To pay in priority to other debts all those directed to be so paid in the distribution of the property of a bankrupt out of moneys receivable hereunder. 2. Payment of all proper costs, charges, and expenses of and incident to the proceedings, this proposal, the remuneration of the trustee, and premiums for policy of insurance as hereafter out of money receivable under clause 4 hereof. 3. All fees and percentages payable to the Official Receiver and the Board of Trade to be secured by necessary deposit therefor with the Official Receiver prior to the application to Court to approve this proposal. 4. Payment of 20s. in the pound on all unsecured debts provable herein provided for: (a) Property divisible amongst the creditors (if debtor adjudged bankrupt) with exception of household furniture and effects to vest in Frederick Seymour Salaman, Chartered Accountant, 1-2, Bucklersbury, E.C., as trustee, who shall realise and administer the same under the provisions of the Act. (b) Set aside when due one half of salary of £700 per annum, and similar proportion of any increase thereof, first payment 15th July, 1914. (c) Subject to payments in clauses 1 and 2 hereof, proceeds under (a) and (b) to be applied in payment to unsecured creditors of 20s. in the pound on their debts. 5. Five creditors whose debts amount to £1,494 15s. 10d. absolutely release the debtor and his estate from such debts. 6. Prior to application to Court for approval hereof policy of insurance for £500 on debtor's life to be released and assigned to trustee as security for due performance of terms of this proposal. Trustee to pay the premiums out of money receivable herein. 7. Debtor submits to order under which Paymaster-General pays to the trustee the proportions of salary and increase for application as aforesaid. 8. The trustee aforesaid to receive as remuneration 5 per cent. upon the amount realised by him. Receiving Order discharged
