The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of the Isle of Ely) Order, 1914.

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of the Isle of Ely) Order, 1914."

Close Time varied.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be varied throughout the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely, so as to be between the 14th day of March and the 1st day of September in any year.

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied by Clause II. of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely:—

Bullfinch, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Owl (all species), Woodpecker (all species).

Repeal of former Order.

IV. The Order of the 21st June, 1909, is hereby repealed.

And whereas it is enacted by sub-section (2) of section 16 of the Act that the sums available for defraying the expenses of sanatorium benefit in each year shall be one shilling and three pence in respect of each insured person resident in the county or county borough, and such further sum as is mentioned in the said sub-section:

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (1) of section 61 of the Act that all sums available for sanatorium benefit shall be paid or credited to Insurance Committees at the commencement of the year:

And whereas by the National Health Insurance (Sanatorium Benefit) Order, 1913, it was amongst other things provided that for the purpose of defraying the expenses of sanatorium benefit during the period from the 15th day of July, 1912, to the 12th day of January, 1913, both inclusive (in that Order and hereinafter referred to as "the initial period"), there should be deducted from the amounts standing to the credit of Approved Societies the sums therein specified, and that the sums so deducted should be apportioned amongst the several Insurance Committees in proportion to the number of persons in their respective areas:

And whereas in the case of persons whose contribution cards were not brought into account before the 31st day of December, 1913, no deduction has been made under the provisions of the recited Order, and for the reasons more particularly set forth in that Order it is expedient that such deductions should be made:

And whereas by reason of the premises a difficulty has arisen in bringing Part I of the Act into operation:

Now, therefore, the Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by section 78 of the Act, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1.—(1) For the purpose of enabling Insurance Committees to defray the expenses of sanatorium benefit incurred during the initial period, there shall be deducted at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may direct, from the amounts standing to the credit of Approved Societies, the sums specified in the Schedule to this Order, and the sums so deducted shall be apportioned between the several Insurance Committees in proportion to the number of insured persons resident in their respective areas:

Provided that the contributions paid by any person not entitled to sanatorium benefit shall not be taken into account in calculating the amount to be deducted from the amount standing to the credit of an Approved Society.

(2) For the purposes of this Order the expression "person not entitled to sanatorium

benefit" means an insured person whom the Insurance Committee have no power to recommend for sanatorium benefit.

2. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Sanatorium Benefit) Order, 1914.

SCHEDULE.

The sum to be deducted from the amount standing to the credit of an Approved Society shall be such sum as would represent a payment of 3½d. for each member of the Society who surrendered a stamped card to the Society in respect of the period ending the 13th day of October, 1912, and of 3½d. for each member of the Society who surrendered a stamped card to the Society in respect of the period ending the 12th day of January, 1913:

Provided that in the case of any member of the Society in whose case the cost of benefits is payable as to 2-9ths or ¼th out of moneys provided by Parliament, the sum to be deducted as aforesaid shall be reduced by 2-9ths or ¼th, as the case may be.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

SHEEP (DOUBLE DIPPING) ORDER OF
1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Order.

1.—(1.) In this Order the expression "Movement Area" means an Area to which Part I of this Order is applied by an Order of the Board; and the expression "Double Dipping Area" means an Area to which Part II of this Order is so applied.

(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly without a Movement Area or Double Dipping Area the provisions of Part I or Part II of this Order, as the case may be, shall apply to the farm or holding and the sheep thereon as if the whole farm or holding were in the Area.

PART I.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area.

2.—(1.) Sheep shall not be moved out of a Movement Area, unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are when the licence is granted.

(2.) Unless the Inspector is satisfied—

(a) that the sheep are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the sheep should in accordance with the provisions of this Article be dipped before movement for such purpose; or

(b) that the sheep are to be moved direct to a slaughter-house;

a licence for movement under this Article shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be granted only for sheep in respect of which the Inspector is satisfied that they have within twenty-eight days before the licence is granted been dipped twice, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, and have since the second dipping been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped in a place of isolation approved for the purpose by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority.

(3.) Unless the Order applying this Part of this Order to the Movement Area otherwise directs, the dippings shall be in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(4.) The licence shall be in force for six days,

inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(5.) A copy of a licence under this Article authorising movement of sheep to a slaughter-house shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughter-house is situate.

(6.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Provision for Movement through Movement Area by Railway.

3. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of a Movement Area in any case where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the sheep being untrucked within such Area.

Provision for Movement of Irish Sheep through Movement Area.

4. Sheep landed from Ireland in a Movement Area shall not for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be moved out of such Area if they are consigned from Ireland to a place of destination outside such Area, but sheep so landed shall be moved from the landing-place by the most direct route to the nearest available railway station from which the sheep can be moved to the place of destination to which they are so consigned, and forthwith moved by railway out of such Area.

PART II.

Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area.

5.—(1.) All sheep which are in a Double Dipping Area at any time between the dates specified in the Order applying this Part of this Order thereto, which period is referred to in this Order as "the double dipping period," shall be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep, twice, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, and, if possible, such dippings shall be carried out before the expiration of the double dipping period.

(2.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under this Part of this Order shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—

(i.) the notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such persons as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District:

(ii.) the notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority;

(iii.) the notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the

approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.

(3.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.

(4.) All sheep after their second dipping shall during the remainder of the double dipping period be kept, as far as practicable, isolated from sheep which have not been so dipped.

(5.) This Article shall not apply to sheep slaughtered within the Double Dipping Area during the double dipping period, or to sheep moved by railway through the Double Dipping Area without being untrucked within the Area.

Appointment by Local Authority of Persons to receive Notices.

6. The Local Authority shall, in the case of a Double Dipping Area, appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices under this Order, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.

Powers of Entry and Examination.

7. For the purposes of this Part of this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, subject to the direction of the Local Authority, enter any premises within a Double Dipping Area and examine any sheep thereon, and such powers of entry and examination shall be in addition to any other like powers vested in the Inspector by the Act of 1894 or otherwise.

PART III.

GENERAL.

Power to Grant Exemptions.

8.—(1.) An Inspector of the Board acting under their direction may grant an exemption, with or without conditions, exempting sheep in a Movement Area or Double Dipping Area from one or both of the prescribed dippings in any particular case in which the Inspector is satisfied that it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip the sheep.

(2.) A like exemption may also be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority acting under the direction of the Local Authority, but in any such case the reasons for granting the exemption shall be stated therein, and the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a copy of the exemption to be forwarded to the Board. If the Board consider that the exemption is for any reason undesirable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate, but not so as to affect the previous operation of the exemption.

(3.) The provisions of this Order limiting the power to grant licences for movement of sheep shall have effect subject to any exemption granted under this Article.

Exemptions of Dipped Sheep from Further Dippings in Certain Cases.

9. In any case where sheep are required to be dipped by Order of the Board or Regulation

of a Local Authority, or where movement of sheep is subject to their previous dipping, an Inspector of the Board, or, as regards a Regulation, an Inspector of the Local Authority by whom the Regulation was made, may exempt sheep which have been dipped under this Order from any dipping required under the Order or Regulation, or authorise movement of sheep within fifty-six days of their dipping under this Order without any additional dipping which would but for this provision be required by the Order or Regulation as a condition of their movement.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

10.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

11. The provisions of this Order shall, except where it is otherwise provided, be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

12.—(1.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Licence granted thereunder, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the double dipping period shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

13. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector:

"Sheep" includes lambs.
 "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
 "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

14. The Sheep-Scab (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1906 and the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906 are hereby revoked.

Short Title.

15. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP (DOUBLE DIPPING) ORDER OF 1914.

Application of Order.

1.—(1.) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Board, or an Inspector of the Local Authority, considers it necessary or expedient for the purpose of preventing the spread of sheep-scab, he may apply Part I, or Part II,

or both of such Parts, of this Order to any premises by a Notice to that effect served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) A Notice shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector or other Officer of the Board, or in the case of a Notice served by an Inspector of a Local Authority upon such service of a Notice signed by any such Inspector.

(3.) A copy of every Notice served by an Inspector under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector serving the same.

PART I.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep from Premises to which this Part of this Order is applied.

2.—(1.) Sheep shall not be moved from any premises to which this Part of this Order is

applied unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are when the licence is granted.

(2.) Unless the Inspector is satisfied—

(a) that the sheep are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the sheep should in accordance with the provisions of this Article be dipped before movement for such purpose; or

(b) that the sheep are to be moved direct to a slaughter-house;

a licence for movement under this Article shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be granted only for sheep in respect of which the Inspector is satisfied that they have within twenty-eight days before the licence is granted been dipped twice, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, and have since the second dipping been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped in a place of isolation approved for the purpose by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority.

(5.) A copy of a licence under this Article authorising movement of sheep to a slaughter-house shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughter-house is situate.

(6.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(7.) Sheep shall not be deemed to be moved from the premises described in the Notice if they are moved direct from one part of the premises to another part of the premises, though such parts are severed.

PART II.

Double Dipping of Sheep on Premises to which this Part of this Order is Applied.

3.—(1.) All sheep which are on premises to which this Part of this Order is applied by Notice served under this Order at any time between the dates specified in the Notice, which period is referred to in this Order as “the double dipping period,” shall be dipped on the premises by the owner or person in charge of the sheep, twice, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, and, if possible, such dippings shall be carried out before the expiration of the double dipping period.

(2.) A Notice applying this Part of this Order may require that the dippings shall be in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(3.) All sheep after their second dipping shall during the remainder of the double dip-

ping period be kept, as far as practicable, isolated from sheep which have not been so dipped.

(4.) Sheep slaughtered on the premises during the double dipping period shall be exempt from the requirements of this Article.

Powers of Entry and Examination.

4. For the purposes of this Part of this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, subject to the direction of the Local Authority, enter any premises to which this Part of this Order applies and examine any sheep thereon, and such powers of entry and examination shall be in addition to any other like powers vested in the Inspector by the Act of 1894 or otherwise.

PART III.

GENERAL.

Power to Grant Exemptions.

5.—(1.) An Inspector of the Board, acting under their direction, may grant an exemption, with or without conditions, exempting sheep on premises to which Part I or Part II of this Order applies from one or both of the prescribed dippings in any particular case in which the Inspector is satisfied that it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip the sheep.

(2.) A like exemption may also be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority acting under the direction of the Local Authority, but in any such case the reasons for granting the exemption shall be stated therein, and the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a copy of the exemption to be forwarded to the Board. If the Board consider that the exemption is for any reason undesirable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate, but not so as to affect the previous operation of the exemption.

(3.) The provisions of this Order limiting the power to grant licences for movement of sheep shall have effect subject to any exemption granted under this Article.

Exemptions of Dipped Sheep from Further Dippings in Certain Cases.

6. In any case where sheep are required to be dipped by Order of the Board or Regulation of a Local Authority, or where movement of sheep is subject to their previous dipping, an Inspector of the Board, or, as regards a Regulation, an Inspector of the Local Authority by whom the Regulation was made may exempt sheep which have been dipped under this Order from any dipping required under the Order or Regulation, or authorise movement of sheep within fifty-six days of their second dipping under this Order without any additional dipping which would but for this provision be required by the Order or Regulation as a condition of their movement.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

7.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and

address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall, except where it is otherwise provided, be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Licence granted thereunder, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, or a Notice served thereunder, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the double dipping period shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives

a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Existing Orders.

1. The Sheep-Scab (Denbighshire, Flintshire, and Montgomeryshire) Order of 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the Sheep-Scab (Denbighshire, Flintshire, Merionethshire, and Montgomeryshire) Order of 1911, are hereby modified in the manner hereinafter appearing.

Returns by Owners of Sheep in Dipping Area on 1st September.

2. Article 2 of the principal Order (*Returns by Owners of Sheep in Dipping Area on 15th July*) shall apply as if the first day of September were substituted for the fifteenth day of July.

Dipping of Sheep in Dipping Area during First Prescribed Dipping Period to be dispensed with.

3. Articles 3 and 4, and paragraph (2) of Article 6, of the principal Order, which relate to dipping of sheep during the first prescribed dipping period, are hereby revoked.

Restrictions on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, &c., and on Movement out of Dipping Area, to apply only between 31st August and 1st November.

4. ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

PART I.

REGULATIONS AS TO SHEEP.

Application of Part I of the Order.

1. Part I of this Order applies to sheep brought from Ireland and landed at a Landing Place for Irish animals.

Restriction on Movement of Store Sheep.

2. Sheep shall not be permitted by an Inspector of the Board to be moved out of the Landing Place unless and until they have been caused to be dipped in the Landing Place, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved: Provided that this Article

shall not apply to sheep which, in the opinion of the Inspector, are fit and intended for immediate slaughter or are declared in writing by the owner or person in charge thereof to be intended for immediate slaughter. Every such declaration shall be given to the Inspector and retained by him.

Procedure in case of Sheep-scab.

3.—(1.) A sheep shall not be moved out of a Landing Place if and so long as it is, in the opinion of a Veterinary Inspector of the Board, affected with or suspected of sheep-scab.

(2.) If a Veterinary Inspector of the Board is of opinion that a sheep in a Landing Place is affected with or suspected of sheep-scab, any other sheep which were brought in the same vessel with the diseased or suspected animal, or which, in the opinion of the Inspector, have been exposed to infection by contact with the diseased or suspected animal or otherwise, shall not be moved out of the Landing Place unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Board.

(3.) Sheep authorised by a licence so granted to be moved to a slaughterhouse shall before movement out of the Landing Place be caused to be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back, and another broad line across the loins of each sheep thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long, and on arrival at the slaughterhouse shall be there detained and be slaughtered by the owner within four days after their arrival at the slaughterhouse.

(4.) Sheep authorised by a licence so granted to be moved to any premises other than a slaughterhouse shall not be moved out of the Landing Place unless and until they have been caused to be dipped in the Landing Place, to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Board, by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved; and sheep moved under the authority of any such licence shall after their arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be there detained and isolated from other sheep until an Inspector of the Local Authority is satisfied that they have been dipped between the seventh and fourteenth days after the date of their previous dipping in the Landing Place by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, and the movement licence is endorsed by the Inspector with the word "Released": Provided that sheep required to be detained and dipped under this provision may before the expiration of the period within which their dipping is required at the place of destination be moved, without having been so dipped in the place of destination, to a slaughterhouse for immediate slaughter, if such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the sheep are to be moved are situate. Sheep so moved shall be detained at the slaughterhouse and there slaughtered by the owner within four days after their arrival at the slaughterhouse.

(5.) Article 12 (*Provision where sheep-scab is found on examination before shipment*) of

the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1913 shall apply to the provisions of this Article as if they were the provisions therein referred to.

(6.) Sheep moved with a licence under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and during the movement the sheep shall, as far as practicable, be kept separate from sheep which are not being moved with a similar licence.

(7.) Every licence under this Order shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station of the District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing the movement.

(8.) A copy of every licence granted under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

(9.) Where under any Order relating to sheep-scab, or any regulation made thereunder, sheep are required to be dipped under prescribed conditions, the dipping of any sheep under this Order shall, for the purposes of such Order or regulation, be treated as a dipping of the sheep under the prescribed conditions.

(10.) An Isolation Notice under Article 5 of the Sheep-Scab Order of 1905 shall not be served on sheep to which this Article relates in respect of their exposure to the infection of sheep-scab in the Landing Place or previously.

Revocation.

4. Article 11 (*Procedure in case of sheep-scab*) of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1913 is hereby revoked.

PART II.

DISINFECTION.

Provision as to Disinfection where Foot-and-Mouth Disease exists.

5.—(1.) If an animal brought from Ireland for the purpose of being landed in Great Britain is affected with or suspected of foot-and-mouth disease, the following provisions shall apply whether the animal is so landed or not.

(2.) The animal or its carcase and all animals carried in the same vessel shall only be landed at such place and at such time and in such manner as an Inspector of the Board may direct.

(3.) The parts of the vessel in which the animals have been carried shall be cleansed and disinfected by the owner or charterer of the vessel to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Board as soon as practicable, and, if so required by a notice given by an Inspector of the Board to the master of the vessel, before any cargo, other than the animals or their carcases, is removed from the vessel.

(4.) All dung of animals, and all partly consumed fodder that has been supplied to the animals, and all litter that has been used for or about the animals, shall be landed and disposed of by destruction or otherwise by the

owner or charterer of the vessel in such manner as an Inspector of the Board shall direct.

(5.) Every person who has tended the animals or who shall land from the vessel shall, if so required by an Inspector of the Board, thoroughly wash his hands with soap and water and disinfect his boots and clothes in such manner as the Inspector may direct.

(6.) If any person acts in contravention of this Article, or fails to comply with the provisions thereof, he shall, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Power of Local Authorities to make Regulations as to Landing and Removal of Dung, Fodder, &c.

6.—(1.) A Local Authority may for the purpose of preventing the spreading of disease make Regulations for:—

(a) regulating the landing in the District of the Local Authority of dung of cattle, sheep, goats, or swine brought from Ireland, or of partly consumed or broken fodder that has been supplied to such animals, or of litter that has been used for or about such animals; or

(b) regulating the removal of dung, fodder, or litter out of a Landing Place for Irish animals in the District.

(2.) If any dung, fodder, or litter shall be landed or removed in contravention of any Regulation made under this Article, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing or other place where or from which such dung or other thing is landed or moved, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing or movement, and also in the case of the landing thereof, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.


