

On the 5th day of March, 1910, His Majesty was pleased by Order in Council to appoint the following to be a Committee of the Privy Council for the purposes of the Royal Warrant:—

Rules to be observed by Petitioners praying to be placed or retained on the Roll of Baronets were drawn up by the Privy Council and, between 16th of December, 1911, and the present date, formal hearings of four disputed cases have been held.

1. On the 19th July, 1912, the advice of the Committee of Council that the name of Robert Fraser Turing ought to be entered on the Roll in respect of the Baronetcy of Turing of Foveran was approved by The King.

2. On the 17th March, 1913, The King approved their Report that the name of Anthony Cope should be placed on the Roll in respect of the Baronetcy of Hanwell and Bramshill.

In the other two cases the advice of the Committee was that the names of the claimants should not be placed on the Roll.

Each Baronetcy named in the Roll bears, as far as can be ascertained, the name under which it was created; but, where the original name is no longer borne by the holder of the title, the present name is also inserted.

In the preparation of the Roll the Registrar has received much valuable assistance from Dr. Horace Round in connection with difficult genealogical points, and from Mr. F. W. Pixley, Registrar of the Standing Committee of the Baronetage, who made suggestions as to the Form and Contents of the Roll.
