PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 13th day of July, 1914, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty by Your Order in Council bearing date the 19th day of July, 1912, was pleased to sanction provisional arrangements for the emoluments of

Officers and others serving in the Naval Wing of the Royal Flying Corps:

“And whereas we are of opinion that these arrangements require revision in certain respects:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to sanction the proposals set forth in the accompanying schedule, to take effect as from the 1st July, 1914.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“SCHEDULE.

“I.—OFFICERS.

"3. Commissioned Officers and Warrant Officers while under instruction as Pilots to receive their Air Service pay together with flying pay at the rate of 4s. and 1s. a day respectively.

"4. Officers who do not belong to the Royal Naval Air Service but who may be required to ascend on duty to be granted flying pay as follows for each day of ascent in addition to their Naval Pay:—

"5. Officers not graded in the Corps while under instruction as Observers to be paid an allowance of 3s. a day for each day of ascent instead of flying pay at the above rate.

"6. An Officer appointed to the Royal Naval Air Service who has obtained or subsequently obtains the airship or aeroplane pilot's certificate of the Royal Aero Club at his own expense to be refunded the sum of £75 or such lesser sum as may have been actually charged for tuition, after such period of probation as may be determined. Should an Officer resign or retire within four years of the date on which he was selected, he will be liable to refund this sum, less one quarter for each completed year of service.

"7. Officers entered from civil life (including Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve or Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve) to be granted an outfit allowance of £40, payable under such conditions as we may determine, and subject to the Officer being required to refund if the Admiralty so decide one fourth of this sum for each year or part of a year that

the Officer's service falls short of four years. In the case of Officers entered from the Royal Naval Reserve or Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve this allowance may be reduced by the amount of any similar allowance already paid, within the last three years.

"8. Officers entered from civil life (including Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve and the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve) to receive gratuities at the rate of £150 for each completed year of service, including the probationary period, on the expiration of their active service. An Officer retired at his own request, or for physical unfitness due to causes beyond his own control, may be awarded such gratuity as we think fit, not exceeding £150 for each completed year of service (including probationary service).

"9. Service of Naval Officers in the Royal Naval Air Service (not including the Reserve) to count in all respects as service in a ship of war at sea.

"10. Officers required to join a Military Mess to receive a Messing Allowance of 2s. a day, but this allowance not to be payable to Probationary Flight Sub-Lieutenants.

"11. Officers who are not graded in the Naval Air Service and who may be employed on meteorological duties at Royal Naval Air Stations to be granted an allowance of 2s. a day.

"12. Injury pensions and gratuities to Officers of the Royal Naval Air Service, widows' pensions and compassionate allowances to children and dependent relatives of the Royal Naval Air Service to be awarded on the scales and under the conditions applicable to Officers of the corresponding rank in the Military Branch, unless in cases where the substantive rank of Officers in their original branch is higher than that which they are granted in the Royal Naval Air Service, in which cases pensions, &c., if more advantageous to these Officers or their dependent relatives to be based on the original rank of such Officers, all such awards in respect of injury or death on flying duty to be subject to the general conditions specified in clauses (8) and (9) of Your Order in Council of the 19th July, 1912. For all the purposes of this section service as Probationary Flight Sub-Lieutenant to count as commissioned service.

"2. Men who qualify as Pilots to be eligible for additional pay at the rate of 4s. or 2s. a day according to whether they hold first or second class flying certificates.

"3. Men qualified and employed as Pilots of Airships to receive Airship Coxswain allowance at the rate of 4s. a day while so employed.

"4. Men qualified and employed as crews of Airships to receive an allowance at the rate of 2s. a day while so employed.

"5. Men who do not belong to the Royal Naval Air Service but who may be required to ascend on duty to be granted flying pay at the rate of 2s. a day for each day of ascent.

"6. Men under instruction for Pilot to receive flying pay at the rate of 1s. a day in addition to their Air Service pay.

"7. Men to be eligible for good conduct pay and re-engaged pay under Naval regulations.

"8. Men of the Seaman Class below the rating of Petty Officer on reverting to the Fleet from the Royal Naval Air Service to be given at Admiralty discretion the non-substantive rating (A) with pay of 3d. a day, until they have qualified or re-qualified as Seaman Gunner or Seaman Torpedoman, but this non-substantive rating not to be allowed for more than two years.

"9. In the event of a man being granted permission to obtain an Aero Club Certificate at his own expense, he may be refunded the sum of £75, or such less sum as may have been actually charged for tuition, under the conditions applicable in the case of Officers.

"III.—GENERAL.

"In the case of illness or accident Officers or Men to continue to receive their Air Service pay under the same regulations as Naval Pay."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS His Majesty the King has power and jurisdiction in the territories of South Africa known as Northern Rhodesia:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by

and, with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I.—This Order may be cited as "The Northern Rhodesia Naturalisation Order in Council, 1914."

II.—In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Northern Rhodesia" means the territory for the time being within the limits of the Northern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1911.

"The Administrator" includes an acting Administrator.

"The Gazette" means any Official Gazette published in Northern Rhodesia.

III.—An alien may in Northern Rhodesia purchase, acquire, own or dispose of movable or immovable property of any description in like manner as natural-born subjects of His Majesty. Provided that this section shall not qualify an alien for any office or franchise which such alien does not now by law possess, nor entitle an alien to any right or privilege except such rights and privileges as are hereby expressly given to him.

IV.—(1) An alien who, within such limited time before making the application hereinafter mentioned as may be allowed by the Administrator, either by general order, or on any special occasion, has resided in Northern Rhodesia, for a term of not less than twelve months, and intends if such application be granted to continue to reside in Northern Rhodesia may apply to the Administrator for letters of naturalisation in the form provided in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) The applicant shall adduce in support of his application such evidence of his residence and intention to continue to reside and of the matters set forth in the said schedule as the Administrator may require, and shall furnish proof to the satisfaction of the Administrator that notice of his intention to apply for letters of naturalisation has been published in two issues of the Gazette.

(3) The Administrator, if satisfied with the evidence adduced, shall take the case of the applicant into consideration, and may, with or without assigning any reason, give or withhold letters of naturalisation as he thinks most conducive to the public good, and no appeal shall lie from his decision, but such letters of naturalisation shall not take effect until the applicant has made a declaration of allegiance to His Majesty as hereinafter provided.

V.—Any person resident in Northern Rhodesia who has previously obtained a certificate of naturalisation as a British subject elsewhere than in Northern Rhodesia, may, notwithstanding that he has not resided within Northern Rhodesia for a period not less than twelve months prior to the date of his application, submit such certificate and make an application to the Administrator stating that:—

(a) He is the person named in such certificate.

(b) That the certificate has been obtained without any fraud or intentionally false statement.

(c) That the signature and seal (if any) thereto are, to the best of his knowledge and belief, genuine.

(d) That he intends, if naturalised, to reside in Northern Rhodesia, and shall

adduce in support of his application such evidence concerning the matters aforesaid and concerning the matters set forth in the First Schedule hereto as the Administrator may require. The Administrator, if satisfied with the evidence adduced, shall take the case of the applicant into consideration, and may, with or without assigning any reason, give or withhold letters of naturalisation as he thinks most conducive to the public good, and no appeal shall lie from his decision, but such letters of naturalisation shall not take effect until the applicant has made a declaration of allegiance to His Majesty as hereinafter provided.

VI.—Every alien to whom the Administrator may grant letters of naturalisation shall before the delivery of such letters to him make and subscribe before a Magistrate a declaration of allegiance in the form contained in the Second Schedule hereto, which declaration shall be of the same force and effect as an oath of allegiance.

VII.—An alien to whom letters of naturalisation have been granted shall in Northern Rhodesia be entitled to all political and other rights, powers, and privileges, and be subject to all obligations to which a natural-born British subject is entitled or subject in Northern Rhodesia.

VIII.—(1) A married woman shall in Northern Rhodesia be deemed to be a subject of the State of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

(2) The following persons shall be deemed and taken to be naturalised, and shall have all the rights, privileges, and obligations in Northern Rhodesia of natural-born subjects of His Majesty:—

(a) Any alien woman who is already or who shall hereafter be married to any person who shall be or become naturalised under this Order.

(b) Where the father or the mother (being a widow) shall be or become naturalised under this Order any child of such father or mother who during infancy shall be or become resident with such father or mother in Northern Rhodesia.

IX.—A return of persons to whom letters of naturalisation shall have been granted under this Order shall be published in the Gazette half-yearly, in the months of January and July, and such return shall show:—

- (1) Names of such persons in full.
- (2) Their birthplace.
- (3) Nationality prior to grant of letters of naturalisation.
- (4) Occupation.
- (5) Residence in Northern Rhodesia.
- (6) Date of issue of letters of naturalisation.

X.—If any person shall wilfully make any false statement in any application made under the provisions of this Order for the purpose of obtaining letters of naturalisation, he shall, upon conviction, incur the same penalties as are by law provided against persons convicted of wilful and corrupt perjury, and in case letters of naturalisation shall have been granted such letters shall be void.

XI.—Every person obtaining letters of naturalisation under this Order shall pay for the same a fee, to be collected by means of stamps, of one pound.

XII.—The Administrator shall cause a register to be made and kept of all letters of naturalisation granted under this Order, and shall, upon the application of any person, and upon payment of a fee of one shilling in respect of every name, permit a search to be made for the name of any person upon, or supposed to be upon, the register.

A certificate under the hand of the Administrator attesting the fact of the issue of letters of naturalisation to any person whose name appears upon the said register may, at the discretion of the Administrator, be issued upon payment, by means of stamps, of a fee of five shillings. Every such certificate shall be received as evidence of the facts therein stated.

XIII.—Every letter of naturalisation and every such certificate as aforesaid, shall be admissible in evidence without proof of the signature or seal attesting the same, and shall be *prima facie* evidence of the person named therein being duly naturalised, and of the signature or seal attesting the same, and of the official character of the persons appearing to have signed the same.

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)
AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1914 (No. 20).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Landing of Animals for Slaughter within certain Landing Places.

1. (1.) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine put on board at any port in Ireland which is mentioned in the First Schedule hereto may, on and after the twenty-fourth day of July, nineteen hundred and fourteen, be landed at any Landing Place or part thereof described in the Second Schedule hereto, but only for the purpose of slaughter within the Landing Place, and subject to the following provisions.

(2.) The landing of any animals under this Order must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the Landing Place.

(3.) Animals so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Orders of 1913, except that the animals shall not be moved from the Landing Place, and shall be slaughtered therein within ninety-six hours after their landing.

Special Provision as to Animals Destined for Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place.

2. Animals, if intended to be landed at the Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place under this Order, shall not be carried through the Eastham lock until they have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Board, and unless and until the Inspector certifies that his examination and information do not show that there is, or during the voyage has been, an animal on board affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

Offences.

3. If any animal shall be moved in contravention of this Order, or is not slaughtered as hereby required, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the Landing Place, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not so slaughtered, as the case may be, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or faults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1914 (No. 20).

Isle of Man,
to Wit.

WHEREAS, by section 2 of the Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1865, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, by an order in writing, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Isle of cattle, horses, sheep or other animals for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of preventing the introduction of any infectious or contagious disease among cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals in this Isle:

And whereas the infectious disease commonly called "Foot-and-Mouth Disease" prevails amongst animals in certain places in Ireland.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, do hereby order that, from and after this date, and until further orders, no animal shall be imported into this Island from Ireland.

In this Order the expression "animal" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, sheep, swine or goat.

This Order may be cited as "The Importation of Animals (Ireland) Order, No. 2, 1914."
