“Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, is vested in the persons commonly known as Simeon's Trustees (hereinafter called

Simeon's Trustees), that is to say, the Reverend Robert Baker Girdlestone, of Number 13, Lauriston Road, Wimbledon, in the county of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of Christ Church, Oxford; the Reverend Ernest Augustus Eardley Wilmot, of Saint Jude's Vicarage, South Kensington, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the cathedral church of Wells; the Reverend Arthur Evelyn Barnes-Lawrence, of Number 6, Church Terrace, Blackheath, in the county of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the cathedral church of Southwark, and the Reverend Edward Alexander Stuart, of the Precincts, Canterbury, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Canon of the cathedral church of Canterbury, the Right Reverend James Denton, Bishop of Sodor and Man, upon the trusts and with the powers and for the purposes of a certain Indenture dated the twenty-eighth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

“And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of the Holy Trinity, Oxford, is vested in the Reverend Henry Elliott Fox, of The Croft, Lytton Grove, Putney Hill, in the county of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders and Prebendary of Saint Paul's Cathedral in the city of London; the Very Reverend Henry Wace, Doctor in Divinity, Dean of Canterbury; William Frederick Alphonse Archibald, of the Royal Courts of Justice, London, a Master of the Supreme Court; John Francis William Deacon, of Number 20, Birchin Lane, in the said city of London, Banker; and the Reverend Henry Hensman Gibbon, of The Red House, Parks Road, in the city of Oxford, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Chaplain of Balliol College, Oxford (commonly known as the Oxford Churches Trustees), upon the trusts and with the powers and for the purposes of a certain Indenture dated the second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, made between the Reverend Edward Penrose Hathaway of the one part and the Reverend Henry Linton, the said Edward Penrose Hathaway, the Reverend William Hagger Barlow (afterward the Very Reverend Dean of Peterborough), the Reverend Thomas Pownall Boulton and the said Henry Elliott Fox, of the other part (enrolled in Chancery the seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two).

“And whereas the said Simeon's Trustees and the said Oxford Churches Trustees have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said two benefices of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, and the Holy Trinity, Oxford, may be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively, and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Simeon's Trustees and with the consent of the said Oxford Churches Trustees (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have to this Scheme respectively set their hands and seals), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners

for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, and the church thereof, shall be assigned and transferred from the said Simeon's Trustees and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Oxford Churches Trustees for ever upon the same trusts and for the same purposes as in and by the said enrolled Indenture of the second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two are expressed and declared of and concerning the said advowson of Holy Trinity, Oxford, and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of

and presentation to the said benefice of the Holy Trinity, Oxford and the church thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Oxford Churches Trustees and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Simeon's Trustees upon the same trusts and with the same powers and for the same purposes as in and by the said Indenture of the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, are expressed and declared of and concerning the advowsons held and to be held by the said Simeon's Trustees.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth

years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called "the said Benefice") of Bretby; in the county of Derby and in the diocese of Southwell.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bretby is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in certain Trustees upon trust in the first place for George Edward Stanhope Molyneux, Earl of Carnarvon (hereinafter called "the said Earl of Carnarvon"), and the said Earl of Carnarvon is therefore the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant.

"And whereas the said Earl of Carnarvon is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bretby should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Edwyn, now Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same Bishopric.

"And whereas the said Edwyn Bishop of Southwell is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese, which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Edwyn Bishop of Southwell, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said Benefice of Bretby, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Bretby.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Earl of Carnarvon, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the first and second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and six (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Edwyn Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bretby shall be transferred to the said Edwyn Bishop of Southwell and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Michael and Saint George, situate at Fulwell, as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur

Foley, Bishop of London (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Upper Teddington, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Michael and Saint George, situate at Fulwell, as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The district chapelry of Saint Michael and Saint George, Fulwell.'

"And with the like consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Michael and Saint George, situate at Fulwell, as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Michael and Saint George, Fulwell, being:—

"All that part of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Upper Teddington, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, which is bounded upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint James, Hampton Hill, upon the north-west by the parish of Hanworth, upon the north by the new parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Whitton, upon the north-east by the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Twickenham, upon the east by the parish of Teddington, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Teddington from the said new parish of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Upper Teddington, at the centre of the level crossing where the Kingston Line of the London and South Western Railway crosses Somerset Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Somerset Road for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with Elm Tree Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Elm Tree Road for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the road called

All that part of the churchyard attached to the church of St. Andrew in the Civil Parish of Barnston cum Langar and containing an area of 438 square yards or thereabouts, which is bounded as follows, that is to say, by a line commencing at a point in the fence or wall forming the northern boundary of the said churchyard distant four yards or thereabouts from the south-western corner of the garden forming part of the property known as Langar Hall, thence proceeding in a southerly direction to the nearest point in the northern boundary of the said church, thence proceeding in a southerly and westerly direction along that boundary to the western boundary of the said church, thence proceeding in a southerly direction along the said last-mentioned boundary, and thereafter continuing in the same direction to the northern boundary of the footpath leading from Langar Hall to the said church, thence proceeding in a westerly direction along that boundary to the western boundary of the said churchyard, thence proceeding in a northerly direction along and thereafter following the boundary of the said churchyard to the point first hereinbefore mentioned.

FABRICS (MISDESCRIPTION) ACT, 1913.

Regulations made by the Secretary of State for the Home Department, dated 20th January, 1914, under Section 1 of the Fabrics (Misdescription) Act, 1913.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Fabrics (Misdescription) Act, 1913, I hereby make the following regulations:—

1. A textile fabric shall be deemed to conform to the standard of non-inflammability if, when tested in accordance with the prescribed method of testing, it is not set alight, or, if set alight, burns without a flame or with a flame which does not spread but converges and dies out.

2. The prescribed method of testing shall be as follows:—

A sample of the fabric measuring not less than one square yard shall be taken, and, after it has been four times in succession thoroughly washed with soap and water, dried and ironed, shall be suspended vertically without folds or creases, and so that the lower edge shall not be a selvedge or a folded edge. The flame of a wax taper not less than $\frac{1}{8}$ inch, or more than $\frac{3}{16}$ inch in thickness shall then be brought in contact with the fabric at its lower edge and shall be kept in contact for not less than twelve or more than fifteen seconds.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Wales) (Deposit Contributors Benefits) Order, 1913, dated 31st December, 1913, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners under Sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55), and subsection (2) of Section 40 of the National Insurance Act, 1913 (3 & 4 Geo. 5, c. 37).

Whereas by Section 78 read with Section 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises with

respect to bringing into operation in Wales Part I. of the Act the Welsh Insurance Commissioners with the consent of the Treasury may by Order do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing that Part of the Act in operation in Wales, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas, by virtue of paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act, if the amount standing to the credit of a deposit contributor at the commencement of the year is insufficient to provide the sums payable in respect of him for the purposes of medical benefit and sanatorium benefit, and towards the expenses of administration, that contributor is not, unless the Insurance Committee consents, and except subject to such conditions as the Committee may impose, entitled to any benefits during that year:

And whereas by Section 3 of the National Insurance Act, 1913 (in this Order called "the amending Act"), it is enacted that Part I. of the Act shall apply to persons who at the commencement of the Act were of the age of sixty-five and upwards and under the age of seventy, provided that a person who is of the age of sixty-five or upwards at the date of entry into insurance shall not be entitled to medical benefit after he attains the age of seventy, unless the number of weekly contributions paid by or in respect of him exceeds twenty-six:

And whereas it will not in all cases be possible at the commencement of the year 1914, to ascertain whether the amount standing to the credit of a deposit contributor in the Deposit Contributors Fund will be sufficient to provide the sums aforesaid or whether the number of weekly contributions paid by or in respect of him exceeds twenty-six:

And whereas, by reason of the premises deposit contributors will, unless this Order is made, as respects the year 1914, be deprived of benefits to which they might otherwise have been entitled, and accordingly a difficulty has arisen within the meaning of the said Section 78:

Now, therefore, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Act and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1. For the purposes of paragraph (e) of Section 42 and Section 61 of the Act, the commencement of the year 1914 shall be deemed to be the 12th day of January.

2. Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act—

(1) (a) A deposit contributor who on the 13th day of October, 1913, had an amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act in respect of the period from the 12th day of January, 1914, to the 11th day of April, 1914, and

(b) a deposit contributor by or in respect of whom any contributions were paid during the period from the 14th day of July, 1913, to the 12th day of October, 1913;

shall be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during the period from the 12th day of January, 1914, to the 11th day of April, 1914, both inclusive.

(2) A deposit contributor who entered into insurance before the 12th day of January, 1914, and by or in respect of whom no contributions were paid during the period from the 14th day of July, 1913, to the 12th day of October, 1913, and who, on the 13th day of October, 1913, had not an amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act in respect of the period from the 12th day of January, 1914, to the 11th day of April, 1914, both inclusive, shall not in any event be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during that period, but shall nevertheless, if the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund on the 12th day of January, 1914, or on the 6th day of July, 1914, is sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable as aforesaid in respect of the period from the 12th day of April, 1914, to the 11th day of July, 1914, both inclusive, or from the 12th day of October, 1914, to the 31st day of December, 1914, both inclusive as the case may be, be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during that period.

3.—(1) This Order shall apply to a deposit contributor who attained the age of seventy before the 13th day of October, 1913, provided that such a deposit contributor shall not unless he has on the 12th day of January, 1914, an amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund sufficient to provide the proper proportion of the sums payable in respect of the period from the 12th day of January, 1914, to the 11th day of April, 1914, be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit for that period.

(2) A deposit contributor who attains the age of seventy after the 13th day of October, 1913, shall, notwithstanding anything in Section 3 of the amending Act, and subject to the provisions of this Order, be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit after he attains the age of seventy, if he entered into insurance more than twenty-six weeks before he attains that age.

4. There shall be deducted, at such times as the Welsh Insurance Commissioners may determine, from the amount standing to the credit of the deposit contributor in the Deposit Contributors Fund the proper proportion for the periods or period during which he is by virtue of the foregoing provisions of this Order entitled to benefit of the sums payable in respect of him for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the year 1914:

Provided that if it appears at any time that the amount so standing to the credit of a deposit contributor who becomes entitled to benefit as aforesaid was not sufficient to provide for that deduction, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners may, if they think fit, deduct from any contributions paid by or in respect of him in respect of the year 1914, such sum as together with any sum so standing to his credit as aforesaid, will be equal to the proper proportion of the sums so payable in respect of him.

5.—(1) The Welsh Insurance Commissioners may, if they think fit, continue the right to benefit of any deposit contributor to whom the provisions of Article 2 of this Order apply for a succeeding or any subsequent period up to

and including the 31st day of December, 1914, if there is standing to the credit of the deposit contributor in the Deposit Contributors Fund before the beginning of each such further period or periods, an amount equal to the proper proportion for such further period or periods of the sums payable in respect of him under paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the year 1914, and there shall be deducted at such times as the Welsh Insurance Commissioners may determine from the amount so standing to his credit a sum equal to the proper proportion for such period or periods of the sums so payable as aforesaid.

(2) Where a deposit contributor who is entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit before he attains the age of seventy entered into insurance within twenty-six weeks of his attaining that age, there shall be deducted from the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund the proper proportion of the sums payable in respect of him under paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the period or periods commencing on the 12th day of January, the 12th day of April, the 12th day of July, and the 12th day of October, 1914, as the case may be, during which he is entitled to receive medical and sanatorium benefit.

6. Where a deposit contributor is entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit, but, at the date when he becomes so entitled, arrangements have not been made for providing those benefits, there shall, as soon as may be after those arrangements have been made, be deducted from the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund, a sum equal to the proper proportion payable in respect of him, so, however, that the period or periods for which any such deduction is made, shall be a period or periods commencing on the 12th day of January, the 12th day of April, the 12th day of July, or the 12th day of October, whichever of the said dates is next before the date when the said arrangements were made.

7. During the period from the 13th day of October, 1913, to the 11th day of January, 1914, no payment on account of sickness benefit or maternity benefit shall, unless the Welsh Insurance Commissioners otherwise determine, be made to a deposit contributor of an amount greater than the excess (if any) of the balance standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund over the sums properly payable under paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act for the year 1914.

8. The provisions of the National Health Insurance (Deposit Contributors Medical and Sanatorium Benefit) (Wales) Order, 1913, shall continue to apply up to and including the 11th day of January, 1914.

9.—(1) Save as otherwise expressly provided, the expression "Deposit Contributor" means, for the purposes of Articles 2, 3, and 4 of this Order, a deposit contributor who, if the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund were not insufficient for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act, would be entitled to medical benefit and sanatorium benefit.

(2) In this Order, for the purpose of calculating the proper proportion of the sums payable for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the Act in respect of a deposit contributor to whom this Order applies, no account shall be taken of such part of those

sums as is payable out of moneys provided by Parliament.

10.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Deposit Contributors Benefits) Order, 1913.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulation under Sections 8 and 9.

COUNTY OF LONDON.

CHURCH STREET, KENSINGTON.

To the London County Council;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, in the circumstances there specified, by Regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway;

And whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act of 1903 it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the London County Council having applied to Us to make Regulations under section 6 of the Act of 1896 and section 8 of the Act of 1903 restricting the speed of motor omnibuses to eight miles per hour, and under sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act of 1903 restricting the speed of other motor cars to ten miles per hour, on certain roads or parts of roads at Kensington, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and an Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon;

And whereas by the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904, issued by Us in pursuance of the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, the expression "heavy motor car" in that Order is defined as a motor car exceeding two tons in weight unladen:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do hereby make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The expression "heavy motor car" in this Order shall have the same meaning as the like expression in the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904.

ARTICLE II.—A person shall not drive upon the highway known as Church Street, Kensington, a heavy motor car at a speed exceeding eight miles per hour, or any other motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour.

ARTICLE III.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.
