GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting!

Whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria did by a Warrant under Her Royal Sign Manual, countersigned by one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and bearing date, at Her late Majesty's Court at Windsor, the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, make, ordain and establish Statutes for the government of the Royal Victorian Order:

And whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was graciously pleased to institute and create a Medal entitled the Royal Victorian Medal to be awarded to such persons as might have rendered or should thereafter render extraordinary, or important, or personal

services to Her late Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, and who had merited or might thereafter merit Her Royal Favour or the favour of Her Majesty's Successors:

And whereas by a Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, countersigned by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and bearing date at Our Court at Saint James's the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, We were pleased to confirm the institution of the Royal Victorian Medal, and to make, ordain and establish certain additional Statutes:

And whereas We are desirous of supplementing the said Statutes by additional Statutes in regard to the wearing by recipients of more than one medal:

Now therefore, We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, order that the following Statutes be added to the Statutes established by the aforesaid Royal Warrants of the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and of the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twelve:—

XXXI. It is ordained that any person upon whom a silver medal has been or may be conferred and who has previously received a bronze medal shall be entitled to wear both medals.

XXXII. It is ordained that any person upon

whom a silver-gilt medal has been or may be conferred and who has previously received a silver medal or a bronze medal or both shall be entitled to wear both medals or the three medals as the case may be.

XXXIII. It is ordained that any service which is worthy of recognition by the award of the bronze, silver or silver-gilt medal, but is rendered by one upon whom that decoration has already been conferred, may be recorded by a clasp attached to the riband by which the medal is suspended; and such clasp shall consist of a bar inscribed with the year in which it is awarded and surmounted by Our Royal Cypher.

XXXIV. It is ordained that any member of Our said Royal Victorian Order upon whom the Royal Victorian Medal has been or may be conferred shall be entitled to wear the said Medal in the manner provided as aforesaid in addition to the insignia of the Order.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to William Broomhall under the following circumstances:—

On the morning of the 26th March, 1914, William Broomhall, a workman employed by the Clay Cross Coal, Lime and Iron Company, and Edwin William Birkumshaw were charging blast furnaces on a platform seventy-five feet above the ground when a severe explosion took place in one of the furnaces, accompanied by an outburst of flaming gases at a high temperature. Birkumshaw was standing about ten feet away from the furnace; his clothing caught fire, and he was severely burned. Broomhall was at the far end of the platform near the other furnace, about fifty feet away. A gale of wind carrying the gases was blowing almost straight down the platform, and he was burned about the face and hands. In attempting to escape, he fell into the hopper of the other furnace. He again reached the platform and heard a cry for assistance. In the teeth of the gale and the flaming hot gases which were still escaping he made his way, at the risk of his life, to Birkumshaw, and succeeded in pulling off his burning clothes. In doing so he sustained further injuries. To add to his danger a wooden cabin and some timber near which he had to pass caught fire, and he also ran the risk of a further explosion in the furnace.

In all probability Broomhall, by his prompt and courageous action, saved the life of his fellow-workman.

(1) The inquiry shall be opened at such time and place as may be fixed by the person appointed by the Board of Trade to hold the inquiry (in these rules referred to as "the Commissioner"), and notice of the time and place so fixed shall be sent by post by the Board of Trade to all persons who have sent to the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Special Order: Provided that the non-receipt of such notice by any such person shall not invalidate the proceedings or render necessary an adjournment of the inquiry.

(2) The Commissioner may adjourn the inquiry from time to time as he sees fit, and may hold adjourned sittings at any place which he thinks necessary for the convenience of persons who objected to the draft Special

Order.

(3) The Commissioner may give such directions as he thinks necessary as to the order in which any portions of the draft Special Order and the objections thereto shall be considered, and as to the order in which the parties appearing at the inquiry shall be heard.

(4) If any person who has not made objections to the draft Special Order in accordance with Section 113 (1) claims to be heard at the inquiry, the Commissioner may require him to state his objection in writing in the manner provided by the Ninth Schedule to the

National Insurance Act, 1911.

(5) If the objections to any draft Special Order made by more than one person appearing at the inquiry appear to the Commissioner to be the same in substance, he may select any person whom he considers representative of the largest number of persons affected by the draft Special Order to state such objections, and to call evidence (if required) in support of such objections. Any other person making the same objections may be heard subsequently by consent of the Commissioner.

(6) The Commissioner may stop any statement which appears to him to be irrelevant to the draft Special Order or objection under consideration, or to involve unnecessary repeti-

tion of arguments already fully stated.

(7) Subject to the provisions of Section 113
(1) and to the foregoing rules, all the proceedings shall be conducted in such manner as the Commissioner may direct.
