#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 26th day of August, 1914, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was graciously pleased by Her Royal Proclamation of the 17th day of September, 1900, to regulate, according to the Scheme set forth therein or recognized thereby, the distribution of the net proceeds of Prizes captured from the enemy, of captures and seizures under the several Acts of Parliament passed relating to the Revenues of Customs, and to Trade and Navigation, for the abolition of the Slave Trade, for the capture and destruction of Pirates and Piratical Vessels, and of the rewards conferred for the same, as also, of the awards for all salvage granted to the crews of Your Majesty's Ships and Vessels of War, when not otherwise specially apportioned by the terms of the respective awards and allowances.

"And Whereas we are of opinion that the conditions governing the distribution of the proceeds of Prizes captured from the enemy when such proceeds are granted by Your Majesty to the Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Fleet, require modification to bring them into accord with modern conditions.

"And Whereas it is intended that in lieu of the system of distribution of Prize Money described in the above-mentioned Proclamation there should be substituted, under regulations and conditions to be hereafter announced, a system of Prize Bounties or Gratuities for more general distribution to the Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Naval Forces.

"We humbly beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to cancel so much of the above-mentioned Proclamation as relates to the distribution of the net proceeds of Prizes captured from the enemy."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from His Excellency the Japanese Ambassador the text of a declaration issued on the 27th instant by the Imperial Japanese Naval Authorities, announcing the establishment on that date of a blockade of the whole of the littoral of the leased territory of Kiao-Chau.

The coastline affected extends from a point 120° 10′ East, and 35° 54′ North, to a point 120° 36′ East and 36° 7′ North.

A period of twenty-four hours was allowed within which vessels of allied or neutral States might leave the blockaded area.

The procedure set out in the following rules is to be followed so far as may be practicable in the circumstances of each case:

#### RULES.

- 1. All claims whatsoever arising out of or in respect of the requisitioning of any British ship or vessel under His Majesty's Proclamation of the 3rd day of August, 1914, shall be made out in full detail and left in triplicate with or sent to the Secretary of the Admiralty, Whitehall, S.W., so soon as may be and in no case later than within one month from the taking up of the ship or vessel for His Majesty's service.
- 2. The claim shall be accompanied with all necessary vouchers and supporting documents and such explanatory statement as may be required to make clear the nature of the claim and the grounds thereof.
- 3. Each claim shall be considered by the Admiralty, who shall negotiate with the claimant with a view to the adjustment and settlement thereof by agreement.
- 4. If the Admiralty and the claimant fail to arrive at an agreement within a reasonable time, to be determined in each case by the President of the Board of Arbitration, the Admiralty shall report the matter with the necessary papers to the President, who shall refer the claim to two Arbitrators selected by

him from the panels of Arbitrators for consideration and report. The Arbitrators so selected shall have regard to any directions or instructions they may receive from the President; they may call for such further papers, evidence and particulars as they may require, and—if they think fit—may call upon the Admiralty and the claimant either to argue the matter before them or to submit written arguments on any points.

- 5. The joint award of such Arbitrators shall be final. If they are unable to agree, the matter shall be referred to the President of the Board of Arbitration as Umpire, who may require such further papers, evidence, particulars or argument as he may deem necessary. The award of the President shall be final.
- 6. The President may direct that any claim coming before the Board may be heard and disposed of by a Tribunal consisting of the President or Vice-President sitting with two Arbitrators selected by the President from the Panel, and that the award of any two members of such Tribunal shall be final and conclusive and shall not be subject to appeal or review.
- 7. The President may, from time to time, vary or supersede the existing Rules for regulating the procedure of the Board, or of the Arbitrators nominated by him to such extent as he may consider necessary or desirable, and may also make additional rules of procedure.
- 8. The President may, from time to time, authorise the members of the Panel as a body, or any of them, and whether with or without the inclusion of himself or of the Vice-President, to act as a Board for the consideration of questions of general applicability such as the approximate monthly rate of hire for vessels of different classes and similar matters. Arbitrators nominated by the President in particular cases may have regard to, and consider, but shall not be bound by, the conclusions of any Board so constituted upon the questions submitted to such Board, and the fact that any Arbitrator appointed by the President in a particular case has been a member of any such Board, shall be no objection to his competency as an Arbitrator in such particular case.

The President may authorise any person or persons who, in his opinion, will efficiently and sufficiently represent the interests of parties concerned in any such question of general applicability submitted to any such Board, to appear before the Board and represent such interests accordingly.

- 9. The Arbitrators, or, in the event of their disagreement, the President, or Vice-President, may make interim awards as regards any of the questions submitted to them.
- 10. It shall be competent for the Arbitrators, adjudicating upon any claim, to receive as evidence any information, statements or testimony which may appear to them likely to be of assistance notwithstanding that the same may not be evidence according to law.
- 11. Any matter or question of procedure not disposed of by these rules or any question arising thereon shall be determined by the President of the Board of Arbitration as in his discretion he shall think fit to direct.
- 12. The Vice-President of the Board of Arbitration may by direction of the President act in any matter hereunder for the President, and he may also act as President should the

President for any reason at any time be unable to act. Any direction or decision of the Vice-President when so acting for or as the President shall be as effectual as though made or given by the President.

#### MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. Regulations under Section 9 (1). COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

BRAUGHING.

To the County Council of Hertford; And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Hertford, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising parts of certain roads at Braughing, in the County of Hertford, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held

accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of roads at Braughing which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the seventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

So much of the road from Ware to Barkway and Cambridge as extends from a point in the road 50 yards south of the entrance to Alma Cottage to the junction of the road with Gravel Lane; and

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 28TH AUGUST 1914.)

LINCOLNSHIRE (PARTS OF LINDSEY) (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through

such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District, without unnecessary delay, and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be

within the Scheduled District.

Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

- 2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right-of-way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:
  - (i) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals
  - (ii) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions hereby imposed.
- (3.) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

4.—(1.) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner, and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be

deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the Lincoln-SHIRE (PARTS OF LINDSEY) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914.

LINCOLNSHIRE (PARTS OF LINDSEY) (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 2.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of Animals into Borough of Grimsby for Immediate Slaughter.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Lincolnshire (Parts of Lindsey) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914, an animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved without a licence by railway or by vessel from outside the Scheduled District described in the Schedule to that Order to a railway station or landing place situate within the county borough of Grimsby; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughterhouse or bacon factory situate within the said borough if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

2.—(1.) The movement of an animal with a Movement Licence under this Order shall be subject to the following conditions:

(i.) The animal shall be moved to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory specified in the Licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained, and shall be slaughtered within four days of its arrival thereat.

(ii.) The animal during the movement to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals not being moved with a Licence under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the Licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same district by the person in charge of the animal at the time of completing such movement.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by Regulation of a Local Authority or by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Move-ment Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or

other officer.

#### Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on

the thirty-first day of August, nineteen hundred and fourteen.
