

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Tynemouth) Order, 1914.

Dated 21st February, 1914.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Tynemouth, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Tynemouth) Order, 1914."

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the County Borough of Tynemouth for all birds (except the Black-headed Gull) specially protected by the schedule to the Act of 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881, so as to be

(a) Between the last day of February and the first day of September in each year for the Dotterel, Guillemot (Marrot, Murre, Scout or Willock), Gull (except the Black-headed Gull and the Black-backed Gull), Oyster Catcher, Puffin (Coulterneb, Sea Parrot), Razorbill, Tern (Sea Swallow); and

(b) Between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in each year for the American Quail (Colin), Auk, Avocet, Bee-eater, Bittern, Cornish Chough, Cuckoo, Curlew (Whaup), Dunlin (Ox-bird, Ploverspage, Purre, Sea Lark), Eider Duck, Fulmar, Gannet (Solau Goose), Godwit, Goldfinch, Grebe, Greenshank, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Lark, Loon (Diver), Mallard, Merganser, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Oriole, Owl, Petrel, Phalarope, Plover, Pochard (Dunbird), Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shearwater, Sheldrake, Shoveller, Skua or Bonxie, Smew, Snipe, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew (Thick-knee), Stonehatch (Ringed Plover), Teal, Tystey, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Wild Duck, Woodcock, Woodpecker.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the particular period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Tynemouth:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow, Dunnock), Blackbird, Bullfinch, Diver, Dotterel, Dunlin, Eider Duck, Goldfinch, Sparrow Hawk, Jackdaw, Kingfisher, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Larks, Brown Linnet, Green Linnet, Sand Martin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher, Redwing, Robin (or Redbreast), Starling, Thrushes, Blue Tit, Wrens.

The Gull protected on Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday.

IV. During the particular period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild

Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the Gull (all species) on Sundays and on Christmas Day and Good Friday is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Tynemouth.

EGGS.

Certain Eggs protected.

V. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Tynemouth:—

Cuckoo, Curlew, Dotterel (all species), Eider Duck, Sheld Duck, Peregrine Falcon, Guillemot, Gull (except Black-backed Gull and Black-headed Gull), Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kittiwake, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Lark, Mallard, Merlin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher, Golden Plover, Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), Raven, Razorbill, Redshank, Sandpiper, Snipe (all species), Teal, Tern or Sea Swallow (all species), Woodcock, Woodpecker, Wren (all species).

Repeal of former Order.

VI. The Order of the 22nd August, 1912, is hereby repealed.
