PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the twelfth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninetyfour, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninetyfour, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Hope, and the New Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall, both in the county of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas, by the authority of au Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the eighth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and published in the London Gazette on the twentieth day of the same month, a certain part of the District Parish of Shelton, in the said county and diocese, was constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and the said District was named 'The District of Hope.'

"And whereas, by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the nineteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-third day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the Consecrated Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, situate within the limits of the District Parish of Christ Church, Tunstall, in the said county and diocese, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall.'

"And whereas the said District of Hope, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary the Virgin, Tunstall, have become New
