DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS
ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Extension of the Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1910 to an Additional Destructive Insect.

1. The Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1910 shall have effect as if the destructive insect mentioned in the Schedule to this Order were mentioned in the Schedule to that Order.

Notification of Order.

2. This Order shall be published by the Local Authority in accordance with any direction given by the Board.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ORDER OF 1914.

BY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR.

A PROCLAMATION.

Isle of Man,
to Wit.

WHEREAS, by section 2 of the Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1865, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, by an order in writing, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Isle of cattle, horses, sheep or other animals for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of preventing the introduction of any infectious or contagious disease among cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals in this Isle:

And whereas the infectious disease commonly called "Foot-and-Mouth Disease" prevails amongst animals in certain places in Ireland.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, do hereby order that, from and after this date, and until further orders, no animal shall be imported into this Island from Ireland.

In this Order the expression "animal" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, sheep, swine or goat.

This Order may be cited as "The Importation of Animals (Ireland) Order, No. 2, 1914."
