ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH JULY 1914).

BLACK MOUNTAIN DISTRICT (SHEEP-DIPPING) ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Double Dipping of all Sheep between 31st August and 1st October.

1.—(1.) All sheep—except those exempted by an exemption granted under Article 3 of the Sheep-Dipping (South Wales and Monmouth) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order")—which are on any lands to which this Article applies at any time between the fourteenth day of July and the first day of October in the current year, or in any subsequent year, shall be caused to be dipped during that year by the owner or person in charge thereof twice between the thirty-first day of August and the first day of October following, which for the purposes of such sheep shall be the prescribed dipping period, by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Board for sheep scab or purporting to be so approved, with an interval of not less than ten days between the dippings. Each dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District

wherein the sheep are, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice. dipping shall, where practicable, take place on lands to which this Article applies, but where such dipping is not practicable, the Notice may require the dipping to be carried out on other premises specified in the Notice, and may impose any conditions as to movement, detention, isolation and dipping of the sheep which the Inspector may consider desirable and specify in the Notice. Sheep which are on any lands to which this Article applies on the first day of September in the current year, or in any subsequent year, shall be exempt from the general dipping required by the principal Order between the fourteenth day of July and the first day of September following.

(2.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by paragraph (1) of this Article the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the prescribed dipping period shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If the owner or person in charge of sheep to which a Notice served under paragraph (1) of this Article relates fails to comply with any condition specified in such Notice he shall, according to his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(4.) Articles 4 and 7 of the principal Order shall not apply to sheep affected by this Article.

(5.) This Article shall apply to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any lands in the neighbourhood to which it may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the lands described in such Notice.

(6.) This Article shall cease to apply to any lands upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an In-

spector of the Board.

(7.) A copy of every Notice served under paragraph (5) of this Article by an Inspector of the Local Authority shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep between 14th July and 1st October.

2.—(1.) Sheep shall not between the fourteenth day of July and the first day of October in the current year, or in any subsequent year, be moved out of an Area comprising the parishes of Traian-Glas, Glyntawe, Ystradgynlais Higher, and Ystradgynlais Lower, in the administrative county of Brecknock, and the parishes of Llanddeusant, Myddfai, Llangadock, Llandilo Fawr Rural, and Quarter Bach, in the administrative county of Carmarthen, unless such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are at the date when application is made for such licence.

(2.) Unless the Inspector is satisfied (a) that the sheep are to be moved direct to a slaughterhouse for immediate slaughter there, or (b)that the sheep are not sheep that are required to be dipped by the preceding Article, a licence shall not be granted unless the Inspector is satisfied that the sheep have been twice dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep scab or purporting to be so approved, with an interval of not \ less than ten days between the dippings, and since the second dipping have not been permitted to come in contact with other sheep upon lands to which the preceding Article

applies.

 $\overline{(3.)}$ This Article shall not apply to (i.) sheep moved through the said Area by road or by rail if they are not permitted to come in contact with other sheep during the movement through the said Area; or (ii.) sheep moved out of the said Area for the purpose of being dipped on premises outside the Area under and in accordance with the requirements of a Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority served under Article 1 of this Order.
