notice that they have varied the General Minimum Piece-rates fixed by them on 22nd August, 1910; 23rd November, 1910; and 1st February, 1911, for making Hand-hammered Chain, as follows:-

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS CON-SOLIDATION AND AMENDMENT ACT, 1913.

Preservation Order in Relation to the Messuage House and Premises known as No. 75, Dean Street, Soho, in the City of Westminster.
