ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 29TH MAY 1914.)

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) AMEND-  
MENT ORDER OF 1914 (No. 14).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Revocation.*

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Amendment Order of 1914 (No. 13) is hereby revoked.

*Regulation of Landing.*

2. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine brought from Ireland shall not be landed in Great Britain except in accordance with the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Orders of 1913, as amended by this Order.

*Landing of animals intended either for slaughter within Landing Place, or for movement out of Landing Place, after ten hours' detention.*

3.—(1.) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine put on board at any port mentioned in the First Schedule hereto may be landed at any Landing Place or part thereof described in the Second Schedule hereto and at no other Landing Place.

(2.) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine put on board at any port mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto may be landed at any Landing Place or part thereof described in the Fourth Schedule hereto and at no other Landing Place.

(3.) Animals landed at any Landing Place or part thereof before or after the commencement of this Order shall on and after that date be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Orders of 1913.

(4.) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine which have been moved from any Irish Animals Landing Place before the commencement of this Order, under a licence granted by an Inspector of the Board under the Order hereby revoked shall, on that date cease to be subject to the conditions as to subsequent slaughter or detention and isolation prescribed by that Order.

*Condition of Landing at any Landing Place.*

4. The landing of any animals under this Order must be authorised by the Superinten-

dent or person in charge of the Landing Place.

*Conditional Permits.*

5. An Inspector of the Board may impose conditions on the removal of anything from a Landing Place for which a permission granted by an Inspector is required, and if any person fails to comply with any such condition which is specified in the permission and which he is thereby required to observe he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Movement from Landing Place subject to other Orders and to Regulations.*

6. Nothing in this Order or in any Order relating to the landing or movement of animals brought from Ireland shall be deemed to authorise the movement of an animal in contravention of an Order of the Board or a Regulation of a Local Authority.

*Offences.*

7. If any animal shall be landed in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

8. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Commencement.*

9. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of June, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

*Short Title.*

10. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1914 (No. 14).
