COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that on the 7th April, 1914,

he made an order under section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, entitled "The Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 7th April, 1914," the effect of which is to add the following explosives, viz., "Abelite No. 1," "Arkite No. 2," "Duxite," "Super-Curtisite," "Super-Excellite No. 2," and "Super-Kolax No. 2," to the permitted explosives named and defined in the First Schedule to the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 1st September, 1913; and to substitute an amended definition of the explosive "Tutol No. 2" for the definition in that Schedule.

COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

In pursuance of Part I of the Second Schedule to the Coal Mines Act, 1911, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes to make general

regulations under sections 85 and 86 of the Act amending the provisions as to rescue appliances and rescue brigades contained in Part IV of the General Regulations of 10th July, 1913. Under the draft regulations the use of self-contained breathing apparatus will be made compulsory; but an *alternative* system for the establishment of rescue brigades will be admitted, by which, in place of the local brigades at the collieries now required, permanent brigades will be maintained at the central stations, and one or more men, according to the size of the colliery, will be trained at each mine to act with the central brigade when summoned to the mine.

Copies of the draft regulations can be obtained on application to the Home Office. Any objection with respect to the draft regulations by or on behalf of any person affected must be sent to the Secretary of State on or before the 16th May, 1914. Every such objection must be in writing, and must state (a) the specific grounds of objection; (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.
