Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869 (32 & 33 Vic., cap. 115). The London Cab and Stage Carriage Act, 1907 (7 Edward VII, cap. 55).

In pursuance of section 8 of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, I hereby prescribe as follows:—

Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph 15 of the Order made by the Right Honourable Herbert John Gladstone, and dated 30th December, 1907, I order as follows:—

(1.) Upon written application being made by a proprietor to the Commissioner, a licence to act as an assistant to a Conductor of a Metropolitan Stage Carriage may be granted provided the person in respect of whom the application is made be not less than sixteen years of age.

(2.) Any application made under this Order shall be subject to all the Acts and Orders in force relating to drivers and conductors of Metropolitan Public Carriages, and any licence granted under this Order shall be issued subject to all such Acts and Orders as before mentioned.

Provided always that no young person under this Order shall be authorized to act otherwise than as an assistant to a conductor, and shall not be employed unless the vehicle be in charge of an adult licensed conductor.

(3.) Any young person acting, and any person employing a young person except in accordance with the terms of the licence and of this Order, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Order, and shall be liable to a penalty as provided in paragraphs 31 and 44 of the Order of 30th December, 1907.

(4.) Licences so granted shall be in the form contained in the Schedule to this Order, and for every licence so issued there shall be paid the sum of five shillings.

(5.) This Order shall come into force on the first day of May, 1914, and shall, subject to any alteration made by this Order, be construed as one with the Order made by the Right Honourable Herbert John Gladstone, and dated 30th December, 1907.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Norfolk) Order, 1914.

Dated 20th April, 1914.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Norfolk, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Norfolk) Order, 1914."

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II.—(a) The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Norfolk, except the range of hills and foreshore known as Blakeney Point, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in each year, so far as regards all Birds mentioned in the Schedule to that Act, as amended by the Act of 1881, or added thereto by Clause III of this Order, except Woodcock, the close time for which shall be extended so as to be between the 1st day of February and the 13th day of August in each year, and Snipe, Teal and all species of Wild Duck, the close time for which will remain as fixed by the Act of 1880, namely, between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in each year.

(b) The close time for all Wild Birds throughout the Blakeney Point District above referred to shall be extended so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Norfolk to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Great Bustard, Crossbill, Sand Martin, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that particular period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Act of 1880, and by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of the Bittern, Little Bittern, Great Bustard, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Harrier (all species), Hobby, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Golden Oriole, Owl (all species), Red Poll (all species), Siskin, Black-winged Stilt, Tern or Sea Swallow (all species), and Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Norfolk.

All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Areas.

V. During that particular period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Act of 1880, and by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the areas described in Article VI, paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of this Order.

EGGS.

All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited during the period expiring on the last day of February, 1919, within the following areas:—

(a) Hickling Broad, Whitesley and Heigham Sounds, Blackfleet Broad, Horsey Mere, Mart-ham and Somerton Broads, and the rands, skirts, and walls thereof, and fens and reed grounds appertaining thereto respectively, and the islands therein, and the dykes communicating therewith, including the Hundred Stream or Thurne River and ancient bed, and the rands and walls thereof from Heigham Bridge to the sea at Winterton, and all the marshes and low-lying and uncultivated lands, fens, reed grounds, warrens, marram or sand hills and sea shore, to the line of high-water mark, in the several parishes of Waxham, Horsey, Potter Heigham, and Hickling, and such part of the parish of Catfield as lies to the east of the Midland and Great Northern Joint Railway.

(b) The warrens, marram or sand hills and sea shore, to the line of high-water mark, in the parish of Winterton.

(c) Such parts of the Rivers Yare and Wensum as are within the Administrative County of Norfolk, and the streams communicating therewith; the River Bure and the streams communicating therewith; and Rockland and Surlingham Broads and the rands, skirts, and walls of each such river and broad, and fens and reed grounds appertaining thereto respectively, and the islands therein, and the dykes communicating therewith.

(d) The series of Broads known as Ormesby, Rollesby, Hemsby, Filby, and Burgh Broads, and the rands, skirts, and walls thereof, and the dykes communicating therewith, and the fens, reed grounds, and low-lying lands, marshes, and pastures adjacent thereto, including Lady Broad or Hard Fen Water, in the parish of Filby, Brandyke Broad, in the parish of Burgh St. Margaret, and Muckfleet Dyke, and the marshes and low-lying lands and pastures near or adjacent thereto respectively.

(e) The whole of the foreshore of the County of Norfolk, including the shingle, sand hills, salt marshes, creeks, and other unenclosed lands extending from high-water mark to the first boundary of enclosed or cultivated land separating the foreshore from them.

The approximate position of the rivers, open broads, and foreshores referred to above is shown in blue on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the Home Office Seal, and dated the 20th April, 1914.

(f) The range of hills and foreshore known as Blakeney Point, which area is coloured red on a map, similarly sealed and dated, and deposited with the Clerk of the County Council.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Norfolk:—Bittern, Little Bittern, Great Bustard, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Norfolk Plover, Thick-Knee), Great Crested Grebe or Loon, Harrier (all species), Hobby, Kingfisher, Wood Lark, Sand Martin, Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher (Sea Pie), Ringed Plover (Ringed Dotterel, Stone Runner), Ruff or Reeve, Tern or Sea Swallow (all species), Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Wild Duck and Teal (all species), Woodcock.

Repeal of former Order.

VIII. The Order of the 30th July, 1909, is hereby repealed.

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) AMENDMENT
ORDER OF 1914 (No. 5).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Landing at certain Landing Places of Animals not intended for Slaughter.

1.—(1.) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from any port in Ireland which is mentioned in the First Schedule hereto may, subject to the provisions of this Article, and not otherwise, be landed at any Landing Place for Irish animals described in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2.) The landing of any animals under this Order must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the Landing Place.

(3.) Animals so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1913, except that the animals shall not be moved from the Landing Place until the expiration of ninety-six hours after the landing of the last animal of the cargo, and then only in accordance with the following provisions of this Article.

(4.) Any swine which is accompanied by a licence granted under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1906 may be

moved from the Landing Place with the permission of an Inspector of the Board. Such swine shall be subject to the provisions of that Order as to subsequent movement and as to detention and isolation after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence.

(5.) The removal of any other animal from the Landing Place must be authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Board.

(6.) Before the issue of a licence under the preceding paragraph (5) for movement from the Landing Place each animal to which the Licence relates shall be marked in such manner as may be required by an Officer of the Board.

(7.) Each animal shall be moved to a slaughterhouse or other place of detention specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and (except as hereinafter provided) shall be there detained and isolated, under the supervision of a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority, from other animals for a period of fourteen days after the date of its arrival, unless it is previously slaughtered in the place of detention.

(8.) The animal may, with the written authority of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of detention is situate, be allowed to come in contact in the place of detention with other animals. In case of such contact all the animals shall become liable to detention and isolation as if they had been moved to the place of detention under the same licence.

(9.) Animals moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route, and as far as practicable by railway, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being moved under this Article.

(10.) Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to authorise the movement of an animal in contravention of an Order of the Board or a Regulation of a Local Authority.

(11.) In the case of any animal slaughtered in the Landing Place, the head or feet or the hide shall not be removed from the carcass until after the carcass has been examined in the Landing Place by a Veterinary Inspector of the Board.

Provisions as to Licences.

2.—(1.) Where animals are moved with a licence under this Order, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an Inspector of the Local Authority, or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District, by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(2.) A movement licence granted under this Order shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue.

(3.) A copy of a licence under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the licence to the Clerk of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of detention is situate.

Conditional Permits.

3. An Inspector of the Board may impose conditions on the removal of anything from a Landing Place for which a permission granted by an Inspector is required, and if any person fails to comply with any such condition which is specified in the permission and which he is thereby required to observe he shall be deemed

guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Offences.

4.—(1.) If any animal shall be landed in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order or is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the animal, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, before the expiration of the period of detention, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark on any animal affixed under this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of April, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Short Title.

7. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1914 (No. 5).
