A PROCLAMATION FOR A BANK HOLIDAY.

GEORGE R.I.

Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of June instant, should be observed as a Bank Holiday in the City of Nottingham, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, appoint Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of June instant, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the City of Nottingham, under and in accordance with the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving Subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Windsor Castle, this eighteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and in the Fifth year of Our Reign.

Peterborough.

"Whereas one undivided one-third share of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Rothwell with Orton is vested in Bernard Chaytor Lucas, of No. 8, Princes Buildings, Clifton, Bristol, in the county of Gloucester, shipowner, Norton Joseph Hughes-Hallett, of the County Offices, Derby, in the county of Derby, Clerk of the Peace for the said county, and Maynard Sandys Brodhurst, of No. 23, West Bars, Chesterfield, in the said county of Derby, gentleman (hereinafter called 'the said Trustees') upon trust to sell the same and to hold the proceeds of the sale for the benefit of Wilfred George Lucas, of Birley, Prideaux Road, Eastbourne, in the county of Sussex, gentleman, the said Bernard Chaytor Lucas, Monica Mary Clare Gully, the wife of Percy Gully, of Roseberry, Shanklin, in the Isle of Wight, gentleman, Marguerite Mary Monica Bethune, the wife of Charles Congleton Bethune, of Victoria, in the Province of British Columbia, gentleman, and Madeleine Louisa Lucas-Carnielli, of 'Medina,' Montague Road, West Southbourne, Bournemouth, in the county of Hampshire, widow, as life tenants, or at the discretion of the said Trustees to retain the same unsold.

"And whereas the said Trustees, and the said Wilfred George Lucas, Bernard Chaytor Lucas, Monica Mary Clare Gully, Marguerite Mary Monica Bethune, and Madeleine Louisa Lucas-Carnielli are desirous that the said one undivided one-third share of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Rothwell with Orton should not be sold, but should be transferred to and be vested in the Honourable and Right Reverend Edward Carr, now Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors in the same

bishoprick.

"And whereas the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore-mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough, has executed this scheme as

hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the said undivided one-third share of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of the said benefice of Rothwell with Orton, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in, or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to

say, in the parish of Rothwell with Orton.
"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Trustees, and of the said Wilfred George Lucas, Bernard Chaytor Lucas, Monica Mary Clare Gully, Marguerite Mary Monica |

Bethune, and Madeleine Louisa Lucas-Carnielli, as such beneficiaries as aforesaid (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this scheme), and with the consent of the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said one undivided one-third share of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Rothwell with Orton shall be transferred to the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peter-borough, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And whereas the said Trustees are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of All Saints, Stoneycroft, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Francis James, now Bishop of Liverpool, and his suc-

cessors in the same bishoprick.

"And whereas the said Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore-mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool, has executed this Scheme as hereinaftermentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of All Saints, Stoneycroft, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the new parish of All Saints, Stoneycroft.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Martin, Zeals, in the county of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury, between that benefice and a certain other benefice, namely, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Mere, which said lastnamed benefice is situate in the said county of Wilts, and in the said Diocese of Salisbury.

"Whereas the Bishop of the said Diocese of Salisbury is the patron in right of his See of the said benefice of Saint Martin, Zeals, and

also of the said benefice of Mere.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of Mere is at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said benefice of Saint Martin, Zeals, has endowments of such an amount that, after the apportionment hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been made, the said benefice of Saint Martin, Zeals, will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Frederic Edward, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Salisbury, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the parish of Mere aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Saint Martin, Zeals, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Saint

Martin, Zeals, is now vacant.

"And whereas the endowments of the said benefice of Saint Martin, Zeals, include a yearly sum or stipend of two hundred pounds payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, out of the fund created by the first hereinbefore-mentioned Act, which yearly sum or stipend was secured to the said benefice of Saint Martin, Zeals, by an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, dated the 9th day of July, in the year 1864, and published in the London Gazette on the 12th day of the same month.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting as Archbishop of the Province within which each of the said two benefices is situate (in testimony of which consent he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal), and with the consent of the said Frederic Edward, Bishop of the said Diocese of Salisbury, acting as such Bishop, and also as the patron in right of his See of each of the said two benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and as from the day of the date on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, a yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and eight pounds, being part of the said yearly sum or stipend of two hundred pounds payable out of our common fund under the said Order in Council of the 9th day of July, in the year 1864, shall be transferred, by way of apportionment, from the said benefice of Saint Martin, Zeals, and shall be annexed to and form part of the endowments of the said benefice of Mere.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties in-terested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modifi-cation thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect.

And whereas the Right Reverend Edgar, Lord Bishop of Saint Albans, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation in writing, dated the 1st day of November, 1913, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Edgar, by Divine permission Bishop of St. Albans, do, in pursuance of an Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, cap. 106, hereby represent to your Grace as follows:

"1. There is in the county of Essex and my diocese of St. Albans the rectory of Lawford, the parish whereof contains, according to the Census of 1911, a population of 896.

'2. The net annual value of the said benefice arising from tithe, rent charge, glebe and

other sources is £460 or thereabouts;

"3. There is in the county and diocese aforesaid the vicarage of Manningtree, the parish whereof contains, according to the Census of

1911, a population of 887;
"4. The net annual value of the said benefice arising from pew rents, dividends from the Ecclesiastical Commission and other sources is

£188 or thereabouts;

"5. It appears to me that a certain district of the said ecclesiastical parish of Lawford, being contiguous to the ecclesiastical parish of Manningtree, and known as Lower Lawford, and comprising part of the town of Manningtree may, under the provisions of the said Act, 1 and 2 Vict., cap. 106, and of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same reign, cap. 49, be advantageously separated from the said parish of Lawford, and united to the said parish of Manningtree;

"6. The Master, Fellows, and Scholars of the College of St. John the Evangelist, in the University of Cambridge, are the patrons of the said benefice of Lawford, and the Reverend Thomas Kensit Norman, Clerk, M.A., Rector of the rectory of Mistley-with-Bradfield, in the said county of Essex, is, in right of his said rectory, the patron of the said vicarage of

Manningtree;

"7. The Reverend Robert Yates Whyte-head, Clerk, M.A., is the present Incumbent of the said benefice of Lawford, and the Reverend Edwin Archibald Ley, Clerk, is the present Incumbent of the said benefice of

Manningtree;
"8. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the first mentioned Act of Parliament, I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing, appended to this Representation, describing the said district of the ecclesiastical parish of Lawford, so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the ecclesiastical parish of Manningtree, and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may be best effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the consents in writing of the said patrons and Incumbents, and in case you shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied therewith, I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and such consents to His Majesty in Council.'

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:-

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate a district from the ecclesiastical parish of Lawford, in the county of Essex and diocese of St. Albans, and unite such district for ecclesiastical purposes to

the adjoining ecclesiastical parish of Manningtree, in the same county and diocese.

"It is further proposed that such district shall consist of all that portion of the said parish of Lawford which lies to the east of an imaginary line starting at the point where the boundary between the said parish of Lawford and the parish of Mistley, in the said county of Essex and diocese of St. Albans, crosses the centre of the High Road leading from Colchester to Harwich and running thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the said last-mentioned road until it reaches the junction of the road leading to Manningtree (past the entrance gates and lodge to Dale Hall) and continuing in a northerly direction along the centre of the last-mentioned road past the said entrance gates and lodge to a point three hundred feet from the northern boundary of the said road where it branches off in an easterly direction: The said imaginary line then runs in an easterly and north-easterly direction in a parallel line with the said road at a distance of three hundred feet from the northern and north-western boundary thereof until it reaches the north-eastern boundary of the Harwich branch of the Great Eastern Railway, whence it runs along the said boundary in a north-westerly direction and in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of the north curve connecting the said Harwich branch of the Great Eastern Railway with the main line of the same railway until it reaches the boundary between the said parish of Lawford and the parish of Brantham, in the county of Suffolk and diocese of Norwich: All which said district is bounded on the north-east by the said parish of Brantham, on the east by the said parish of Manningtree, on the southeast by the said parish of Mistley, and on all other sides by the said imaginary line, and is verged round with the colour pink and indicated by the letter 'A' on the annexed plan.

"The inhabitants of the said district shall not after this Scheme takes effect be entitled to any accommodation in the parish church of Lawford (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said church, and who may not be willing to relinquish the same) and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said parish church of Lawford, but shall be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Manningtree, and shall be liable, subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868,

to the repairs of the said church.

"The Incumbent of the parish church of Manningtree shall when this scheme takes effect have the exclusive cure of souls within the said district.

"The fees for marriages and churchings and all other ecclesiastical dues arising from the said district and due to the Incumbent thereof shall, when this scheme takes effect, belong to the Incumbent of the benefice of Manningtree

"No alteration shall be made in the patron-

age of either of the said benefices.
"There shall out of the tithe-rentcharge payable in respect of the lands within the said parish of Lawford and belonging to the rectory of Lawford be assigned and attached to the vicarage of Manningtree the yearly sum of £34 12s. Od. composed of the several sums assessed upon the lands comprised in the Schedule hereunder written being extracts from the original and altered tithe apportionments.

WHEREAS by section one hundred and four of the Explosives Act, 1875, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, declare that any substance which appears to His Majesty to be specially dangerous to life or property by reason either of its explosive properties or of any process in the manufacture thereof being liable to explosion, shall be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act, and the provisions of the said Act (subject to such exceptions, limitations, and restrictions as may be specified in the Order) shall accordingly extend to any such substance in like manner as if it were included in the term "explosive" in the said Act:

And whereas acetylene, when liquid or subject to a certain degree of compression, or when in admixture with air or oxygen, is specially dangerous to life or property by reason of its explosive properties:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been

complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and declare, and be it ordered and declared, as follows:—

Acetylene, when liquid or when subject to a pressure above that of the atmosphere capable of supporting a column of water exceeding two hundred and fifty inches in height, and whether or not in admixture with other substances, or when in admixture with atmospheric air or with oxygen gas in whatever proportion and at whatever pressure, and whether or not in admixture with other substances, shall be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act, subject to the following exception; that if it be shown to the satisfaction of the Secretary of State that acetylene, declared to be explosive by this Order when in admixture with any substance, or in any form or condition, is not possessed of explosive properties, the Secretary of State may, by Order, exempt such acetylene from being deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act.

And whereas by section forty-three of the Explosives Act, 1875, it is provided that His Majesty, from time to time, by Order in Council may prohibit, either absolutely or except in pursuance of a licence of the Secretary of State under the said Act, or may subject to conditions or restrictions the manufacture, keeping, importation from any place out of the United Kingdom, conveyance, and sale, or any of them, of any explosive which is of so dangerous a character that in the judgment of His Majesty it is expedient for the public safety to make such Order:

And whereas it is in the judgment of His Majesty expedient for the public safety that acetylene, when an explosive within the meaning of this Order, shall be prohibited:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been

complied with:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the abovementioned provision of this Act, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and prescribe that acetylene, declared to be an explosive by this Order, shall be prohibited from being manufactured, imported, kept, conveyed, or sold.

Provided that nothing in this Order shall apply to acetylene in admixture with air when such admixture takes place only in a burner or contrivance in which the mixture is intended

to be burnt.

Provided also that nothing in this Order shall be held to apply to an admixture of acetylene and air which may unavoidably occur in the first use or recharging of an apparatus, properly designed and constructed with a view to the production of pure acetylene.

This Order shall come into operation from the date of its publication in the London Gazette, and as from that date the Orders in Council relating to acetylene gas dated 26th November, 1897, and 15th May, 1900, are hereby repealed. Provided that nothing in this repeal shall affect the Orders of the Secretary of State dated the 28th March, 1898, the 29th September, 1905, and the 6th August, 1912, made under the said Order in Council dated the 26th November, 1897, and such Orders shall have effect as if made under this Order.

I. To receive full pay at the rate of 17s. a day while re-employed or undergoing courses of instruction.

II. To be under the same conditions as regards pension, etc., in case of death or injury as would be applicable in the event of their being called upon to serve in time of war or emergency.

HEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is enacted that, in case it appear to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 11th day of January, 1900, it was ordered that burials should be discontinued in (amongst other places) the parish church of Llanfihangel, in the county of Montgomery, and also in so much of the churchyard as is not situated (a) within fifteen yards of the west, south, and east boundaries thereof; or (b) to the north side of the church, with certain exceptions in the said Order in Council specified:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the said parish of Llanfihangel ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a representation that, for reasons of public health, so much of the said Order in Council of the 11th day of January, 1900, as relates to burials in the parish church and the churchyard of Llanfihangel aforesaid, should be varied so as to provide that burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the said churchyard: Provided that in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed of the bodies of Ann Griffith and D. C. Davies, for whom grave spaces have been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 30th day of July next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said 30th day of July.
