A PROCLAMATION

MODIFYING THE PROCLAMATIONS OF THE 3RD, THE 5TH, AND THE 10TH AUGUST, 1914
RELATING TO THE EXPORTATION OF CERTAIN WARLIKE STORES, PROVISIONS AND VICTUAL.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by the 8th Section of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," it is enacted that We may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, prohibit the exportation of arms, ammunition and gunpowder, military and naval stores, and any articles which We shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military or naval stores, provisions, or any sort of victual, which may be used as food for men:

AND WHEREAS by the first Section of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," it is enacted that We may, by Proclamation, prohibit the exportation of arms, ammunition military or naval stores, and any article which We shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of arms, ammunition, or military or naval stores, to any country or place therein named, whenever We shall judge such prohibition to be expedient in order to prevent such arms, ammunition, military or naval stores, being used against Our subjects or forces, or against any forces engaged or which may be engaged in military or naval operations in co-operation with Our forces:

AND WHEREAS by Our Proclamations dated the 3rd August, 1914, the 5th August, 1914, and the 10th August, 1914, effect was given to the provisions of the above recited sections of the said Acts of Parliament by the prohibition of the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain military and naval stores and other articles as therein set forth:

AND WHEREAS We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, now deem it expedient that the exportation of the articles mentioned in that one of Our Proclamations dated the 5th August, 1914, made under the first section of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," shall no longer be prohibited to the Ports of Belgium, and also that the lists of articles of which the exportation is prohibited in the said Proclamation dated the 3rd August, 1914, in the said Proclamation dated the 5th August, 1914, made under the first section of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," and in the said Proclamation dated the 10th August, 1914, shall be modified, both by way of addition to and deletion from the lists of articles therein mentioned:

Now, We, by and with the advice aforesaid, do hereby order and direct that from and after the date hereof the prohibitions published in the aforesaid Proclamations shall be read as subject to the modifications shown in the First Schedule hereunto appended, and that from and after the 30th August, 1914, the said prohibitions shall be read as subject also to the further modifications shown in the Second Schedule hereunto appended.

First Schedule.—To take effect forthwith.

Proclamation of the 5th August, 1914.—List of articles of which the exportation is prohibited from the United Kingdom to all foreign ports in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Sea, with the exception of those of France, Russia (except the Baltic Ports), Spain and Portugal.

Add to the list of Ports excepted from the prohibition:—

The Ports of Belgium.

Delete from the list of articles:—

Coal, steam, large;
Fuel, manufactured;
Nitrates of sodium;
Tin plates.

Proclamation of the 10th August, 1914.—List of articles of which the exportation is prohibited from the United Kingdom.

Delete from the list of articles:—

Lead in all forms.

Add to the list of articles:—

Lead, pig, sheet or pipe.

Substitute for the list of provisions and victual which may be used as food for men prohibited to be exported the following list:—

Wheat and wheat flour;
Barley and oats;
Animals, living, for food;
Butter;
Margarine;
Cheese;
Eggs;
Sugar, unrefined;
Sugar, refined and candy;
Molasses and invert sugar;
Jams and marmalades;
Milk, condensed, sweetened or not.

Second Schedule.—To take effect from the 30th August, 1914.

Proclamation of the 3rd August, 1914.—List of articles of which the exportation is prohibited from the United Kingdom.

Delete from the list of articles:—

Creosote;
Engines and lorries, internal combustion, capable of carrying a load of 25 cwt. and upwards, whole or in parts.

WHEREAS by the Aliens Restriction Orders, 1914, His Majesty has been pleased to impose restrictions upon aliens, and to make various provisions for carrying those restrictions into effect:

And whereas it is desirable to extend the said Orders in manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Restriction on Circulation of Newspapers amongst Alien Enemies.

1. The following Article shall be inserted after Article 23 of the Aliens Restriction Order, 1914:—

Restriction with respect to Newspapers.

23A.—(1) The circulation among alien enemies of any newspaper wholly or mainly in the language of a state, or any part of a state, at war with His Majesty is prohibited, unless

the permission in writing of a Secretary of State has been first obtained, and such conditions as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State are complied with.

(2) Any person publishing any newspaper for circulation in contravention of this Order shall be deemed to have acted in contravention of this Order, and where a Secretary of State is satisfied that any newspaper has been, or is about to be, published for circulation in contravention of this Order, he may authorize such persons as he thinks fit to enter, if needs be by force, any premises, and to seize any copies of the newspaper found thereon, and also any type or other plant used or capable of being used for the printing or production of the newspaper, and to deal with any articles so seized in such manner as the Secretary of State may direct.

(3) In this Article the expression "newspaper" includes periodical.

2. This Order may be cited as the Aliens Restriction (No. 4) Order, 1914, and shall be construed as one with the Aliens Restriction Orders, 1914, and may be cited with those Orders as the Aliens Restriction Orders, 1914.

WHEREAS on the fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, a state of war came into existence between this country and the German Empire.

And whereas by His Majesty's Order in Council of the fifth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, the issue of a Commission was ordered authorizing the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral to require His Majesty's High Court of Justice to take cognizance of prize matters arising out of the said war.

And whereas a state of war now also exists between this country and the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary, so that His Majesty's fleets and ships may lawfully seize all ships, vessels, and goods belonging to the said Dual Monarchy, or the citizens and subjects thereof, or other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of the said Dual Monarchy, and bring the same to judgment in such Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions, Possessions, or Colonies as shall be duly commissioned to take cognizance thereof.

His Majesty is therefore pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that a Commission in the form of the draft annexed hereto shall issue under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom authorizing the said Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral to will and require His Majesty's High Court of Justice and the Judges thereof to take cognizance of and judicially proceed upon all and all manner of captures, seizures, prizes, and reprisals of all ships, vessels, and goods that are or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the same; and according to the course of Admiralty and

the Law of Nations, and the Statutes, Rules, and Regulations for the time being in force in that behalf, to adjudge and condemn all such ships, vessels, and goods as shall belong to the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary, or the citizens or subjects thereof, or to any other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of the said Dual Monarchy as well as the ships, vessels, and goods belonging to the German Empire or to the citizens or subjects thereof or to any other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of the said German Empire.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to Our right trusty and well-beloved Right Honourable Winston Leonard Spencer-Churchill, M.P., Admiral H.S.H. Prince Louis Alexander of Battenberg, G.C.B., G.C.V.O., K.C.M.G., A.D.C., Vice-Admiral Sir Frederick Tower Hamilton, K.C.B., C.V.O., Rear-Admiral Archibald Gordon Henry Wilson Moore, C.V.O., C.B., Captain Cecil Foley Lambert, R.N., the Right Honourable George Lambert, M.P., and the Right Honourable Sir Francis John Stephens Hopwood, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., Our Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Dominions thereunto belonging, and to Our Commissioners for executing that Office for the time being, Greeting:

Whereas on the fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, a state of war came into existence between this country and the German Empire.

And whereas by Our Commission under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, dated the sixth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, We did authorize and enjoin you, Our said Commissioners, to require Our High Court of Justice to take cognizance of prize matters arising out of the said war.

And whereas a state of war now also exists between this country and the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary, so that Our fleets and ships may lawfully seize all ships, vessels, and goods belonging to the said Dual Monarchy or the citizens and subjects thereof, or other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of the said Dual Monarchy and bring the same to judgment in such Courts of Admiralty within Our Dominions, Possessions, or Colonies as shall be duly commissioned to take cognizance thereof.

These are therefore to authorize, and We do hereby authorize and enjoin you, Our said Commissioners, now and for the time being, or any two or more of you, in addition to and in extension of the Warrant already given by you under Our said Commission of the sixth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, to will and require Our High Court of Justice and the Judges thereof, and the said High Court and the Judges thereof are hereby authorized and required to take cognizance of

and judicially to proceed upon all and all manner of captures, seizures, prizes, and reprisals of all ships, vessels, and goods already seized and taken, and which hereafter shall be seized and taken, and to hear and determine the same, and according to the course of Admiralty and the Law of Nations, and the Statutes, Rules and Regulations for the time being in force in that behalf, to adjudge and condemn all such ships, vessels, and goods as shall belong to the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary or to the citizens or subjects thereof or to any other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories or dominions of the said Dual Monarchy, as well as the ships, vessels, and goods belonging to the German Empire or to the citizens or subjects thereof or to any other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of the said German Empire.

In witness whereof, We have caused the Great Seal of the United Kingdom to be put and affixed to these presents.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this twentieth day of August, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and in the fifth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of August, 1914, in the words following, viz. :—

“ WHEREAS it is provided in Section 6 of the Indian Marine Service Act, 1884, that in case a state of War exists between Your Majesty and any foreign power, it shall be lawful for Your Majesty by Proclamation or Order in Council to direct that any vessel belonging to Your Majesty's Indian Marine Service and the Men and Officers from time to time serving thereon shall be under the command of the Senior Naval Officer of the Station where for the time being such ships may be :

“ And whereas it is provided that while any such vessel is under such command, such vessel shall be deemed to all intents a vessel of war of the Royal Navy, and the Men and Officers from time to time serving in such vessels shall be under such Naval Discipline Act or Acts as may be in force for the time being, and subject to such Regulations as may be issued by Us with the concurrence of the Secretary of State for India in Council :

“ And whereas a state of War exists between Your Majesty and the German Emperor :

“ And whereas the Government of Your Majesty in India has agreed to place unreservedly at the disposal of the Naval Commander-in-Chief on the East Indies Station Your Majesty's Indian Marine Service Vessel ‘ Dalhousie ’ :

“ Now, therefore, We beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to direct that Your Majesty's Indian Marine Service Vessel ‘ Dalhousie ’ and the Men and Officers from time to time serving thereon shall be under the command of the Senior Naval Officer of the Station where for the time being such ship may be.

“ The Secretary of State for India in Council has signified his concurrence in these proposals.”

HIS MAJESTY, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of "The Bishopricks Act, 1878," and the "Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913," duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 16th day of July, in the year 1914, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Bishopricks Act, 1878, and the Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and for the re-arrangement of the boundaries of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and of the contiguous Dioceses of Ely and Norwich, and of the patronage of the Bishops of the said Dioceses.

"Whereas by the 7th section of the said Bishopricks Act, 1878, it is enacted that whenever the certificate therein referred to shall have been given to Your Majesty by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with respect to the endowment fund of any new Bishoprick mentioned in the Schedule to the said Act, we shall lay before Your Majesty in Council a Scheme for all or any of the matters in relation to such new Bishoprick which in the same section are mentioned.

"And whereas by the 1st section of the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, it is enacted that, subject to the modifications set forth in the First Schedule to the same Act, the said Bishopricks Act, 1878, including the repealed portions thereof, shall have effect for the purpose of the foundation of the new Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, as if the Second Schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, were substituted for the Schedule to the said Bishopricks Act, 1878, and as if the last-mentioned Act had become law on the date on which the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, was passed.

"And whereas the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich is one of the Bishopricks mentioned in the said Second Schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, and the said certificate was given by us with respect to the endowment fund of the said Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich on the 15th day of January, 1914, and thereupon by an Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 21st day of the same month, made in pursuance of the said Acts, and reciting that such certificate had been so given as aforesaid, which Order was published in the *London Gazette* on the 23rd day of the same month and came into operation on the day of the date of such publication, (1) the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich was founded, (2) the Diocese of the said Bishoprick was declared

to consist (subject to the provisions contained in the First Schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, as to re-arrangement of boundaries) of the Administrative Counties of East Suffolk and West Suffolk, (3) the Parish Church of St. James, Bury Saint Edmunds, in the County of Suffolk (subject to the rights of the Patron and Incumbent thereof) was declared to be the Cathedral Church of the said Bishoprick, and (4) the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich was constituted a body corporate, and was invested with all such rights, privileges, and jurisdictions, as are possessed by any other Bishop in England and was subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Canterbury.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely, the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, the Right Reverend Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans, and the Right Reverend Henry Bernard, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, do (so far as their respective consents are necessary) consent to this Scheme, and the several recommendations hereinafter contained, in testimony whereof they have respectively hereto set their hands and episcopal seals.

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose as follows, namely:—

"1. The boundaries of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and of the contiguous Dioceses of Ely and Norwich, shall be re-arranged as follows:—

"(i) the County Borough of Ipswich, which lies within the ambit of the Administrative County of East Suffolk, shall be included in and form part of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and shall be deemed to have been included in and to have formed part of the said Diocese on and from the date of the foundation of the said Diocese as aforesaid.

"(ii) the Rural Deanery of Lothingland (in the Archdeaconry of Suffolk) and the parts of the united Parishes of Brettenham-with-Rushford and of Riddlesworth-with-Gas-thorpe and Knettishall (in the Archdeaconry of Norfolk), which are situate in the Administrative County of West Suffolk, shall be severed from the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and shall be included in and form part of the Diocese of Norwich.

"(iii) the part of the Parish of Mendham (in the Archdeaconry of Suffolk) which is situate in the County of Norfolk, and the whole of the Parish of Santon (in the Archdeaconry of Lynn), shall be severed from the Diocese of Norwich and shall be included in and form part of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"(iv) the parts of the Parishes of Exning with Landwade and of All Saints, Newmarket, (in the Archdeaconry of Sudbury), which are situate in the County of Cambridge, shall be severed from the Diocese of Ely and shall be included in and form part of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"(v) the parts of the Parishes of Wood-diton (in the Archdeaconry of Sudbury), and of Saint Peter, Prickwillow, (in the Archdeaconry of the Isle of Ely), which are situate in the Administrative County of West Suffolk, shall be severed from the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and shall be in-

cluded in and form part of the Diocese of Ely.

"(vi) the Rural Deanery of Fincham (in the Archdeaconry of Lynn), the Parishes of Saint Mary with Saint Nicholas, Feltwell, Hockwold cum Wilton, Methwold, Northwold, All Saints with Saint Mary Weeting, and the New Parish of Whittington (now in the Rural Deanery of Cranwich and in the Archdeaconry of Lynn), and the Rural Deanery of Lynn Marshland (in the Archdeaconry of Lynn), with the exception of the Parishes of North Lynn with Saint Margaret and Saint Nicholas, All Saints, Lynn, West Lynn, and the New Parish of Saint John, Lynn, shall be severed from the Diocese of Norwich and shall be included in and form part of the Diocese of Ely.

"2. The Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being shall, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, have all such Courts and Officers and all such jurisdiction as were immediately before the said date of the publication in the London Gazette of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 21st day of January, 1914, or are at present possessed by the Bishop of Ely or the Bishop of Norwich within the area of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich as hereinbefore defined.

"3. All Parishes, Ecclesiastical Districts, and other Cures and Places, Churches and Chapels, and all the Clergy and others Your Majesty's subjects within the territories which by virtue of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 21st day of January, 1914, or of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, have been or shall be severed from either of the Dioceses of Ely or Norwich and now constitute the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, or shall be included therein or in either of the said Dioceses of Ely and Norwich, shall be exempted and released from all episcopal jurisdiction, authority, and control, of the Bishop of the Diocese in which the same were situate immediately before such severance and shall be under and subject to the episcopal jurisdiction, authority, and control, of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, or other the Bishop of the Diocese in which such territories now are or shall be so included as aforesaid, and of the successors of such Bishop.

"4. Until a Dean and Chapter of and for the Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall have been created, the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich may, as to any and every matter with respect to which the confirmation or other agency of a Dean and Chapter is by law required for rendering effectual the action of a Bishop, take action in such matter without such confirmation or agency, and his action so taken shall not for want of such confirmation or agency be ineffectual or invalid.

"5. During any and every vacancy in the See of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, whether such vacancy shall happen before or after the creation of a Dean and Chapter of and for the Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being shall have the custody and be Guardian of the Spiritualities of the See of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"6. The archidiaconal supervision of all the

Parishes, Ecclesiastical Districts, and other Cures and Places comprised within the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and the Archdeaconries respectively of Suffolk and Sudbury, shall remain or become vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacons of those Archdeaconries respectively, and the said Archdeacons shall be Officers of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and shall not be subject to the episcopal jurisdiction of the Bishop of Norwich or the Bishop of Ely, but shall be exclusively subject to the episcopal jurisdiction of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and the archidiaconal dignities of the said Archdeacons shall be transferred from the Cathedral Churches of Norwich and Ely respectively to the Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and all the endowments belonging to the said Archdeaconries respectively shall continue to belong to the same notwithstanding the transfer of the said Archdeaconries from the Dioceses of Norwich and Ely respectively to the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, Provided always that the transfer of the archidiaconal dignity of the Archdeacon of Sudbury to the Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall take effect only upon the next vacation of the said Archdeaconry, or the vacation by the present Archdeacon of Sudbury of the Canonry in Ely Cathedral now held by him, whichever event may first happen.

"7. The archidiaconal supervision of the Rural Deanery of Lothingland (hereinbefore recommended to be included in the Diocese of Norwich) shall become vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Norwich, the archidiaconal supervision of the united Parishes of Brettenham-with-Rushford and of Riddlesworth-with-Gasthorpe and Knettishall (hereinbefore recommended to be wholly included in the Diocese of Norwich) shall remain vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Norfolk, and the said united Parishes of Brettenham-with-Rushford and of Riddlesworth-with-Gasthorpe and Knettishall shall continue to be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Rockland; the Parishes of Saint Mary with Saint Nicholas, Feltwell, Hockwold-cum-Wilton, Methwold, Northwold, All Saints with Saint Mary Weeting, and the New Parish of Whittington (hereinbefore recommended to be included in the Diocese of Ely) shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Fincham, and the said Rural Deanery of Fincham and the Rural Deanery of Lynn Marshland (also hereinbefore recommended to be included in the Diocese of Ely) shall be included in and form part of the Archdeaconry of the Isle of Ely; the archidiaconal supervision of the Parishes of North Lynn with Saint Margaret and Saint Nicholas, All Saints, Lynn, West Lynn, and the New Parish of Saint John, Lynn, (being the Parishes in the Rural Deanery of Lynn Marshland which remain in the Diocese of Norwich after the transfer hereinbefore recommended of such Rural Deanery to the Diocese of Ely) shall remain vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Lynn, and the said Parishes of North Lynn with Saint Margaret and Saint Nicholas, All Saints, Lynn,

West Lynn, and the New Parish of Saint John, Lynn, shall be detached from the Rural Deanery of Lynn Marshland and shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Lynn Norfolk; the archidiaconal supervision of the Parish of Mendham (hereinbefore recommended to be wholly included in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich) shall remain vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Suffolk, and the said Parish of Mendham shall continue to be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Hoxne; the archidiaconal supervision of the Parish of Santon (also hereinbefore recommended to be included in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich) shall become vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Sudbury, and the said Parish of Santon shall be detached from the Rural Deanery of Cranwich and shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Mildenhall; the archidiaconal supervision of the Parishes of Exning with Landwade and of All Saints, Newmarket, (hereinbefore recommended to be wholly included in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich) shall remain vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Sudbury, and the said Parishes of Exning with Landwade and of All Saints, Newmarket, together with the Parish of Saint Mary, Newmarket, shall be detached from the Rural Deanery of Fordham and shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Thurlow; the archidiaconal supervision of the Rural Deanery of Fordham, which remains in the Diocese of Ely, shall become vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Ely, and the Parishes of Isleham, Chippenham, Kennett, Ashley-cum-Silverley, Cheveley and Kirtling, which also remain in the Diocese of Ely, shall be included in and form part of the said Rural Deanery of Fordham, and the Parish of Woodditton (hereinbefore recommended to be wholly included in the Diocese of Ely) shall continue to be included in and form part of the said Rural Deanery of Fordham; the Parish of Saint Peter, Prickwillow, (also hereinbefore recommended to be wholly included in the Diocese of Ely) shall continue to be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Ely.

"8. The patronage of every Ecclesiastical Dignity or Benefice, being within the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich as rearranged by this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, of which Dignity or Benefice the patronage is now vested for any estate or interest in the Bishop of Ely, or the Bishop of Norwich, in right of his See, shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be forthwith to the extent of the estate or interest therein now vested in or belonging to the Bishop of Ely, or the Bishop of Norwich, as aforesaid, transferred from the said Bishop of Ely, or Bishop of Norwich, as the case may be, to, and shall become and be vested in, the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and his successors.

"9. The patronage of every Ecclesiastical Benefice, being within that portion of the Diocese of Norwich which is hereinbefore

recommended to be transferred to the Diocese of Ely, of which Dignity or Benefice the patronage is now vested for any estate or interest in the Bishop of Norwich in right of his See, shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be forthwith to the extent of the estate or interest therein now vested in or belonging to the Bishop of Norwich, as aforesaid, transferred from the said Bishop of Norwich to, and shall become and be vested in, the Bishop of Ely and his successors.

"10. The portion of the endowment or income of the Bishoprick of Ely which is mentioned in Part III of the second Schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913 (that is to say such portion of the endowment or income of the Bishoprick of Ely as will produce or amount to the sum of £750 per annum together with a moiety of the proceeds of sale of the episcopal residence attached to the said Bishoprick of Ely, situate in the Parish of Saint James, Piccadilly, in the County of London, now in the hands of us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners) shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be transferred, as on the said 23rd day of January, 1914, from the Bishop and Bishoprick of Ely to, and shall become and for ever thereafter be and form part of, the endowment fund of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and the said annual sum of £750 and the income derived from the said moiety of the proceeds of sale of the said episcopal residence, such moiety of the said proceeds of sale being now represented by the sum of £20,043 4s. 1d. India three pounds and ten shillings per centum Stock standing in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, shall become part of the annual income of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being, but the first fruits and tenths or the annual sum payable in lieu of such first fruits and tenths in respect of the said annual sum of £750 shall be payable by the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being to the exoneration of the Bishop and Bishoprick of Ely.

"11. The portion of the endowment or income of the Bishoprick of Norwich which is mentioned in Part III of the second Schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, (that is to say such portion of the endowment or income of the said Bishoprick of Norwich as will produce or amount to the sum of £150 per annum) shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be transferred, as from the said 23rd day of January, 1914, from the Bishop and Bishoprick of Norwich to, and shall become and for ever thereafter be and form part of, the endowment fund of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich so as to become part of the annual income of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being, but the first fruits and tenths or the annual sum payable in lieu of such first fruits and tenths in respect of the said annual sum of £150 shall be payable by the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and

Ipswich for the time being to the exoneration of the Bishop and Bishoprick of Norwich.

" 12. The portion of the endowment or income of the Bishoprick of Saint Albans which is mentioned in Part III of the second Schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, that is to say such portion of the endowment or income of the said Bishoprick of Saint Albans as will produce or amount to £350 per annum, the said portion of the endowment or income of the Bishoprick of Saint Albans to consist of (a) the annual sum of £250 part of the annual sum of £500 which, by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, made on the 11th day of July, 1877, and published in the London Gazette of the 13th day of the same month, was transferred from the endowment of the Bishop of Rochester to the Saint Albans Bishoprick Endowment Fund, and (b) the sum of £2,500 Great Western Railway Four pounds per centum Debenture Stock now forming part of the said Saint Albans Bishoprick Endowment Fund, shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be transferred, as on the said 23rd day of January, 1914, from the Bishop and Bishoprick of Saint Albans to, and shall become and for ever thereafter be and form part of, the endowment fund of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and the said annual sum of £250 and the income derived from the said sum of £2,500 Great Western Railway Four pounds per centum Debenture Stock and any reinvestment thereof shall become part of the annual income of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being.

" 13. Any existing Archdeacon whose Archdeaconry is affected by the foundation of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich may reside in any place in which he might have resided had the said Bishoprick not been founded.

" 14. The Bishop's Secretary, Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer, or Record Keeper of the Diocese or Bishoprick to which any Church, Parish, Benefice, or Place has been transferred by the formation of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, or shall be transferred by this Scheme, and any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, and the Registrar and any other Officer of the Archdeaconry in which any such Church, Parish, Benefice, or Place, is included, shall respectively on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year, so long as any present Bishop's Secretary, Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer or Record Keeper of a Diocese or Bishoprick, or Registrar or other Officer of an Archdeaconry (as the case may be) from which any such Church, Parish, Benefice, or Place, has been so transferred who was appointed to his office before the 15th day of August, 1913, shall continue to hold such office, pay to such last-mentioned Bishop's Secretary, Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer, or Record Keeper of a Diocese or Bishoprick, or Registrar or other Officer of an Archdeaconry, one half of the net fees received by such Accounting Officer during the six months preceding the said 1st day of January or 1st day of July, as the case may be, for work done by such Accounting Officer

in the exercise of his Office (or by any other Officer who may by usage or otherwise perform the duties of such Office) in or in relation to any Church, Parish, Benefice, or Place, so transferred, such fees to be calculated upon the scale of fees which shall be established for or shall be in force within the Diocese or Archdeaconry (as the case may be) of such Accounting Officer, and in computing such net fees there shall be deducted from the gross fees so received as aforesaid the out-of-pocket expenses incurred in relation to the matters in respect of which the fees have been received.

" 15. Every Officer (other than the Chancellor of the Diocese and those referred to in the last preceding clause of this Scheme) who, by virtue of an appointment bearing date prior to the 15th day of August, 1913, now holds any Office of emolument under the Bishop of any Diocese or the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of any Diocese or otherwise in and for any Diocese affected by the formation of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich or by any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, or in and for any part of any such Diocese, and who derived or might have derived any portion of the emoluments of his Office from sources arising within Parishes or Places which by the formation of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich or by virtue of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, have been or shall be transferred from one Diocese to another shall, for the term for which he was so appointed to his Office as aforesaid or until his resignation or other avoidance thereof, continue within such transferred Parishes or Places to perform such duties in the same manner (that is to say either in person or by deputy as may be authorized by the terms of such his appointment) and to receive accordingly such emoluments (upon the scale which may be established or be in force in relation to such his Office in such transferred Parishes or Places) as an Officer of or within the Diocese to which such Parishes or Places have been so transferred as he has hitherto performed and received as an Officer of or within the Diocese wherein such Parishes or Places were formerly situate and (if an Officer of the Bishop or Diocese) shall, as regards such transferred Parishes or Places, during his tenure of such his Office, be an Officer of the Bishop or Diocese to which such Parishes or Places are transferred.

" 16. Twenty-four Honorary Canonries shall be founded in the said Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and it shall be lawful for the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich to appoint to such Honorary Canonries spiritual persons to whom the provisions of the 23rd section of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, in relation to the holders of Honorary Canonries founded thereunder, shall be applicable, save that so long as there shall be no Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church it shall be lawful for the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich of his own sole authority and without the consent of any Dean and Chapter to make regulations respecting the Honorary Canons so appointed, provided always that any Honorary Canons in the Cathedral Church of Ely or in the Cathedral Church of Norwich respectively who upon the

foundation of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich were holding Benefices in that part of the Diocese of Ely or (as the case may be) in that part of the Diocese of Norwich which has now become a part of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and who by writing under their respective hands duly registered or recorded as the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall direct, shall consent to such transfer, shall (notwithstanding anything in the last-mentioned Act and section contained) be transferred to and become Honorary Canons in the said Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and shall thereupon, that is to say, as to each of them upon his appointment as such Honorary Canon in the Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich cease, ipso facto, to be an Honorary Canon in the Cathedral Church of Ely or (as the case may be) in the Cathedral Church of Norwich, provided also that in the first year after the passing of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme eight spiritual persons and no more (exclusive of any Honorary Canons who may be transferred from the Cathedral Churches of Ely and Norwich as aforesaid) may be appointed to Honorary Canonries in the said Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"17. All terriers, tithe apportionments, maps, plans and other documents relating exclusively to any Parish or Parishes, Ecclesiastical Districts, or other Cures or Places situate within the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich as hereinbefore defined or otherwise relating exclusively to the said Diocese or relating exclusively to any part or parts of any Diocese hereinbefore recommended to be included in any other Diocese shall, subject to the provisions hereinbefore contained, be transferred from the custody of the Registrar or other Officer of the Diocese or of the Bishop of the Diocese within which the said Parish or Parishes, Ecclesiastical Districts, or other Cures or Places were situate immediately before the foundation of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich as aforesaid or (as the case may be) are now situate and shall become and be in the custody of such Registrar or other Officer or Officers of the Diocese or of the Bishop of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich or other the Diocese in which such Places are hereinbefore recommended to be included as the Bishop of such Diocese shall appoint in that behalf; And, as to all documents which may remain in their present custody although relating to or affecting the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich or any Parish, Ecclesiastical District, Cure, or Place, now situate in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich as hereinbefore defined or by this Scheme, and any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, transferred from one Diocese to another Diocese, the Registrar or other Officer of the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, or other the Diocese to which such Parish, Ecclesiastical District, Cure, or Place, shall be so transferred as aforesaid, shall be at liberty at all convenient times to inspect such documents and take copies therefrom as freely as the Registrar or other Officer in whose custody such documents may so remain."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of his said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said Dioceses of Ely, Norwich, Saint Albans, and Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 16th day of July, in the year 1914, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a Separate District for spiritual purposes, to be taken out of the Parish of Wilford, in the County of Nottingham, and in the Diocese of Southwell.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Wilford is a Cure wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the Inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Wilford, which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a Separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed Separate District any Consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purpose of Divine Worship.

"And whereas by a certain Indenture, bearing date on or about the 16th day of July, in the year 1914, and made, or expressed to be made, under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856,' or some or one of them, between the Reverend John Clough, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Wilford, of the first part, Sir Hervey Juckes Lloyd Bruce, of Clifton Hall, in the said County of Nottingham, Baronet, Patron of the said Rectory of the Parish of Wilford, of the second part, the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, the Ordinary of the said Rectory of the Parish of Wilford, of the third part, and us, the said

Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said John Clough did, with the consents of the said Sir Hervey Jukes Lloyd Bruce, Baronet, as such Patron as aforesaid, and of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, as such Bishop as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted, and to his Successors, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish, and to his Successors, two perpetual clear yearly rent-charges or net annual sums of £200 each to be payable quarterly on the usual quarter days in every year, free from and clear of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any,) and to be for ever issuing and payable out of, and charged upon, all that the said Rectory of the Parish of Wilford, and the tithes or tithe-commutation-rent-charges, glebe lands and hereditaments, and all other the endowments and emoluments for the time being to the said Rectory belonging, the first of such quarterly payments in respect of one of the said clear yearly rent-charges or net annual sums of £200 to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the date when an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of the issue of the said Gazette to the said quarterly day of payment, and the first of such quarterly payments in respect of the other of the said clear yearly rent-charges or net annual sums of £200 to be made on such of the said days of payment as shall happen next after the next avoidance of the said Rectory of the Parish of Wilford, and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the avoidance of the said Rectory to the said quarterly date of payment.

"And whereas the said two yearly rent-charges or net annual sums of £200 have been granted as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the said John Clough has nominated the said Sir Hervey Jukes Lloyd Bruce, Baronet, as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District shall be assigned.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Wilford, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Faith, North Wilford.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said District, so recommended to be constituted, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish, and of the nomination of an Incumbent thereto, shall, without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Sir Hervey Jukes Lloyd Bruce, Baronet, his heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Faith, North Wilford, being:—All that part of the Parish of Wilford, in the county of Nottingham, and in the Diocese of Southwell, which is bounded upon the south-west and upon the west by the Parish of Lenton, upon the north partly by the Extra Parochial Place called or known as King's Meadows, partly by the New Parish of Saint George, Nottingham, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Saviour, Nottingham, upon the north-east by the last-named New Parish, upon the east by the Parish of West Bridgford, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the River Trent where the boundary which divides the said Parish of West Bridgford from the said Parish of Wilford, diverges south-eastward from following the middle of the said River Trent, and extending thence first south-westward, then westward, then north-westward, then again westward, then again south-westward, and then southward along the middle of the said river for a distance of one mile and five furlongs or thereabouts, to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wilford from the said Parish of Lenton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Wilford, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme.

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE (TRANSFER OF DEPOSIT CONTRIBUTORS) ORDER (No. 2), 1914, DATED 17TH AUGUST, 1914, MADE BY THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONERS UNDER SECTION 78 OF THE NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911 (1 & 2 GEO. V, c. 55).

Whereas this Order is intended to be supplemental (i) to the National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order, 1913, whereby it was provided that where during the period of twelve months from the 15th day of July, 1912, any deposit contributor became a member of an approved society, there should be transferred in respect of him from the Deposit Contributors Fund (therein referred to as the "Post Office Fund") to the society the amount (if any) standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund, after a deduction therefrom of any sums, which, if he had been a member of an approved society, would have been retained for the purpose of discharging the liabilities of the Insurance Commissioners in respect of reserve values, and that he should for the purposes of Section 55 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (therein and in this Order referred to as "the Act") be deemed to have become a member of the society as from the date of his entry into insurance; (ii) to the National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order, 1913 (No. 2),

whereby it was provided that where no account had been opened in the Deposit Contributors Fund (therein referred to as the "Post Office Fund") in the name of any person who had become or was deemed to have become a deposit contributor, that person might, if he joined an approved society before the 15th day of July, 1913, be treated in all respects and for all purposes as a member of the society as from the date on which he would but for that Order have become or be deemed to have become a deposit contributor; and (iii) to the National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order, 1914, whereby the provisions of the two above-mentioned Orders were extended so as to include persons who became members of approved societies at any time up to the 27th day of April, 1914, being the date on which the Order was made:

And whereas for the reasons more particularly set forth in the recitals to the above-mentioned Orders difficulties have arisen in regard to deposit contributors becoming members of approved societies, and with a view of facilitating the necessary transfers and adjustments in respect of persons who have become members on or after the 27th day of April, 1914, and before the 3rd day of August, 1914, it is expedient for the purpose of bringing into operation Part I. of the Act that the provisions of those Orders should be further extended so as to become applicable to those persons:

And whereas for the purpose of enabling deposit contributors who become members of

societies under this Order to pay arrears upon the same conditions as other members of societies it is necessary to modify the provisions of the National Health Insurance (Arrears) Regulations (No. 2), 1914 (which are in this Order referred to as "the Regulations"), in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, the Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Section 78 of the Act and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1.—(1) The National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order, 1913, as amended by the National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order, 1914, shall be read and have effect as if for the period from the 15th day of July, 1912, to the date of the latter Order there were substituted the period from the 15th day of July, 1912, to the 3rd day of August, 1914, and any deposit contributor who has become a member of a society within the above-mentioned period shall, for the purpose of reckoning his arrears, be deemed to have been a member of the society from the date of his entry into insurance.

(2) The National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order, 1913 (No. 2), as amended by the National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order, 1914, shall be read and have effect as if for the date of the latter Order there were substituted the 3rd day of August, 1914.

2.—(1) In the case of a deposit contributor who becomes a member of an approved society before the 3rd day of August, 1914, and is at the date when he becomes a member an employed contributor, such part of Article 9 of the Regulations as requires the Society to give notice to a member of his arrears within six weeks after the end of each contribution year shall not apply to the contribution year ending on the 5th day of July, 1914, but the Society shall give the required notice within a period of six weeks after the end of that contribution year or a period from the end of that contribution year to the expiration of three weeks after the date on which the Commissioners have furnished or may furnish the Society with the particulars necessary for calculating his arrears, whichever period is the longer, and the period of grace after the end of that contribution year shall, so far as relates to him, be a period of thirteen weeks from the end of that year or a period from the end of the year to the expiration of seven weeks from the date on which the Commissioners furnish the Society with the particulars aforesaid, whichever period is the longer.

(2) If any part of the period of grace, as so extended, falls within the first penalty year, that year shall, so far as relates to the member, be treated as commencing on the first Monday after the end of the period of grace, or, if the Commissioners have authorised the Society to fix some other day of the week for the commencement of the penalty year, as commencing on the first day so fixed after the end of the period of grace.

(3) Words and expressions in this Article have the same meanings as in the Regulations.

3. This Order may be cited as the National

Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order (No. 2), 1914, and shall be read as one with the three Orders above mentioned, and those Orders and this Order may together be cited as the National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Orders, 1913 and 1914.

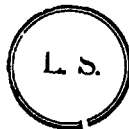
