WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the fifteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirtynine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirtysecond years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the united benefice (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of West Bilney with Pentney, in the county of Norfolk and in the diocese of Norwich.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of West Bilney with Pentney is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in William Herring, of Narborough House, Narborough, in the county of Norfolk, a retired Lieutenant-Colonel of Your Majesty's Army.

"And whereas the said William Herring is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of West Bilney with Pentney now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishoprick.

"And whereas the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of West Bilney with Pentney which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parishes of West Bilney and Pentney:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Herring (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signedthis Scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of West Bilney with Pentney, now vested in him, the said William Herring, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

First Class to Percy Norwood under the following circumstances:—

On the afternoon of the 27th November, 1913, a blacksmith named Harry Rasell was driving downhill towards the London and South-Western Railway Station, Liss, when his pony bolted and dashed into the gates of a level-crossing, which were already closed owing to the approach of a train only 80 to 120 yards away. Rasell was pitched over the gates and lay stunned across the inside rail on which the train was approaching. The driver of the train put on his brakes and reversed the engine, but was unable to pull up until he had run over the level-crossing. Just as the train

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came up, Norwood jumped down from the platform and tried to pull Rasell clear by his legs; failing to do so, he went in front of the engine, grasped Rasell by the shoulder, and tried to roll him over. Norwood just succeeded in getting Rasell clear, but was struck on the head by the front of the engine, which came to a standstill a few yards further on.

If the driver had not reversed his engine, both Rasell and Norwood must have been killed. The injuries to Norwood's head were serious, and he is stated by the doctor who attended him to have had a miraculous escape from death. His intention to effect the rescue at all hazards is shown by his changing his hold on Rasell, and by his maintaining his hold after being struck by the engine.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Bedford) Order, 1914.

Dated 13th February, 1914.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Bedford, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Bedford) Order, 1914.

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Bedford to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

were included in the Schedule to the Act:—
Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Hobby,
Kestrel, Linnet, Merlin, Nuthatch, Shrike
or Butcher Bird, Wheatear, Wryneck
(Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Close Time extended.

III. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended, throughout the Administrative County of Bedford, so far as regards all Birds mentioned in the Schedule to that Act, as amended by the Act of 1881, or added thereto by Clause II of this Order, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in each year; and as regards other Wild Birds so as to be between the last day of February and the 13th day of August in each year.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that particular period of the year to which the protection afforded by the

Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause III of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Bedford:—

Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Kingfisher, Sand Martin, Owl (except Little Owl), Robin.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

V. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Bedford:—

Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Goldfinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goatsucker or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Owl (except Little Owl), Robin, Swift, Woodpecker, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Repeal of former Order.

VI. The Order of the 4th December, 1900, is hereby repealed.
