

West Lynn, and the New Parish of Saint John, Lynn, shall be detached from the Rural Deanery of Lynn Marshland and shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Lynn Norfolk; the archidiaconal supervision of the Parish of Mendham (hereinbefore recommended to be wholly included in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich) shall remain vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Suffolk, and the said Parish of Mendham shall continue to be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Hoxne; the archidiaconal supervision of the Parish of Santon (also hereinbefore recommended to be included in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich) shall become vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Sudbury, and the said Parish of Santon shall be detached from the Rural Deanery of Cranwich and shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Mildenhall; the archidiaconal supervision of the Parishes of Exning with Landwade and of All Saints, Newmarket, (hereinbefore recommended to be wholly included in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich) shall remain vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Sudbury, and the said Parishes of Exning with Landwade and of All Saints, Newmarket, together with the Parish of Saint Mary, Newmarket, shall be detached from the Rural Deanery of Fordham and shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Thurlow; the archidiaconal supervision of the Rural Deanery of Fordham, which remains in the Diocese of Ely, shall become vested in, and be with and in and be exercised by, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Ely, and the Parishes of Isleham, Chippenham, Kennett, Ashley-cum-Silverley, Cheveley and Kirtling, which also remain in the Diocese of Ely, shall be included in and form part of the said Rural Deanery of Fordham, and the Parish of Woodditton (hereinbefore recommended to be wholly included in the Diocese of Ely) shall continue to be included in and form part of the said Rural Deanery of Fordham; the Parish of Saint Peter, Prickwillow, (also hereinbefore recommended to be wholly included in the Diocese of Ely) shall continue to be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Ely.

"8. The patronage of every Ecclesiastical Dignity or Benefice, being within the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich as rearranged by this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, of which Dignity or Benefice the patronage is now vested for any estate or interest in the Bishop of Ely, or the Bishop of Norwich, in right of his See, shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be forthwith to the extent of the estate or interest therein now vested in or belonging to the Bishop of Ely, or the Bishop of Norwich, as aforesaid, transferred from the said Bishop of Ely, or Bishop of Norwich, as the case may be, to, and shall become and be vested in, the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and his successors.

"9. The patronage of every Ecclesiastical Benefice, being within that portion of the Diocese of Norwich which is hereinbefore

recommended to be transferred to the Diocese of Ely, of which Dignity or Benefice the patronage is now vested for any estate or interest in the Bishop of Norwich in right of his See, shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be forthwith to the extent of the estate or interest therein now vested in or belonging to the Bishop of Norwich, as aforesaid, transferred from the said Bishop of Norwich to, and shall become and be vested in, the Bishop of Ely and his successors.

"10. The portion of the endowment or income of the Bishoprick of Ely which is mentioned in Part III of the second Schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913 (that is to say such portion of the endowment or income of the Bishoprick of Ely as will produce or amount to the sum of £750 per annum together with a moiety of the proceeds of sale of the episcopal residence attached to the said Bishoprick of Ely, situate in the Parish of Saint James, Piccadilly, in the County of London, now in the hands of us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners) shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be transferred, as on the said 23rd day of January, 1914, from the Bishop and Bishoprick of Ely to, and shall become and for ever thereafter be and form part of, the endowment fund of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and the said annual sum of £750 and the income derived from the said moiety of the proceeds of sale of the said episcopal residence, such moiety of the said proceeds of sale being now represented by the sum of £20,043 4s. 1d. India three pounds and ten shillings per centum Stock standing in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, shall become part of the annual income of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being, but the first fruits and tenths or the annual sum payable in lieu of such first fruits and tenths in respect of the said annual sum of £750 shall be payable by the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being to the exoneration of the Bishop and Bishoprick of Ely.

"11. The portion of the endowment or income of the Bishoprick of Norwich which is mentioned in Part III of the second Schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, (that is to say such portion of the endowment or income of the said Bishoprick of Norwich as will produce or amount to the sum of £150 per annum) shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be transferred, as from the said 23rd day of January, 1914, from the Bishop and Bishoprick of Norwich to, and shall become and for ever thereafter be and form part of, the endowment fund of the Bishoprick of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich so as to become part of the annual income of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being, but the first fruits and tenths or the annual sum payable in lieu of such first fruits and tenths in respect of the said annual sum of £150 shall be payable by the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and
