No. 1 Buov:

New position.—At a distance of 580 yards, 205° (S. 40° W. Mag.), from the measured mile beacon on Gilkicker point, and 140° (S. 25° E. Mag.) from the red lights on the outer end of Stokes bay pier.

No. 2 Buoy:

New position.—At a distance of 840 yards, 250° (S. 85° W. Mag.), from the foregoing measured mile beacon, and 164° (S. 1° E. Mag.) from the south-east red light on the outer end of Stokes bay pier.

The area within which passage and anchorage is prohibited now lies between these two buoys and a line drawn in a direction 25° (N.
