PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the fifth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the follow-

ing Scheme with respect to the three Archdeaconries of Hampstead, London, and Middlesex, in the Diocese of London, and to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries of Hampstead and Middlesex.

“Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said Archdeaconries of Hampstead, London and Middlesex and with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the Archdeaconries of Hampstead and Middlesex are desirable and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect.

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, firstly a new rural deanery shall be formed within the said Archdeaconry of Hampstead and shall be named ‘the Rural Deanery of Harrow,’ and shall comprise and consist of

the parishes or cures of Edgware; Great Stanmore; Harrow-on-the-Hill; Saint James, Alperton; Saint John the Baptist, Greenhill; All Saints, Harrow Weald; Christ Church, Roxeth; Holy Trinity, Wealdstone; Saint John, Wembley; Kingsbury; Little Stanmore; Northwood; Emmanuel, Northwood; Pinner; Saint Anselm, Hatch End; and Saint George, Headstone; all at present in the Rural Deanery of Willesden and in the Archdeaconry of Hampstead, and the parish or cure of Northolt, at present in the Rural Deanery of Ealing, and in the Archdeaconry of Middlesex, and secondly that as from the same date the Rural Deanery of Holborn, at present in the Archdeaconry of Hampstead, shall be transferred to the Archdeaconry of London, and that each of the parishes or cures or churches comprised in the said new Rural Deanery of Harrow shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of that Rural Deanery and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Hampstead, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other rural deanery or archdeaconry, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other rural dean or archdeacon and that the said Rural Deanery of Holborn and each of the parishes or cures or churches comprised therein shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of London and to none other.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas Notices of the said Scheme have in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act been transmitted to the archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, the Archdeacon of Hampstead, the Archdeacon of London, and the Archdeacon of Middlesex, and they have severally expressed their approval of the same.

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the fifth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and benefice (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Gateforth, in the county of York and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Gateforth is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the city of Leeds (hereinafter called 'the said Corporation of Leeds').

"And whereas the said Corporation of Leeds are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Gateforth now vested in them as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of York, and his successors in the same Archbishoprick.

"And whereas the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Gateforth which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Brayton.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Corporation of Leeds (in testimony whereof they have affixed their corporate or common seal to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal seal), we, the said Ecclesias-

tical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Gateforth now vested in them, the said Corporation of Leeds as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, and his successors in the same Archbishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, and his successors in the same Archbishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the district parish of Col-

lierley, partly out of the parish of Lanchester, and partly out of the new parish (sometime district) of Holmside, all in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said district parish of Collierley, the said parish of Lanchester, and the said new parish of Holmside are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said district parish of Collierley, of the said parish of Lanchester, and of the said new parish of Holmside, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the original limits of the said parish of Lanchester have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts or of some or one of them, and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum to the minister of the said proposed separate district so soon as a minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors.

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of one hundred and fifty pounds will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said district parish of Collierley, of the said parish of Lanchester, and of the said new parish of Holmside, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Aidan, Annfield Plain.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Aidan, Annfield Plain, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the district parish of Collierley, in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham, which is bounded upon the south-west and upon the south-east by the parish of Lanchester, upon the east by the new parish (sometime district) of Holmside, upon the north by the new parish of Beamish, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Beamish from the said district parish of Collierley at the centre of the level crossing where the Pontop and South Shields Branch line of the North Eastern Railway crosses the footpath leading from Shieldrow Lane past the house called or known as Kyo Laws to West Kyo, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to the point where it is joined by the line of railway leading from the South Pontop Colliery, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned line of railway for a distance of forty-eight chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to which the footpath leading into Tower Lane diverges southward from following the south-eastern side of such line of railway, and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of forty-four chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said district parish of Collierley from the said parish of Lanchester.

"II. Also all that portion of the said parish of Lanchester which is bounded upon the north-west by the above-described portion of the said district parish of Collierley, upon the north-east and upon the east by the said new parish of Holmside, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Holmside from the said parish of Lanchester at the point where the road leading from Oxhill and Annfield Plain to Lanchester is joined by Tower Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Tower Lane for a distance of thirty-three chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the private road leading through Tower Plantation, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Lanchester from the said district parish of Collierley.

"III. And also all that portion of the said new parish of Holmside which is bounded upon the east by the consolidated chapelry of Saint George, South Moor, in the said county and diocese, upon the north-west partly by the said new parish of Beamish and partly by the above-described portion of the said district parish of Collierley, upon the west partly by the said portion of such district parish and partly by the above-described portion of the said parish of Lanchester, upon the south-west by the said parish of Lanchester, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Lanchester from the said new parish of Holmside at the centre of the bridge or cul-

vert which carries Edge Lane across the stream known as Howden Burn, and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of Howden Burn for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the close numbered 322 upon the Ordnance Map of the Civil Parish of Lanchester published in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six upon the scale of twenty-five inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this scheme, and extending thence north-eastward along the said fence and along the fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the close numbered 294 upon the said maps for a distance in all of fourteen chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern end of the last-mentioned fence upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Holmside from the said consolidated chapelry of Saint George, South Moor."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly, hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the fifth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint David, Gyfeillon, situate in the parish of Llanwonno, in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Llandaff.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint David, Gyfeillon, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Llanwonno, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint David, Gyfeillon, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint David, Llanddewi Rhondda.'

"And with the like consent of the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint David, Gyfeillon, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint David, Llanddewi Rhondda, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Llanwonno, in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Llandaff, which is bounded upon the south-east partly by the new parish of Saint Catherine, Pontypridd, and partly by the parish of Llantrisant, both in the said county and diocese, upon the south by the said parish of Llantrisant, upon the west by the new parish of Cymmer and Porth, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Cymmer and Porth from the said parish of Llanwonno crosses the middle of the Rhondda River, and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the Rhondda River for a distance of thirty-eight chains or thereabouts to the point where it is joined by the stream

known as Nant Hafod, and extending thence northward along the middle of such stream for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Hafod Road across the said stream, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to the point where the road leading from Llanwonno to Pontypridd is joined by the road leading round the western side of the hill known as Twyn y Glôg, and past the eastern side of the house called Llysant, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said road leading from Llanwonno to Pontypridd for a distance of two miles or thereabouts to the point at Brynhyfryd Terrace where such road is crossed by the boundary which divides the said parish of Llanwonno from the said new parish of Saint Catherine, Pontypridd."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts, and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Llandaff.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Frideswide, Poplar, situate within the new parish (sometime district) of All Hallows, East India Docks, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, and of the new parish (sometime district) of

Saint Michael and All Angels, Bromley, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, and of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bromley, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Frideswide, Poplar, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as such Bishop, and also as the patron, in right of his See, of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bromley, and with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, as the patron, in right of his See, of the vicarage of the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, and of the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bromley, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Frideswide, Poplar, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Frideswide, Poplar.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

Modification of Orders.

1. The Durham and Northumberland (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914, and the Durham and Northumberland (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1914 (Nos. 3 and 4), all of which Orders are hereinafter referred to as "the existing Orders," are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Alteration of Zones I and II.

2. The existing Orders shall be read and have effect as if the Zone I and the Zone II, described in the Schedule hereto, were respectively substituted for the Zone I and the Zone II to which the existing Orders refer, and the Scheduled District for the purposes of those

Orders shall comprise only the Zone I and the Zone II, as described in the Schedule hereto.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Short Title, &c.

CARNARVONSHIRE AND DISTRICT
(FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE)
ORDER OF 1914 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Order.

1. The Carnarvonshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914 is modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Movement into the Zone for Immediate Slaughter.

2.—(1.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a licence from premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease to a railway station or landing-place situate within the Zone described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Zone"); and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing-place to any slaughterhouse situate within the Zone if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing-place is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease to any slaughterhouse in the Zone if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

Movement within the Zone.

3. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved for any purpose from premises in the Zone to any other premises in the Zone, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

Prohibition of Markets, &c., of Animals.

4. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Zone.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

5.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement by road into the Zone or is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises in the Zone other than a railway station or landing-place, an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is com-

menced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in the Scheduled District which is not in the Zone.

(3.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(5.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

General Provisions as to Movement.

6. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

7. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i.) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii.) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

8. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

9.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address; or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and

the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of March, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Short Title, &c.

13. This Order may be cited as the CARNARVONSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 2), and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.

Animals while being moved under this Licence must be accompanied by the Licence and must, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved. They must be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughter-house or bacon factory they must be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence must forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

This Licence is not available if it is granted by the owner of the animals to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animals, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the animals are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

LIVERPOOL AND DISTRICT (FOOT- AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 4).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

PART I.

Modification of Orders.

1. The Liverpool and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," and the Liverpool and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914 (No. 3), hereinafter referred to as "Order (No. 3)," are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Division of Scheduled District into Three Zones.

2.—(1.) The Scheduled District described in the principal Order shall for the purposes of

this Order be divided into the three Zones described in the Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to respectively as Zone I, Zone II, and Zone III), to which the provisions hereinafter set forth shall apply.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Zone, and where the farm extends to two Zones, the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner Zone.

PART II.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONE I.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in Zone I: Special Provision for Movement into certain Boroughs for Slaughter.

3. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply to Zone I; provided that nothing in this Article shall interfere with the operation of Article 5 of Order (No. 3).

Prohibition of Markets, &c., of Animals in Zone I.

4. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone I.

PART III.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONE II

Movement into and within Zone II.

5.—(1.) The provisions of Order (No. 3) applicable to the Zone described in the First Schedule thereto shall cease to apply to that

Zone, and shall apply to the Zone II described in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) For the purpose of movement into Zone II for immediate slaughter, Zone III shall be treated as if it were not in the Scheduled District.

PART IV.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONE III.

Free Movement into and within Zone III.

6. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall not apply to any movement of animals—

- (a) within Zone III; or
- (b) into Zone III from premises situate outside the Scheduled District.

Prohibition of Movement out of Zone III except in certain cases.

7. No animal shall be moved out of Zone III, except for the purpose of movement for slaughter into Zone II, under and in accordance with the provisions of Article 5 of this Order, or into any of the county boroughs of Birkenhead, Bootle, Liverpool, or Wallasey, under and in accordance with the provisions of Article 5 (2) of Order (No. 3).

Regulation of Markets, &c., in Zone III.

8.—(1.) No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone III, except in accordance with the following provisions:—

- (i) A market or sale may be held on any premises in Zone III if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.
- (ii) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(2.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Order shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 6 of Order (No. 3).

PART V.

GENERAL.

Movement of Animals through Zones.

9. For the purposes of this Order an animal shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Zone where it is moved through such Zone by railway or vessel from a place outside such Zone to another place outside such Zone without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked or landed within such Zone except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animal within a railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Short Title, &c.

11. This Order may be cited as the LIVERPOOL AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 4), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

Isle of Man
To Wit.

WHEREAS, by section 2 of the Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1865, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, by an order in writing, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Isle of cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of preventing the introduction of any infectious or contagious disease among cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals in this Isle.

And whereas the infectious disease commonly called "Foot and Mouth Disease" prevails amongst animals in certain places in England.

Now, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, do hereby order that, from and after this date, and until further orders, no animal shall be imported into this Island from Great Britain.

In this order the expression "animal" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, sheep, swine, or goat.

"The Importation of Animals (England and Scotland) Order of 1914" is hereby repealed.

This order may be cited as "The Importation of Animals (Great Britain) Order of 1914."
