“And whereas Emily Sarah Warwick, Widow of the late William Deeping Warwick, of Balderton Hall, Newark-on-Trent, in the said county of Nottingham, William Arthur Warwick, of Balderton Hall aforesaid, Edmund Larken, of Newark-on-Trent aforesaid, Solicitor, and John Esam, of Winthorpe, near Newark-on-Trent aforesaid, Solicitor, are the trustees of the said will.

“And whereas the said Emily Sarah Warwick, William Arthur Warwick, Edmund Larken and John Esam are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of

and presentation to the said benefice of Shelton now vested in them as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Edwyn, now Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same bishoprick.

"And whereas the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese, which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Shelton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Shelton.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Emily Sarah Warwick, William Arthur Warwick, Edmund Larken and John Esam (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Shelton now vested in them, the said Emily Sarah Warwick, William Arthur Warwick, Edmund Larken and John Esam as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

"Whereas under and by virtue of the several indentures, particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written, the lands, tenements, and hereditaments situate in the parish of Hornsey aforesaid, and particularly described in the same indentures and Schedule, became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us.

some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

"Whereas the said parish of Burnham Norton is a parish in which both the profits and the spiritual charge are divided between two Incumbents, each being the rector of one of the two medieties into which the rectory of Burnham Norton is divided.

"And whereas the Right Rev. Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, in pursuance of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, has submitted to us a Plan, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, for consolidating the two medieties of the said rectory of Burnham Norton and for making certain other arrangements which are likely in the opinion of the said Bishop and in our opinion to promote the efficient discharge of pastoral duties in the said parish of Burnham Norton.

"And whereas the said Plan (as by the same appears) has the consents of the patrons of both medieties of the said rectory of Burnham Norton.

"And whereas the said Plan is in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"I, the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, under and by virtue of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, with the consents (testified as is hereinafter mentioned) of the Master, Fellows and Scholars of Christ's College, in the University of Cambridge, the patrons of one of the medieties of the rectory of Burnham Norton,

and also of the rectory of Burnham Westgate, both in the county of Norfolk and in the diocese of Norwich, and with the consent of the Right Honourable Richard Burdon Viscount Haldane, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of His Majesty the King as the patron of the other mediety of the said rectory of Burnham Norton, have framed the following Plan for consolidating the two medieties of the said rectory of Burnham Norton and for making such arrangements as I judge likely to promote the efficient discharge of pastoral duties in the said medieties; whereas the said benefice of Burnham Norton has from time immemorial been divided into and is now held in two medieties, and the Incumbents of such medieties have joint cure of souls in and over the said parish of Burnham Norton.

"And whereas the said parish of Burnham Norton contains only one consecrated church, being the parish church of the said parish of Burnham Norton, with a churchyard or burial ground adjoining or belonging thereto.

"And whereas one of the medieties of the said rectory of Burnham Norton is at present united to the said rectory of Burnham Westgate.

"And whereas the other mediety is not united to any other benefice.

"And whereas the endowments or income of the rectory of the said mediety of Burnham Norton, which is united to the said benefice of Burnham Westgate, consist of glebe lands containing fifteen acres three roods and thirty-six perches, and at present let at a rent of twenty-six pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence per annum, tithe rent charge commuted at the sum of one hundred and twenty-eight pounds ten shillings, and surplice fees, and the endowments or income of the rectory of the other mediety of Burnham Norton consist of glebe lands containing fifteen acres three roods and thirty-six perches and at present let at a rent of twenty pounds per annum, tithe rent charge commuted at the sum of one hundred and twenty-eight pounds ten shillings, and surplice fees.

"And whereas the concurrent jurisdiction of the two rectories of the two medieties has been found to be inconvenient and it is desirable that the two medieties should be consolidated with a view to there being but one Incumbent of the consolidated benefice having the exclusive cure of souls over the whole of the said parish of Burnham Norton; And whereas the Reverend Thomas Felton Falkner, clerk in holy orders, is the present rector or Incumbent of the said rectory of Burnham Westgate and of the rectory of the said mediety of Burnham Norton united thereto; and whereas the said rectory of the other mediety of Burnham Norton is now vacant; And whereas the said Thomas Felton Falkner is satisfied, and admits by his signing this Plan that the same will not prejudice the interests of the existing Incumbent; now I, the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, with the consent as well of the said Master, Fellows and Scholars of Christ's College, Cambridge (testified by their affixing their Common or Corporate Seal to this Plan), and of the said Richard Burdon Viscount Haldane as of the said Thomas Felton Falkner (testified by their respectively signing and sealing this Plan), do propose that as from the date upon which an Order of His Majesty in Council ratifying a Scheme of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners

for England approving this Plan shall have been published in the London Gazette, the two mediety of the rectory of Burnham Norton shall be consolidated into one Incumbency under the rector for the time being of that mediety which is at present united to the said rectory of Burnham Westgate, who shall have the exclusive cure of souls over the whole of the present parish of Burnham Norton, and also all the endowments, emoluments and rights of or belonging to the said two mediety, and shall be subject to the laws, provisions and regulations as to presentation and appointment and as to institution and collation and induction and as to holding benefices and to all such jurisdiction of the Bishop or other jurisdictions as are by law now applicable to the said two mediety of the rectory of Burnham Norton.

“That upon the said consolidation of the said two mediety of the rectory of Burnham Norton taking effect the said Thomas Felton Falkner or other the rector for the time being of the rectory of the said mediety, which is at present united to the said rectory of Burnham Westgate, shall become and be the first rector of the said intended consolidated rectory without any presentation, admission, institution or induction or process of law or other process whatsoever, subject nevertheless to all engagements and liabilities (if any) affecting him as rector or Incumbent of such mediety of the rectory and parish church of Burnham Norton, which engagements and liabilities (if any) shall attach and belong to him as rector or Incumbent of the said intended consolidated rectory in like manner and as fully and effectually to all intents and purposes as if he had remained rector or Incumbent of the said mediety of the rectory of Burnham Norton.

“That upon the said consolidation of the said two mediety of the said rectory of Burnham Norton taking effect, and in consideration of the fact that the whole right of patronage of the said rectory of Burnham Westgate, as well as of the said rectory of the mediety of Burnham Norton united thereto, is now vested in the Master, Fellows and Scholars of Christ's College, Cambridge, and that the whole right of patronage of the said rectory of the other mediety of Burnham Norton is vested in His Majesty and is exercised by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and also in consideration of the relative values of the said benefices, the patronage of the said benefice of Burnham Westgate with the consolidated benefice of Burnham Norton shall be exercised for the second turn of presentation after the same shall next become vacant by the death of the said Thomas Felton Falkner or otherwise, and every fifth turn after such second turn by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of His Majesty, and for all other turns by the Master, Fellows and Scholars of Christ's College, Cambridge.

“And whereas the said Plan is to be taken as an integral part of this Scheme with respect to the whole of its contents.

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Plan shall as to all the contents thereof be carried into effect as in the same Plan is mentioned.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing in this Scheme or in the said Plan now being part of this Scheme as aforesaid

shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.”

"Whereas the late Maria Belcher, of 22, Eccleston Square, in the county of Middlesex, spinster, died on the thirtieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, seised for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Chaldon, having by her will made the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, and proved the fourteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, authorized her nephew, the Reverend Gilbert Edward Belcher, Incumbent or Rector of the said Benefice of Chaldon, in the event of the said Benefice becoming vacant, to present to the same from time to time during his life and subject thereto, directed that the advowson of the said Benefice should be held by her said nephew upon trust to convey and transfer the same to the Bishop of the diocese in which such Benefice should be situate at the time of her death and his successors to the intent that the patronage of the said Benefice should and might vest in perpetuity in such Bishop and his successors.

"And whereas on the thirtieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, the date of the death as aforesaid of the said Maria Belcher, the said Benefice of Chaldon was situate in the diocese of Rochester, but by virtue of an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council, made on the twentieth day of March, one

thousand nine hundred and five, under the provisions of the Bishoprics of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904, the said Benefice became part of and situate in the diocese of Southwark.

"And whereas by virtue of an Order of His said late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council, made under the provisions of the said Bishoprics of Southwark and Birmingham Act, 1904, and dated the seventh day of August, in the year one thousand nine hundred and five, and published in the London Gazette on the eleventh day of the same month, transferring to the Bishop of Southwark and his successors, Bishops of the same Bishopric, the whole estate and interest of the Bishop of Rochester in right of his see of and in all ecclesiastical dignities and benefices situate in the said diocese of Southwark, the interest of the Bishop of Rochester in the said advowson of the said Benefice of Chaldon created by the said will of the said Maria Belcher as aforesaid became vested in the Bishop of Southwark and his successors, Bishops of the same Bishopric.

"And whereas no steps have hitherto been taken by the said Gilbert Edward Belcher to transfer or convey the said advowson so as legally to vest in the Bishop of Rochester or the Bishop of Southwark the reversionary interest therein created by the said will and the said Gilbert Edward Belcher is now desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Chaldon, as well that interest therein belonging to him for his life as the interest therein directed by the said will to be held by him upon trust to convey or transfer the same to the Bishop of the diocese as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Hubert Murray, now Bishop of Southwark, and his successors in the same Bishopric.

"And whereas the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said Benefice of Chaldon which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson is recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Chaldon.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Gilbert Edward Belcher (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patron-

age of and presentation to the said Benefice of Chaldon shall be transferred to the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwark.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of All Souls, Netherton, in the county of Cumberland and in the diocese of Carlisle.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-second day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and published in the London Gazette on the fourth day of the following month, a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of All Souls, situate at Netherton, in the parish of Dearham,

in the said county of Cumberland and in the said diocese of Carlisle, and the said district chapelry was named 'The district chapelry of All Souls, Netherton.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of All Souls, Netherton, has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of All Souls, Netherton, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John William, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said new parish of All Souls, Netherton, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said parish of Dearham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dis-severed from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of All Souls, Netherton.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dis-severed from the parish of Dearham, in the county of Cumberland and in the diocese of Carlisle, and to be annexed to the new parish of All Souls, Netherton, in the same county and diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said parish of Dearham which is comprised within the limits of the civil parish of Ellenborough and Ewanrigg."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual

in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Carlisle.

The following Address was presented to the King, on Thursday, the 7th instant, when His Majesty, accompanied by The Queen, opened King Edward the Seventh's Galleries at the British Museum:—

May it Please Your Majesty.

Your Majesty has been graciously pleased to honour the Trustees of the British Museum by being present to-day to open to the public the greatest addition to the buildings which has been made at any one time since the foundation of the Museum.

Seven years ago Your Majesty, as a Trustee of the Museum, was present when His late Majesty, King Edward VII., laid the foundation stone of the new building, and graciously allowed His own name to be associated with it. As a Trustee, Your Majesty took part in the deliberations in which the plans for this accession to the buildings of the Museum took shape, and is familiar with their history and progress. Their initiation, it is well to recall, in grateful memory of a public-spirited action, was due to a legacy of £50,000 left by Mr. Vincent Stuckey Lean in the year 1900 for the extension and improvement of the Library and Reading Room. To this the Lords of the Treasury (the Chancellor of the Exchequer being Mr. Ritchie) added the sum of £150,000 under the Public Buildings Expenses Act of 1903; and the plans of the building were taken in hand shortly after that date.

The site selected for the new building was a portion of the area acquired by the Trustees in 1895, through the enlightened foresight of the then Chancellor of the Exchequer, Sir William Harcourt, and the generous co-operation of the Duke of Bedford. Ground was then acquired surrounding the existing buildings of the Museum on three sides, and thus providing for their extension for many years to come.

By the erection of the range of galleries which Your Majesty will to-day open to the public, the British Museum enters on what may be regarded as the third stage in its architectural history. On the foundation of the Museum in 1753, after an ineffectual attempt to secure Buckingham House (the predecessor of Your Majesty's present Palace), Montagu House was purchased to be the home of the national collections; and this sufficed, with one slight addition, for a period of nearly seventy years. When the constant growth of the collections, and particularly the acquisition of the library of His Majesty King George III. in 1823, made the extension of the Museum inevitable, a plan was prepared by Sir Robert Smirke for the erection of a new Museum on the site of Montagu House and its gardens. This plan, adopted by Parliament, in 1823, was carried into effect by successive instalments over a period of more than thirty years, being

completed in the year 1855. Sir Robert Smirke's plan brought into existence the present quadrangle of the Museum, to which was added, during the course of the building operations, an additional range of galleries on the western side; and in 1857 the great Reading Room was erected in the centre of the quadrangle. This completed the second stage in the Museum's development.

The third stage, of which the initial portion is now realised, will enclose Sir Robert Smirke's quadrangle with new ranges of galleries parallel to his northern, eastern, and western sides. This scheme is contemplated by the Trustees as a whole, to be carried out, like the previous scheme, over a period of years. The growth of the collections, partly through the annual Parliamentary grant, but still more through the enlightened munificence of private benefactors (some of whom are present to-day), is so great and continuous that each successive addition to the buildings has always been more than filled within a short time of its completion, and no long pause can be made in the material expansion of the Museum without affecting its educational usefulness and the adequate display of its ever-increasing treasures.

The planning of the present extension was entrusted by the Government of the day, after consultation with the President and Council of the Royal Institute of British Architects, to Mr. John Burnet, A.R.S.A., and the Trustees congratulate themselves that they were fortunate enough to secure the services of an architect at once so distinguished in his profession and so devoted to his art. They believe that the building, which has arisen under his guidance is in itself a notable addition to the architectural ornaments of the metropolis, and will form a dignified portion of the entire design when that shall have been carried to completion.

The building has been erected by Your Majesty's Office of Works, the successive First Commissioners and Secretaries of which have been in constant communication with the Trustees, and have co-operated cordially in the attempt to make the structure worthy of the purpose to which it will be put, namely the enshrinement of some of the most valuable and interesting of the art treasures of the nation.

Of the five floors of which the main building consists, two are public exhibition galleries, while three are devoted to students' rooms, officers' studies and storage. In the Upper Gallery the Department of Prints and Drawings will have a better opportunity than ever before of displaying the riches, both of Western and of Oriental art, which it possesses. The Lower Gallery will ultimately contain the collections of glass, of porcelain and pottery, of enamels, plate, and other forms of mediæval art; but for the present it is devoted to an exhibition of the remarkable paintings, manuscripts, and archaeological specimens brought back by Sir Aurel Stein from his last journey to Central Asia. Elsewhere in the building will be stored the Newspapers, the Maps, and the Music from the Department of Printed Books, together with the magnificent Musical Library from Buckingham Palace, which Your Majesty has been graciously pleased to deposit in the British Museum.

The room in which we are here gathered together is the link between the old building and the new. In special fulfilment of Mr.

Lean's purpose, it will provide a supplementary Reading Room for the use of students, together with increased accommodation for the storage of books.

Your Majesty's presence here to-day, together with Her Majesty the Queen, is but the latest example of the favour and encouragement which the British Museum has always received from Your Royal House. In the very earliest days of the existence of the Museum, before its doors were open to the public, it received from His Majesty King George II that superb collection known as the Royal Manuscripts, which is still one of its most valuable treasures. In 1801, when the success of the nation's arms secured as trophies a great collection of Egyptian antiquities, they were presented by His Majesty King George III to the British Museum, and the first addition to Montagu House was built to house "these memorable trophies of national glory." In 1823 the Museum received from His Majesty King George IV the splendid library formed by King George III, which still occupies the fine gallery, known as the King's Library, which was built to receive it. From Her Majesty Queen Victoria and His Majesty King Edward VII the Museum received many benefactions and constant sympathy and support. King Edward was himself a Trustee from the year 1881 until his accession to the throne in 1901, when he was succeeded in the Trust by Your Majesty. Many of the Trustees now present can testify to the warm interest taken by King Edward and Your Majesty in the administration and welfare of the Museum. It is with profound pleasure that the Trustees see Your Majesty here to-day to open the building which is to bear the name of King Edward the Seventh's Galleries.

In commemoration of the event, the Trustees have prepared an album of representations of the architectural history of the Museum, from its origin in Montagu House to the present day; and this, with their humble duty, they would ask Your Majesty to be graciously pleased to accept. Under the patronage of Your Majesty and of Her Majesty the Queen they trust that the British Museum will continue to hold the honourable position which it has acquired during the century and a half of its existence, alike as a storehouse of all manner of treasures of beauty and of knowledge, and as an important influence for good in the education and training of the nation.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

It is with peculiar pleasure that the Queen and I have come here to-day to open this important addition to the British Museum which is to bear the name of My dear Father.

You have told in your Address the remarkable story of the growth of the Museum, and as a former Trustee of this great national institution I feel legitimate pride, not only in its past history, but in the scheme now happily completed to meet its greater future needs.

The objects of the foundation of the Museum have been abundantly realised. It was founded not only for the "advancement and improvement of discoveries in natural philosophy and other branches of speculative knowledge," but also for the "general use

and benefit of the public." The large number of students and visitors who come within these walls each year bear testimony to the useful part which the institution plays in the national life, and the many foreigners from all parts of the world who take advantage of the facilities the Museum offers, justify its claim to rank among the greatest institutions of its kind.

The Museum has always received, and will, I am sure, continue to receive, the generous support of the Government, but it has also profited to a remarkable degree by the public-spirited liberality of many generations of individual benefactors, to whom the nation owes a debt of gratitude.

The new galleries which we are met to open to-day form a worthy addition to one of the noblest public buildings of My Capital. They will enable your ever-growing collections to be displayed to more advantage, and will provide better accommodation for students and for the work of the staff, and will thus, I trust, extend and enhance the influence of the Museum as one of the chief educational agencies of the world.

I accept with pleasure the beautiful album illustrating the architectural development of the Museum. I desire to assure you of My strong personal interest in the work and development of the Museum, which will, I am confident, ever maintain the traditions of a great past, and will go forward to a future of even wider usefulness.

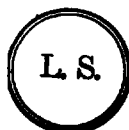

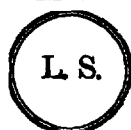

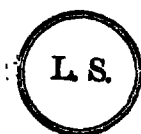

(2.) Swine may be moved to any slaughter-house for the purpose of immediate slaughter

if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as amended by the Swine-Fever Order of 1911, authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of the Parts of Kesteven Division of Lincolnshire.

(3.) Before a licence (Form D) is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.

(4.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(5.) Swine may also be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to any other premises if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorizing such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate, but no such licence shall be expressed to be granted for movement for breeding purposes.

(6.) Before a licence (Form A) is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorized in writing for this purpose, shall sign and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

(7.) The declaration (Form B) shall not be effective until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of the Parts of Kesteven Division of Lincolnshire, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(8.) The declaration (Form B) shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(9.) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) under this Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided.

(10.) Where swine are moved with a licence (Form A) to a market, fairground or saleyard, specified in the licence, the swine shall be moved from such premises only if accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, authorizing such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate and only to a slaughterhouse specified in the licence, or to the premises from which the swine were moved to the market, fairground or saleyard.

(11.) Swine required by this Article to be detained for a period of twenty-eight days may

be moved before the expiration of that period to a slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area if such movement is authorized by a licence in the Form C above mentioned granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained, and the swine are accompanied by the licence.

(12.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.

(13.) Swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where they are moved to a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(14.) Licences granted under this Article shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

(15.) No licence under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 shall be required for the movement into a Scheduled Area for the purposes of that Order of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence granted under this Article.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.

4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as follows:

(i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

(ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then

(iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorizing such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of the Parts of Kesteven Division of Lincolnshire, under this Order or under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as the case may be. The licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorized in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

(3.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

(6.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Copies of Movement Licences to be sent to Local Authority of Place of Destination.

7. A copy of a licence which authorises movement of swine to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

8.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any market, fairground or saleyard, the licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence for movement of the swine from such premises.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any premises other than a market, fairground or saleyard, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

9. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other

person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any float, cart or van used for the conveyance of swine, the person using the same for such purpose, or other person for the time being in charge of the float, cart or van shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Swine-Fever Infected Place” means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the Board:

“Slaughter-house” includes bacon-factory:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of May, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the SLEAFORD ALLOTMENT GARDENS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1914.
