

Diocese of Lincoln, by the separation of the said Vicarage of Kirmington from the said Rectory of Brocklesby, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion.

And whereas, on the 25th day of February, 1914, the said Archbishop inquired into the circumstances of the case.

And whereas, on the 17th day of June, 1914, the said Archbishop certified to His Majesty in Council as follows, that is to say:—

"We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

"That the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Lord Bishop of Lincoln, in whose Diocese is situate the United Benefice consisting of the Rectory of Brocklesby and the Vicarage of Kirmington, in the County of Lincoln, having represented unto us that the disunion of the said United Benefice, by the separation of the Vicarage of Kirmington from the Rectory of Brocklesby, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such union might usefully be dissolved, and that the Right Honourable Charles Alfred Worsley Anderson Pelham, Earl of Yarborough, being the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said United Benefice of Brocklesby with Kirmington, in case the same were now vacant, consents to the proposed disunion.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation to be affixed to the principal outer doors of each of the Parish Churches of Brocklesby and Kirmington, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands to us, the said Archbishop, against such disunion, but no sufficient cause has been shown.

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consent in writing of the said Patron of the said United Benefice, and the copies of the Representation and Notices before-mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for the disunion of the said United Benefice by the separation of the Vicarage of Kirmington from the Rectory of Brocklesby so as to constitute each of them a separate Benefice, with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only, and we recommend that the house of residence situate in the said Parish of Kirmington, with garden and orchard together with the field lying to the south of the said house and garden, and numbered 129 on the Ordnance Map, and comprising four acres now in the occupation of Mr. William Garside, shall be the house of residence and glebe of the said Vicarage of Kirmington, and that in all other respects the said Rectory of Brocklesby and the said Vicarage of Kirmington shall each retain its own original

endowments and emoluments and bear its own charges and outgoings.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said United Benefice consisting of the Rectory of Brocklesby and the Vicarage of Kirmington, situate in the County and Diocese of Lincoln, shall be disunited by separating the said Rectory of Brocklesby from the said Vicarage of Kirmington.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased, on the recommendation of the Archbishop, with the Consent of the Patron of the said Benefices, to assign and attach to the said Vicarage of Kirmington the house of residence situate in that Parish, with the garden and orchard together with the field lying to the south of the said house and garden, and numbered 129 on the Ordnance Map, and comprising four acres, (now in the occupation of William Garside), and to direct that in all other respects the said Rectory of Brocklesby and the said Vicarage of Kirmington shall each retain its own original endowments and emoluments and bear its own charges and outgoings.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appears to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the *London Gazette*, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been
