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Madrid, June 25. Since the taking of Roles the Duke de Medina Sidonia, Viceroy of Catalonia, has put 5000 Men into Gironne; and Orders are given for tailing 4000 Horfe, and several thousand Foot, to reinforce our Army on that fide; The Grandees are obliged to surnish each 6 Horsenen well mounted; The ancient Noblemen are to surnish each four; and those who have new Ticles two; The Town of Madrid has offered to raise 1000 Foot Soldiers at their own charge, Toledo 500, Segovia 500, the Duke d'Aueiro raises 100, the Cardinal de Toledo sumishes 50 Men, and 6000 Dubloins in Money; The Members of the Councils are raxed according to their several Degrees, as are also all other Persons of Quality; so that in a short time we shall have a very considerable Army together. The French Fleet was by our last advice still in the Bay of Lagor, expecting their Tuelor Squadron, which has not yet passed the Streights that we hear of

hear of.

Turin; June 23: The Duke of Savoy came hither on the 19th from Quiers, and has fince held a Council of War, at which General Caprara, and all the other General Officers of the Emperor's Forces in Piedmont, were prefent. The Troops of the Milaneze are marching to our Camp at Bariajque; Several Hundred Men are lately arrived from Gormany to ferve as Recruits for the Imperial

Regiments. The French have made an Incursion into the Valley of Bareelonette, but were bearen back with loss. Vienns, July 1. There happened two days ago a Rencounter between 800 German, and 2000 French Horse; The former were sent out to observe the Enemy, and passing a hellow way near Zwingsberg, were surprised by the French, who lay in Ambuscate, 1.2 ving had notice of their Coming; Major General Brus, who commanded the German Party, with 40 or 50 of his Men were killed; However they maintained the Pass of Zwingsberg, with the help of some Succors that came up to them, and forced the Enemy to reire. The Elector of Saxony went yesterday to the Army; If the French do stand their Ground, it will soon come to a Barde.

to attack the French Lines, and upon occasion they may be reinforced by feveral Battalions more from the Neighbouring Garifons; The same day 13 Battalions from Liege and Maestrichs came to our Camp in the room of those which marched out in the morning. The Rains continue still. The French Army remains in the same Camp, where, as we are assured, they are in great want of Provisions, and their Soldiers very fickly. News is just now come from Germany, that Prince Lewis of Baden's Army was advanced within a mile of the Mareschal de Lorge, with a resolution to fight him.

Hague, July 14. The Court of Justice of Holland have determined the Butiness of the Sieurs Allewyn, which they will communicate to the States Provincial to morrow, and then the Sentence will be made publick. We have an account from Amsterdam, that some Merchants there had received Advice, that the English and Dutch Streights Fleet had put into the River of Liston. The Ministers of Denmark and Sweden have had another Conference with the Deputies of the States-General about some Ships taken and brought in by the Dutch Privateers.
