#### PRESENT,

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 84, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a scheme, bearing date the 28th day of May, in the year 1914, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford, in the city of Oxford, and in the diocese of Oxford, between that benefice and a certain other benefice, namely, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, which said lastnamed benefice is situate partly in the said city of Oxford and partly in the county of Berks, but wholly in the said diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas the Reverend Henry Elliott Fox, of the Croft, Lytton Grove, Putney Hill, in the county of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders and Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, the Very Reverend Henry Wace, Doctor in Divinity, Dean of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of Christ in Canterbury, William Frederick Alphonse Archibald, of the Royal Courts of Justice, London, a Master of Your Majesty's Supreme Court of Judicature, John Francis William Deacon, of Number 20, Birchin Lane, in the city of London, Banker, and the Reverend Henry Hensman Gibbon, of the Red House, Parks Road, in the city of Oxford, Clerk in Holy Orders and Chaplain of Balliol College, Oxford (commonly known as the Oxford Churches Trustees), are the patrons of the said benefice of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford, and also of the said benefice of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, is at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said benefice of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford, has endowments of such an amount that after the charge hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments, the said benefice of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford, will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Oxford, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the new parish of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the endowments of the said benefice of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford, include a yearly sum or stipend of £50 payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, out of the fund created by the first hereinbefore-mentioned Act, which yearly sum or stipend was secured to the said benefice of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford, by an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, dated the 6th day of July, in the year 1865, and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of the same month, and also a sum of £2,133 6s. 8d. Great Northern Railway three pounds per centum per annum stock standing in the name of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in the matter of the said benefice of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford.

"And whereas the said benefice of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford, is now vacant.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Oxford, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), and with the consents of the said Henry Elliott Fox, Henry Wace, William Frederick Alphonse Archibald, John Francis William Deacon, and Henry Hensman Gibbon, acting as the patrons of each of the said two benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and as from the day of the date on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, all the aforesaid yearly sum or stipend of £50 hitherto payable by us, said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, respect of the said benefice of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford, and a portion namely £2,000 of the aforesaid sum of £2,133 6s. 8d. Great Northern Railway three pounds per centum per annum stock also forming part of the endowments of the said benefice of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford, shall be transferred by way of apportionment from the said benefice of Saint Peter le Bailey, Oxford, and shall be annexed to and form part of the endowments of the said benefice of Saint Matthew, Grandpont,

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Oxford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a scheme, bearing date the

11th day of June, in the year 1914, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of West Tarring, in the county of Sussex, and in the diocese of Chichester.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of West Tarring is a cure wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of West Tarring which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district, in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purpose of divine worship.

"And whereas by a certain indenture, bearing date on or about the 8th day of June, in the year 1914, and made, or expressed to be made, under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856,' or some or one of them, between the President and Scholars of the College of Saint Mary Magdalen, in the University of Oxford, of the one part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the other part (which indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice) the said President and Scholars of the College of Saint Mary Magdalen grant and convey unto the Minister of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, so soon as a Minister shall have been appointed, and to his successors, and when such district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore-mentioned Act then to the Incumbent of such new parish, and to his successors for the time being, all those tithe commutation rent charges amounting to £71 14s. 3d., and arising from lands and hereditaments situate in the said proposed district, as and for an endowment for such proposed dis-

"And whereas there has been contributed a sum of £500 perpetual four pounds per centum per annum debenture stock of the London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway, and the same has been transferred into our name to be held by us toward the endowment of the said proposed district, and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforcsaid then of the said new parish, and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of stock to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act.

"And whereas there has also been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at Bank of England a capital sum of £83 6s. 8d. sterling towards the endowment of the said proposed district or new parish (as the case may be, and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, and we have in respect of such sum agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August, and the 1st day of November in each and every year to such Minister or Incumbent as aforesaid, when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before-mentioned Act, the sum of £2 10s. 0d. per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said sum of £500 perpetual four pounds per centum per annum debenture stock of the London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway has been so provided and the said capital sum of £83 6s. 8d. sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore-mentioned Act a capital sum of £583 6s. 8d. sterling in respect of which there should be paid by us to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish, when duly licensed as before-mentioned, a yearly sum of £17 10s. 0d.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of West Tarring have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts, or of some or one of them, and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to grant and annex to the said proposed district or new parish all those tithe commutation rent charges amounting to £95 1s. 5d. belonging to us and arising from lands and hereditaments situate in the said proposed district, and also to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore-mentioned Act a grant of £10 per annum to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish, when duly licensed as aforesaid.

"And whereas the said grant of £583 6s. 8d. sterling, the said grant of the tithe commutation rent charges amounting to £95 ls. 5d. and the said grant of £10 per annum, will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, be made and secured by instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our common seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 111.

"And whereas the said tithe commutation rent charges amounting to £71 14s. 3d. have been granted and conveyed by the President and Scholars of the College of Saint Mary Magdalen, in the University of Oxford, as aforesaid, upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said intended district, and of the nomination of the Incumbent thereto, should be assigned in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said President and

Scholars of the College of Saint Mary Mag-dalen, in the University of Oxford, have nominated the Bishop of Chichester for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said

proposed district or new parish (as the case may be) shall be assigned.
"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles John, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of West Tarring which is described in the schedule hereunder-written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Durrington.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted, and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, then of such new parish, and of the nomination of an Incumbent thereto, shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Charles John, Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester,

and his successors for ever.

And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The district of Durrington, being:-All that part of the parish of West Tarring, in the county of Sussex, and in the diocese of Chichester, which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the ancient township or

chapelry of Durrington."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the said parish of West Tarring out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been ap-

proved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to

direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chichester.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a scheme, bearing date the 11th day of June, in the year 1914, in the words and figures following, that

is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following scheme with respect to the Archdeaconries and Rural Deaneries in the Diocese

of Canterbury.
"Whereas there are within the said Diocese of Canterbury two Archdeaconries, to wit, the Archdeaconry of Canterbury, and the Arch-

deaconry of Maidstone.

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the said Diocese of Canterbury, has represented to us that it is desirable to make certain new arrangements (being the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed) with respect to the said Archdeaconry of Canterbury and to the said Archdeaconry of Maidstone, and to the Rural Deaneries within those Archdeaconries.

"And whereas by an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 31st day of December, in the year 1883, and published in the London Gazette on the 11th day of the following month, certain re-arrangements of the areas of some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Diocese of Canterbury were effected.

And whereas by another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 30th day of July, in the year 1891, and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of the following month, there were effected certain re-arrangements of the areas of the said Archdeaconry of Canterbury, and the said Archdeaconry of Maidstone, and of some of the Rural Deaneries therein.

"And whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the 7th bearing date the 7th day of August, in the year 1905, and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of the same month, certain Rural Deaneries and one separate parish situate in the said Archdeaconry of Maidstone were severed from the

said Diocese of Canterbury, and were included in the Diocese of Rochester.

"And whereas we are of opinion that the new arrangements now proposed by the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, may properly be carried into effect.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he hath to this Scheme set his hand and his archiepiscopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that, as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, each of the said Archdeaconries of Canterbury and Maidstone shall comprise and consist of those Rural Deaneries the names of which are set down in order under its name, and are numbered consecutively in the Sche-

dule to this Scheme annexed, and that every parish or cure or church, the name of which is set down in numbered order under the name of any Rural Deanery in the first column of the said Schedule, shall belong to and be a part of the Rural Deanery, and of the Archdeaconry, under the name of which it so appears as aforesaid, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean and Archdeacon thereof, and shall not any longer belong to, or be a part of, any other Rural Deanery, or of any other Archdeaconry, or be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Rural Dean, or of any other Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, under or by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to approve the several denominations of standards set forth in the Schedule hereto as new denominations of standards, and doth direct that the same, on and after the first day of November, 1914, shall be Board of Trade standards in like manner as if they were mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Weights and Measures Act, 1878.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of Egmanton, in the county of Nottingham, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Egmanton aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

EGMANTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, in the parish of Egmanton, in the county of Nottingham, and in the old churchyard adjoining the same.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 20th day of August next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 20th day of August.

The following STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Christ Church, in the University of Oxford, on the 27th day of June, 1912, and on the 31st day of May, 1913, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

A STATUTE to be substituted for the Existing Statute XVII of Christ Church, in the University of Oxford, dated the 16th day of June, 1881, duly made at stated Meetings of the Governing Body specially summoned for that purpose on the 27th of June, 1912, and on the 31st of May, 1913, and passed at such Meetings by the Votes of two-thirds of the number of Persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

A Statute for Christ Church, made by the House under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

#### STATUTE XVII.

Dr. Lee's Professors and Readers.

- 1. There shall be paid to the holders for the time being of the Lee's Professorship of Anatomy, and the Lee's Professorship of Chemistry, within the University, as and when such Professorships shall respectively be constituted, the yearly sum of £900 each. There shall also be paid to the holder for the time being of the Lee's Professorship of Experimental Philosophy within the University, as and when such Professorship shall be constituted, such a yearly sum as, together with the emoluments derived from the benefaction of Nathaniel Lord Crewe and assigned to his Professorship and the emoluments by the Statutes of Wadham College appropriated to his Professorship, shall amount to the yearly sum of £900.
- 2. The election or appointment to the Lee's Professorships of Anatomy and Chemistry shall be made in each case by a Board of seven persons, of whom one shall be the Dean and one other shall be nominated to hold office for a period of five years by the Governing Body. The election or appointment to the Lee's Professorship of Experimental Philosophy shall be made in accordance with the Statute made for the University concerning the Professor of Experimental Philosophy as amended by the University. Upon the occurrence of any vacancy in any of the Lee's Professorships, it shall be determined by the University, in agreement with the House, what part or parts of the science concerned shall be assigned to the Professorship so falling vacant during the tenure of office of the person next elected
- 3. The sums payable to the Lee's Professors shall be paid out of the general revenues of the House if and so far as the funds available for them from the income of the lands and tenements held under the will of Dr. Matthew Lee shall be found insufficient.

4. Subject to the provisions of these Statutes, the Lee's Professors shall be eligible for election to Studentships, but they shall not be eligible for membership of the Governing Body.

5. From and after the occurrence of the next vacancy in the existing Professorship of Experimental Philosophy within the University there shall be paid out of the general revenues of the House to the holder for the time being of the said Professorship the yearly sum of £600. Such payment shall cease as and when the foregoing provisions of this Statute relating to the Lee's Professorship of Experimental Philosophy shall have come into operation.

6. All sums paid in any year under any of the preceding clauses of this Statute, whether out of the general revenues of the House or out of the income of the lands and tenements held under the will of Dr. Matthew Lee, to any of the Lee's Professors or to the holder for the time being of the existing Professorship of Experimental Philosophy within the University, shall be reckoned against the amount of the contribution due from the House in that year under the provisions of the Statute made for the University concerning College Contri-University Purposes and any butions for amendment thereof from time to time made; and the House shall be chargeable only with the excess (if any) of the amount of its contribution for the year over the amount so paid, provided that there shall be no deduction on this account from the initial contribution to the University of two pounds for every one hundred pounds of net revenue.

- 7. The existing Lee's Readers shall continue to hold their offices on the same terms as if this Statute had not been made, and the foregoing clauses of this Statute shall not come into operation, as respects the Lee's Professorship of Anatomy, until the occurrence of a vacancy in the Lee's Readership in Anatomy, as respects the Lee's Professorship of Chemistry, until the occurrence of a vacancy in the Lee's Readership in Chemistry, and, as respects the Lee's Professorship of Experimental Philosophy, until the occurrence of a vacancy in the Lee's Readership in Physics.
- 8. Upon any vacancy occurring in any of the existing Lee's Readerships, the Governing Body may appoint a qualified person as Reader to give instruction within the House in the branch of science at present assigned to the Readership falling vacant and such other branches of science (if any) as, in the opinion of the Governing Body, can conveniently be combined therewith. The Readers appointed under this clause shall not be more than three in number and shall be known as Dr. Lee's Reader in Chemistry, and Dr. Lee's Reader in Physics respectively.
- 9. Each Lee's Reader shall be appointed for such period and subject to such conditions as to the tenure of his office and the work to be performed by him as the Governing Body shall at the time of his appointment determine, and, subject to the provisions of these Statutes, the Lee's Readers shall be eligible for election to official Studentships.
- 10. The stipend of the Lee's Readers shall, unless they shall have been elected to official Studentships, be such a yearly sum, to be paid out of the general revenues of the House, as the Governing Body shall from time to time determine. Each Lee's Reader shall receive, whether or not he shall have been elected to an official Studentship, a variable sum, to be paid out of the Tuition Fund, which shall depend partly on the length of service and partly on the amount of work required from each Reader. Such last-mentioned sum shall be determined from time to time by the Salaries Board.
- 11. The Governing Body may out of the income of Dr. Lee's foundation, or, if there shall not be sufficient funds available from this source, then out of the Corporate revenue, apply a sum not exceeding £400 in any year to the Laboratory, and other expenses incidental to the teaching of the Lee's Readers.

The Wild Birds Protection (City of Leeds) Order, 1914.

Dated 15th July, 1914.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the city of Leeds, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City of Leeds) Order, 1914."

#### BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the city of Leeds, so far as concerns all Wild Birds except Woodcock, so as to be between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in any year.

The close time for Woodcock is hereby extended so as to be between the 1st day of February and the 12th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the area comprised within the boundaries of the city of Leeds to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Bullfinch, Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough - legged Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffichaff, Corn Crake (Landrail), Spotted Crake, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Turtle Dove, Pintail Duck, Scoter Duck, Tufted Duck, Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Gadwall, Goosander, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Hen Harrier, Marsh

Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Common Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kite, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Alpine Pipit (Water Pipit), Meadow Pipit, Richard's Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Pallas' Sand-grouse, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Redbacked Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Song Thrush, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Twite, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Aquatic Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

The House Sparrow deprived of protection.

IV. The area comprised within the boundaries of the city of Leeds is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the House Sparrow is concerned.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the city of Leeds:—

The Eggs of Scheduled Birds protected.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the Birds named in the Schedule to the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881 (except the Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover), and of those added to the Schedule by Clause III of this Order, is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the city of Leeds.

The taking or destroying of the eggs of the Lapwing, Peewit, or Green Plover is prohibited after April 14th in each year.

- · 2. All persons wishing to leave Lagos by water shall present themselves for medical examination to the Health Officer immediately before embarking and obtain from him a "Health" Certificate in the form in the Schedule hereto.
- 3. Masters of ships shall not accept as passengers or crew any persons who have not previously obtained a "Health" Certificate.
- 4. All launches and lighters shall be thoroughly cleaned and fumigated, and this treatment shall be repeated whenever required by the Health Officer. Any launch or lighter leaving Lagos must carry a certificate to that
- 5. A "Launch" means and includes any river craft or small ship, driven by steam or other mechanical power (other than an open
- 6. No ship shall leave the Port of Lagos before being visited by the Health Officer and obtaining from him a certificate that every one on board is "healthy."
- 7. Every ship from the Port of Lagos on arrival at any port or place in Nigeria shall hoist the yellow flag and anchor at least 1,000 yards from such port or place until visited by the Health Officer or Government Boarding Officer.
- 8. No ship shall approach within 100 yards of any other ship flying the yellow flag nor anchor within 200 yards of it save and except the ship used by the Health Officer or the Government Boarding Officer.
- 9. Masters of all vessels arriving at the Port of Lagos shall be supplied with a copy of this regulation by the Government Boarding Officer and shall give a receipt for the same.
- 10. At least two hours' notice must be given to the Health Officer by the Master or Agent of the pending departure of any ship or launch in order that the necessary inspection may be made.

Animals so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Orders of 1913, as amended by the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1914 (No. 2), except that the animals shall not be moved from the Landing Place and shall be slaughtered therein within ninety-six hours after their landing.

(3.) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine put on board at any port in Ireland other than Cork shall not, after the eighteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and fourteen, be landed at any Landing Place described in the Schedule

hereto.

Special Provision as to Animals Destined for Deptford Landing Place.

2. A vessel conveying animals intended to be landed at the Deptford Landing Place shall not, whilst any of such animals are on board. enter any port in Great Britain other than the Port of London.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

### Offences.

4. If any animal shall be landed or moved in contravention of this Order, or is not slaughtered as hereby required, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing or movement, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not so slaughtered, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed, as the case may be, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
