DRAFT ADDITIONAL RULES, APRIL, 1914.

SERVICE OF CITATION AND DECREE IN SUITS FOR RESTITUTION OF CONJUGAL RIGHTS.

221. In a suit for restitution of conjugal rights when it is stated in the Petition, either that the parties to the suit were domiciled in England at the time of the institution thereof; or that they had a matrimonial home in England at the date when their cohabitation ceased; or that they were both resident in England at the time of the institution of the suit, the Petition and Citation may be served either within or without His Majesty's Dominions.

222. When a suit for restitution of conjugal rights has been duly instituted, and a decree is made therein, such decree may be served either within or without His Majesty's Dominions.
