ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)  
AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1914 (No. 4).

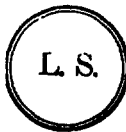
The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Amendment Order of 1914 (No. 3) shall be read and have effect as if Ballina, Coleraine, and Westport were included in the First

Schedule thereto (*Ports in Ireland from which Animals may be shipped*).

2. This Order may be cited as the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Amendment Order of 1914 (No. 4).

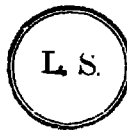
*Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.*

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and fourteen.
