PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the twelfth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Hope,

and the New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall, both in the county of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas, by the authority of au Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the eighth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and published in the London Gazette on the twentieth day of the same month, a certain part of the District Parish of Shelton, in the said county and diocese, was constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and the said District was named 'The District of Hope.'

"And whereas, by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the nineteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-third day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the Consecrated Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, situate within the limits of the District Parish of Christ Church, Tunstall, in the said county and diocese, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall.'

"And whereas the said District of Hope, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall, have become New

Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Hope and of the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall, should be altered in the

manner which is hereinafter mentioned.
"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Hope and of the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall, shall be altered so that (firstly) all that portion of the said District Parish of Shelton which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such District Parish, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Hope; and (secondly) all that portion of the said District Parish of Christ Church, Tunstall, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured green, shall be dissevered from such District Parish, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or any of them, or any

other Act of Parliament.

"The Schedules to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference:

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the District Parish of Shelton, in the county of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Hope, in the

same county and diocese, being:
"All that portion of the said District Parish of Shelton which is bounded upon the east and upon the north by the said New Parish of Hope, upon the west by the New Parish of Etruria, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side—that is to say, upon the south-by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Etruria from the said District Parish of Shelton (which follows the old course of Boothen Brook) crosses the middle of the Potteries Loop Line of the North Staffordshire Railway, and, extending thence eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts, to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across the line of railway belonging to the Shelton Iron, Steel, and Coal Company Limited, and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned line of railway for a distance of fourteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its terminus, and extending thence in a straight line due east for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Cloughstreet, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Clough-street for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Marsh-street, and extending thence northward along the middle of Marsh-street for a distance of fifteen yards or thereabouts to its junction with Brunswick-street upon the boundary which divides the said District Parish of Shelton from the said New Parish of Hope.

"THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the District Parish of Christ Church, Tunstall, in the said county and diocese, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall, in the same county and diocese, being:-

"All that portion of the said District Parish of Christ Church, Tunstall, which is bounded upon the south-west and upon the south-east by the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall, and upon the remaining sides—that is to say, upon the east, upon the north-east, and upon the north-by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall, from the said District Parish of Christ Church, Tunstall, at the junction of John-street with High-street, and extending thence northward along the middle of High-street for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road running along the southern side of Market-square, and extending thence first south-westward along the middle of such road and then north-westward along the middle of the road running along the western side of the said square for a distance in all of six chains and a half or thereabouts to the junction of the last-mentioned road with Paradise-street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Paradise-street for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with Cross-street, and extending thence first north-westward, then northward, and then again north-west-ward, along the middle of Cross-street (thereby crossing Wellington-street) for a distance of seven chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Well-street, and extending thence westward along the middle of Well-street for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sneyd-street upon the boundary which divides the said District Parish of Christ Church, Tunstall, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin,

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation, and such patrons and Incumbents have respecttively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said Scheme or Representa-

tion has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in China:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The China (Amendment) Order in Council, 1914," and shall be read as one with the China Order in Council, 1904, hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order," and this Order and the China Orders in Council, 1904 to 1913, may be cited together as the "China Orders in Council, 1904 to 1914."
- 2.—(1.) In addition to the documents to be deposited and filed in the office of a consulate, in accordance with article 46 of the China (Amendment) Order in Council, 1913, on the registration of a company in accordance with the provisions of that Order, there shall be deposited and filed a list of the directors of the company, showing in respect of each director his full name and nationality and his address.
- (2.) Every company registered under the China (Amendment) Order in Council, 1913, shall register in the month of January in every year a list of the directors of the company, showing in respect of each director his full name and nationality and his address, and shall from time to time, as may be necessary, register any alterations in such list.
 - (3.) On every registration under subarticle (2) of this article there shall be payable a fee of 2s.
 - 3. Where any municipal regulations or byelaws have been established for any foreign concession in China, the Court may entertain a complaint against a British subject for a breach of such municipal regulations or byelaws, and may enforce compliance therewith,

Provided-

(1.) that the said municipal regulations or byelaws have been accepted by His Majesty's Government. Acceptance of the municipal regulations or byelaws of a foreign concession by His Majesty's Government shall be signified by a copy thereof being exhibited and kept exhibited in the public office of His Majesty's consulate at such treaty port.

(2.) that no punishment other in nature or greater in degree than that provided by the

Principal Order shall be imposed.

- (3.) that the Court is satisfied that effectual provision exists for the punishment in the Court of the foreign Powers whose municipal regulations or byelaws it is sought to enforce of breaches by the subjects or citizens of that Power of the municipal regulations or byelaws of British concessions in China.
- 4. In article 21 of the China (Amendment) Order in Council, 1913, the reference to article 13 should be read as a reference to article 19, and in article 29 the references to articles 21 and 22 should be read as references to articles 27 and 28, and in article 50 the reference to article 41 should be read as a reference to article 48.

And the Right Honourable Sir Edward Grey, Baronet, K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council, so far as it relates to burials in the said parish church of Carlton-by-Snaith, in the county of York, and also in the churchyard, should be varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Order in Council of the 23rd day of July, 1889, so far as it relates to burials in the parish church of Carlton-by-Snaith, in the county of York, and in the churchyard, be and the same is hereby varied, so that, notwithstanding anything in the said Order in Council, it shall be lawful, subject to the condition hereinafter set forth, to bury the body of the Right Honourable Isabella Anne, Dowager Lady Beaumont, at her decease, in a brick grave in the chancel of the said parish church of Carlton-by-Snaith, in the West Riding of Yorkshire, provided that, within a period of twenty-four hours after the deposit in the grave of the coffin containing the body, the coffin shall be wholly and permanently embedded in and covered with a layer or layers of good cement concrete not less in any part than six inches in thickness.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Order in Council of the 16th day of December, 1902 (so varied as aforesaid), so far as it relates to burials in the churchyard of the parish church of Saint George, Pontesbury, in the county of Salop, be and the same is hereby further varied so that, notwithstanding anything therein, the burial of the body of the late Edward Mainwaring Furley, Clerk in Holy Orders, may be allowed in the said churchyard, subject to the conditions that the

coffin shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and that the grave shall be bricked to the surface of the ground.

The KING has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the 1st instant, to appoint Frank Louis Dumbell Elliott, Esq., to be an Assistant Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis.

In consequence of the destruction by fire on the 11th March, 1914, of the "Wellesley" Industrial School Ship for Boys, North Shields, the boys under detention in the said School are temporarily housed at the Tynemouth Palace Theatre, and the Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that he has certified that the School which is being temporarily carried on in the said premises is fit to be an Industrial School for the reception of boys sent thereto in pursuance of the Children Act, 1908, or the Education Act, 1876.

The Certificate bears date the 31st March, 1914, and provides that the total number of boys in the said School at any one time, whether sent thereto in pursuance of the said Acts or otherwise, shall not exceed 300.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

- 1. The limits of age for this situation are 15 and 17. If an examination begins in one of the first four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of January in that year. If an examination begins in one of the second four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of May in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September of that year.

 - (a) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.
 - That they are natural-born naturalised British subjects.
- 3. At each examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

1. English Composition (including Writing and Spelling).

Candidates who fail to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general proficiency will not be regarded as qualified.

5. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by his parent or guardian, that he will, if successful, reside within a suitable distance from the Post Office, either with his parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.

6. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height, and no officer will be retained in the Service who does not attain the height of 5 feet 4 inches before reaching the age of 19.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (FOREIGN MEAT) AMENDING REGULATIONS, 1909.

We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Amending Regulations, 1909, HERE-BY GIVE NOTICE that, for the purposes of those Regulations, the Official Certificates of which the details are set forth in the representations or designs in the Schedule appended to and forming part of this Notice are, subject to the instructions given therein, hereby declared to be admissible, in the case of Sweden, from the date of the publication of this Notice, in the manner, to the extent, and subject to the rules and conditions prescribed in this Notice, as evidence that the pig from which any foreign meat is derived has been certified by a competent authority in the place of origin to be free from disease at the time of slaughter, and that the meat has been certified by the like authority to have been dressed or prepared, and packed with the needful observance of all requirements for preventing danger to public health from using the meat as an article of food:

AND FURTHER, with respect to the manner, to the extent, and to the rules and conditions in, to, and subject to which every Official Certificate is admissible as evidence for any such purpose as is hereinbefore described, We hereby prescribe as follows, that is to say:—

(i.) An Official Certificate, used in relation to foreign meat, or in relation to a box, case, receptacle or package containing foreign meat shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the meat is derived from a

pig.

- (ii.) An Official Certificate in the form of a label shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the label is securely affixed or attached to any foreign meat, or to any box, case, receptacle or package containing foreign meat; and where the label so affixed or attached has not, in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion, been used as an Official Certificate.
- (iii.) In this Notice, any word or expression to which a special meaning is assigned by the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Amending Regulations, 1909, has the same-meaning as in those Regulations.



ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST MARCH 1914.)

CARNARVONSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 5).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Withdrawal of Existing Orders.

 The provisions of the Carnaryonshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914, and the Carnarvonshire and District

(Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1914 (Nos. 2, 3, and 4) shall cease to operate, and instead of those provisions the following provisions shall take effect.

Prohibition of Movement out of Certain Area

2. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals out of such Area where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area.

Local Authority to Enforce Order,

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

4. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of April, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the CARNARVONSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 5).
