

Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Gabriel, Aldersbrook, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Wanstead, in the County of Essex, and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the west partly by the District Parish of Leytonstone and partly by the New Parish of Saint Margaret, Leytonstone, upon the south-west by the last-named New Parish, upon the south partly by the New Parish of Saint Saviour, Forest Gate, partly by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Forest Gate, and partly by the New Parish of All Saints, Forest Gate, upon the east by the Parish of Little Ilford, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Little Ilford from the said Parish of Wanstead meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of Wanstead Park, and extending thence first north-westward and then generally westward along the said wall or fence (thereby following in one part the northern side of the road called Northumberland Avenue and in another part the backs of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of the road called Woodlands Avenue) for a distance of one mile and seven chains or thereabouts to its western end on the eastern side of Blake Hall Road, and extending thence first westward to and then northward along the middle of Blake Hall Road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the stream flowing along the southern side of Bush Wood, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of the said stream for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to the point where such stream turns northward, and extending thence in a straight line due west (thereby recrossing the said stream and crossing Bush Wood) for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wanstead from the said District Parish of Leytonstone.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Little Ilford which is bounded upon the east by the Parish of Great Ilford, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north and upon the west by the said Parish of Wanstead, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wanstead from the said Parish of Little Ilford at a point opposite to the southern end of the wall forming the western boundary of the City of London Cemetery, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line (thereby crossing Aldersbrook Road) for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the said wall on the north-eastern side of Aldersbrook Road, and extending thence first north-westward along the said wall and then north-eastward along the wall forming the northern boundary of the said Cemetery for a distance in all of thirty-three chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern corner of the said Cemetery, and extending thence first north-eastward along the wall or fence which extends in continuation of the last-mentioned boundary wall and forms the southern boundary of the

Wanstead Urban District Council's Sewage Farm and then south-eastward along the wall or fence which forms the south-western boundary of the said sewage farm for a distance in all of thirty chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned wall or fence meets the western bank of the River Roding, and extending thence south-eastward to a point in the middle of the River Roding upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Little Ilford from the said Parish of Great Ilford."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own Diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any Diocese, or by the Bishops of any two Dioceses, that two or more Benefices, or that one or more Benefice or Benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, in his or their Diocese or Dioceses, being either in the same Parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such Inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Patron or Patrons of the said Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such Consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with Notice to any Person or Persons interested, that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such
