A PROCLAMATION

ARYING the Proclamations in respect of the Postponement of Payments, dated respectively the second day of August, the sixth day of August, and the twelfth day of August, and revoking the Proclamation dated the first day of September, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS under the Postponement of Payments Act, 1914, We have power, by Proclamation, to authorise the postponement of the payment of any bill of exchange, or of any negotiable instrument, or any other payment in pursuance of any contract, to such extent, and for such time, and subject to such conditions or other provisions as may be specified in the Proclamation:

AND WHEREAS, in pursuance of that power, We have issued Proclamations in relation to the postponement of payments due before We were in a state of war or due in respect of contracts made before that time, dated the sixth day of August, and the twelfth day of August, nineteen hundred and fourteen; and on the second day of August, nineteen hundred and fourteen, We also issued a Proclamation which is confirmed by the said Postponement of Payments Act, 1914, and is deemed to have been issued under that Act:

AND WHEREAS, under the said Act, We have power to vary, extend, or revoke any Proclamation under that Act by a subsequent Proclamation:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable in the best interests of Our Realm at the present juncture that all persons who can discharge their liabilities should do so without delay, but it is at the same time for certain purposes expedient that Our said Proclamations should be varied, and for that purpose We issued a Proclamation, dated the first day of September, nineteen hundred and fourteen:

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to revoke the last-mentioned Proclamation and to substitute therefor such variations of Our other Proclamations as are hereinafter set forth:

Now, THEREFORE, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to

issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

- 1. If on the presentation for payment of a bill of exchange which has before the fourth day of September, nineteen hundred and fourteen, been re-accepted under the terms of Our said Proclamation, dated the second day of August, nineteen hundred and fourteen, the bill is not paid, then, the said Proclamation shall, in its application to that bill, have effect as if the period of two calendar months had been in the Proclamation substituted for the period of one calendar month, and the sum mentioned in the form of re-acceptance under the said Proclamation shall be deemed to be increased by the amount of interest on the original amount of the bill for one calendar month calculated at the Bank of England rate current on the date when the bill is so presented for payment as aforesaid.
- 2. Our said Proclamation, dated the sixth day of August, nineteen hundred and fourteen, as extended by Our said Proclamation, dated the twelfth day of August, nineteen hundred and fourteen, shall apply to payments which become due and payable on or after the fourth day of September and before the fourth day of October, nineteen hundred and fourteen (whether they become so due and payable by virtue of the said Proclamations or otherwise) in like manner as it applies to payments which became due and payable after the date of the said first-mentioned Proclamation and before the beginning of the fourth day of September, nineteen hundred and fourteen.
- 3. Nothing in this Proclamation shall affect the payment of interest under the Proclamations extended thereby, or prevent payments being made before the expiration of the period for which they are postponed.
- 4. Our said Proclamation, dated the first day of September, nineteen hundred and four-teen, is hereby revoked.

HEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which in the opinion of His Majesty was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present war, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Postponement of Payments Act, 1914, shall extend to the Isle of Man, adapted as set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

POSTPONEMENT OF PAYMENTS ACT, 1914.

(1). Our Lieutenant-Governor of the Isle of Man may, with Our consent, signified to him by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, by Proclamation, authorize the postponement of the payment of any bill of exchange, or of any negotiable instrument, or any other payment in pursuance of any contract, to such extent, for such time, and subject to such conditions or other provisions, as may be specified in the Proclamation.

(2). No additional Stamp Duty shall be payable in respect of any instrument as a consequence of any postponement of payment in pursuance of a Proclamation under this Act unless the Proclamation otherwise directs.

(3). Any such Proclamation may be varied, extended, or revoked, by any subsequent Proclamation, and separate Proclamations may be made dealing with separate subjects

made dealing with separate subjects.

(4). The Proclamations dated the 8th day of August, 1914, relating to the postponement of payment of certain bills of exchange and of certain other payments are hereby confirmed, and shall be deemed to have been made under this Act.

2.—(1). This Act may be cited as the Postponement of Payments Act, 1914.

(2). This Act shall remain in force for a period of six months from the date of the passing thereof.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 12th day of August, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to make Regulations (called the Defence of the Realm Regulations, 1914) under the Defence of the Realm Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the Realm:

And whereas by the Defence of the Realm (No. 2) Act, 1914, the power of making Regulations under the first mentioned Act was extended:

And whereas it is desirable to amend the said Regulations in manner herein provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the Defence of the Realm Regulations, 1914:—

1. After Regulation 3 the following Regula-

tions shall be inserted:

"3a. The competent naval or military authority may by order authorise the use of land within such limits as may be specified in the order for the training of any part of His

Majesty's naval or military forces; and may by such order confer such rights of user of the land, and provide for such temporary suspension of rights of way over roads and footpaths, as are conferred and exerciseable with respect to authorised land roads and footpaths under the Military Manœuvres Acts, 1897 and 1911, and the competent naval or military authority shall have all the powers exerciseable by the Military Manœuvres Commission under those Acts.

"3B. The restriction on the power to make byelaws under the Military Lands Acts, 1892 to 1903, imposed by the following provisions of the Military Lands Act, 1892, that is to say, the proviso to subsection (1) of section fourteen, section sixteen, and subsection (1) of section seventeen of that Act, and by the following provisions of the Military Lands Act, 1900, that is to say, the provisoes to subsection (2) of section two and subsection (3) of section two of that Act, are hereby suspended, and the powers of the Admiralty and the Secretary of State to make byelaws under the said Acts shall extend to the making of byelaws with respect to land of which possession has been taken under these Regulations.

"3c. The competent naval or military authority may if he considers it necessary so to do for the purposes of any work of defence or other defended military work, or of any work for which it is deemed necessary in the interests of public safety or the defence of the Realm to afford military protection, stop up or divert any road or pathway over or adjoining the land on which such work is situate:

"Provided that where any such road or pathway is so stopped up or diverted the competent naval or military authority shall publish notice thereof in such manner as he may consider best adapted for informing the public, and where any road or pathway is stopped up by means of any physical obstruction he shall cause lights sufficient for the warning of passengers to be set up every night whilst the road or pathway is so stopped up."

2. The following Regulation shall be inserted after Regulation 12:—

"12A. Any police officer or any person authorised for the purpose by the competent naval or military authority may stop any vehicle travelling along any public highway, and, if he has reason to suspect that the vehicle is being used for any purpose or in any way prejudicial to the public safety or the defence of the Realm, may search the vehicle and seize anything found therein which he has reason to suspect is being used or intended to be used for any such purpose as aforesaid."

3. At the end of Regulation 16 the following words shall be inserted:—

"And no person shall in any area which may be prescribed by order of a Secretary of State keep or have in his possession any carrier or homing pigeons, unless he has obtained from the chief officer of police of the district a permit for the purpose (which permit may at any time be revoked), and the chief officer of police may, if he considers it necessary or expedient to do so, cause any pigeons kept in contravention of this regulation to be liberated."

4. The following Regulation shall be substituted for Regulation 21:—

"No person shall by word of mouth or in writing spread reports likely to cause disaffec-

tion or alarm among any of His Majesty's forces or among the civilian population.'

5. The following Regulation shall be inserted.

after Regulation 24:-

"24A. Where the behaviour of any person issuch as to give reasonable grounds for suspecting that he has acted, or is acting, or is about to act in a manner prejudicial to the public safety or the safety of the Realm, the competent naval or military authority may, by order, direct him to cease to reside in any area (specified in the order) within or in the neighbourhood of a defended harbour or proclaimed area, and any person to whom the order relates shall, within such time as may be specified in the order, leave the area specified in the order, having first reported his proposed residence to the competent naval or military authority, and shall not again reside in that area without a permit for the purpose from that authority."

6. In Regulation 27, after the words "for the purpose of assisting the enemy" there shall be inserted the following words "or in respect of any contravention of Regulation 21 if the offender proves that he acted without any intention to cause disaffection or alarm."

7. At the end of Regulation 29 the follow-

ing words shall be inserted:-

"The Admiralty or Army Council may authorise the competent naval or military authority to delegate, either unconditionally or subject to such conditions as he thinks fit, all or any of his powers under these regulations to any officer qualified to be appointed a compe-

tent naval or military authority."

8. The Defence of the Realm Regulations, 1914, shall apply in respect of any area (in these Regulations referred to as "a proclaimed area") which may for the time being be proclaimed by the Admiralty or Army Council tobe an area which it is necessary to safeguard in the interests of the training or concentration of any of His Majesty's forces in like manner as they apply in respect of a harbour or defended harbour as the case may be, and accordingly in Regulations 6, 7, 17, 20, 22, 23 and 24 the words "or proclaimed area" shall be inserted after the word "harbour" wherever it occurs.

9. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence of the Realm (No. 2) Regulations,

WHEREAS it is provided by section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, asamended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the effect:—

That an Order should be issued withdrawing the prohibition on the exportation from

the United Kingdom of Jams and Marmalades and of Condensed Milk, sweetened or not, established by His Majesty's Proclamation dated the 20th August, 1914:

Now, therefore, Their Lordships having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved:

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Bishopricks Act, 1878, and the Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 16th day of July, in the year 1914, in the words and figures follow-

ing, that is to say: —
"WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Bishopricks Act, 1878, and the Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Bishoprick of Sheffield, and for the re-arrangement of the boundaries of the Diocese of Sheffield, and of the contiguous

Diocese of Wakefield.

"Whereas by the 7th section of the said Bishopricks Act, 1878, it is enacted that whenever the certificate therein referred to shall have been given to Your Majesty by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with respect to the endowment fund of any new Bishoprick mentioned in the schedule to the said Act, we shall lay before Your Majesty in Council a Scheme for all or any of the matters in relation to such new Bishoprick which in the same section are mentioned.

"And whereas by the 1st section of the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, it is enacted that, subject to the modifications set forth in the first schedule to the same Act, the said Bishopricks Act, 1878, including the repealed portions thereof, shall have effect for the purpose of the foundation of the new Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, as if the second schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, were substituted for the schedule to the said Bishopricks Act, 1878, and as if the last-mentioned Act had become law on the date on which the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, passed.

"And whereas the Bishoprick of Sheffield is one of the Bishopricks mentioned in the said second schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, and the said certificate was given by

us with respect to the endowment fund of the said Bishoprick of Sheffield on the 18th day of December, 1913, and thereupon, by an Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 21st day of January, 1914, made in pursuance of the said Acts and reciting that such certificate had been so given as aforesaid, which Order was published in the London Gazette on the 23rd day of the same month of January, and came into operation on the day of the date of such publication, (1) the Bishoprick of Sheffield was founded, (2) the Diocese of the said Bishoprick was declared to consist (subject to the provisions contained in the first schedule to the Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, as to rearrangement of boundaries) of the Rural Deaneries of Sheffield, Doncaster, Ecclesfield, Rotherham, Wath, and Snaith, together with such portions of the Rural Deanery of Dronfield, otherwise known as the Rural Deanery of Eyam, in the Diocese of Southwell, as are now included in the City of Sheffield, (3) the Parish Church of Sheffield, in the County of York, (subject to the rights of the Patron and Incumbent thereof) was declared to be the Cathedral Church of the said Bishoprick, and (4) the Bishop of Sheffield was constituted a body corporate, and was invested with all such rights, privileges, and jurisdictions, as are possessed by any other Bishop in England, and was subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of York.

"And whereas among the modifications of the said Bishopricks Act, 1878, contained in the said first schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, it is enacted that a Scheme made under section 7 of the said Bishopricks Act may provide for the re-arrangement of the boundaries of the new Diocese to which the same applies, and of any Diocese contiguous thereto, and that any application in connection with the new Bishoprick of Sheffield for any such re-arrangement affecting the Rural Deanery of Snaith or any part thereof, presented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, within six months after the date of the hereinbeforementioned certificate as to the endowment fund of the said Bishoprick by any Incumbent or Churchwarden or any five Parishioners of a Parish situate within the said Rural Deanery of Snaith, shall be considered and determined

by us.

"And whereas certain applications affecting Parishes in the said Rural Deanery of Snaith have been presented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provision last-hereinbefore recited of the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, and such applications have been considered by us, and we have determined that no re-arrangement of the boundaries of the said Diocese of Sheffield affecting the said Rural Deanery of Snaith or

any Parish therein should be made.
"And whereas such portions of the Rural Deanery of Dronfield, otherwise known as the Rural Deanery of Eyam, in the Diocese of Southwell, as are included in the City of Sheffield, which portions of the said Rural Deanery have as aforesaid been included in the said Diocese of Sheffield, do comprise the two Parishes of Norton Woodseats and Saint Chad

Norton Woodseats, and no other.

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of

York, the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield, and the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, do (so far as their respective consents are necessary) consent to this Scheme and the several recommendations herein contained, in testimony whereof the said Archbishop of York has hereto set his hand and archiepiscopal seal, and the said Bishops of Southwell, Wakefield, and Sheffield, have respectively hereto set their hands and episcopal seals.

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose as follows, namely:

"1. The boundaries of the Diocese of Sheffield and Wakefield shall be re-arranged as follows, that is to say, the Parish of Midhope, in the Rural Deanery of Ecciesfield and the Archdeaconry of Sheffield, shall be severed from the Diocese of Sheffield and shall be included in and form part of the Diocese of Wakefield, so that the Diocese of Sheffield shall consist of the Rural Deaneries of Sheffield, Doncaster, Ecclesfield (with the exception of the said Parish of Midhope), Rotherham, Wath, and Snaith, together with the said Parishes of Norton Woodseats and Saint Chad Norton Woodseats.

"2. The Bishop of Sheffield for the time being shall, subject to the provisions herein-after-contained, have all such Courts and Officers and all such jurisdiction as were immediately before the said date of the publication in the London Gazette of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 21st day of January, 1914, possessed by the Archbishop of York as Bishop of the Diocese of York within the area of the Diocese of Sheffield as

hereinbefore-defined.

"3. All Parishes, Ecclesiastical Districts, and other Cures and Places, Churches and Chapels, and all the Clergy and others Your Majesty's Subjects within the territories which by virtue of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 21st day of January, 1914, are severed from any Diocese and by virtue of the said Order, as varied by any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, are included in the Diocese of Sheffield, or in the said Diocese of Wakefield, shall be exempted and released from all episcopal jurisdiction, authority, and control, of the Bishop of the Diocese in which the same were situate immediately before such severance and shall be under and subject to the episcopal jurisdiction, authority, and control, of the Bishop of Sheffield or the Bishop of Wakefield, as the case may be, in whose Diocese such territories are so included as aforesaid, and of the successors of such Bishop.

4. Until a Dean and Chapter of and for the Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Sheffield shall have been created, the Bishop of Sheffield may, as to any and every matter with respect to which the confirmation or other agency of a Dean and Chapter is by law required for rendering effectual the action of a Bishop, take action in such matter without such confirmation or agency, and his action so taken shall not for want of such confirmation or

agency be ineffectual or invalid.

"5. During any and every vacancy in the See of Sheffield, whether such vacancy shall happen before or after the creation of a Dean and Chapter of and for the Cathedral Church

of the Bishoprick of Sheffield, the Archbishop. of York for the time being shall have the custody and be Guardian of the Spiritualities of

the See of Sheffield.
"6. The archidiaconal supervision of all the Parishes, Ecclesiastical Districts, and other Cures and Places comprised within the Diocese of Sheffield, and the Archdeaconry of Sheffield, or the Archdeaconry of Doncaster, shall remain vested in, and be with and in, and be exercised by, the Archdeacons of those Archdeaconries respectively, and the said Archdeacons shall be Officers of the Diocese of Sheffield, and shall not be subject to the episcopal jurisdiction of the Archbishop of York as Bishop of the Diocese of York, but shall be exclusively subject to the episcopal jurisdiction of the Bishop of Sheffield and the archi-diaconal dignities of the said Archdeacons. shall be transferred from the Cathedral Church. of York to the Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Sheffield, and all the endowments belonging to the said Archdeaconries respectivelyshall continue to belong to the same notwithstanding the transfer of the said Archdeacon. ries from the Diocese of York to the Diocese

of Sheffield.
"7. The Parishes of Norton Woodseats and Saint Chad Norton Woodseats shall besevered from the Rural Deanery of Eyam, and Archdeaconry of Chesterfield, and shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Sheffield, and. Archdeaconry of Sheffield, and shall be subject: to the archidiaconal supervision of the Archdeacon of Sheffield, and the Parish of Midhope. (hereinbefore recommended to be included in the Diocese of Wakefield) shall be severed from the Rural Deanery of Écclesfield, and Archdeaconry of Sheffield, and shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Silkstone, and Archdeaconry of Huddersfield, and shall be subject to the archidiaconal supervision of the Arch-

deacon of Huddersfield.

"8. The patronage of every Ecclesiastical Dignity or Benefice being within the Diocese of Sheffield, of which Dignity or Benefice the patronage or any estate or interest therein is now vested in or belongs to the Archbishop of York in right of his See, shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be forthwith to the extent of the estate or interest therein now vested in or belonging to the Archbishop of York as aforesaid transferred from the said Archbishop of York to, and shall become and be vested in, and shall belong to,

the Bishop of Sheffield and his successors.
"9. The patronage of the Benefice of Saint. Chad Norton Woodseats, of which Benefice the patronage is now vested in or belongs to the Bishop of Southwell in right of his See, shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be forthwith to the extent of the estate or interest therein now vested in or belonging to the Bishop of Southwell as aforesaid transferred from the the said Bishop of Southwell to, and shall become and be vested in, and shall belong to, the Bishop of Sheffield and his successors.

"10. The portion of the endowment or income of the See of York which is mentioned in part I. of the second schedule to the said Bishopricks of Sheffield, Chelmsford, and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, (being the net yearly sum of £1,000), shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be transferred, as on the 23rd day of January, 1914, from the Archbishop and Archbishoprick of York to, and shall become and for ever thereafter be and form part of, the endowment fund of the Bishoprick of Sheffield so as to become part of the annual income of the Bishop of Sheffield for the time being, but the first fruits and tenths or the annual sum payable in lieu of such first fruits and tenths in respect of the said annual sum of £1,000 shall be payable by the Bishop of Sheffield for the time being to the exoneration of the Archbishop and Archbishoprick of York.

"11. The Bishop's Secretary, Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer, or Record Keeper, of the Diocese or Bishoprick to which any Church, Parish, Place, or Benefice, has been transferred by the formation of the Diocese of Sheffield or shall be transferred by this Scheme, and any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, and the Registrar and any other Officer of the Archdeaconry in which any such Church, Parish, Place, or Benefice, is included, shall respectively on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year, so long as any present Bishop's Secretary or Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer, or Record Keeper, of a Diocese or Bishoprick, or Registrar or other Officer of an Archdeaconry (as the case may be) from which any such Church, Parish, Place, or Benefice, has been so trans-ferred who was appointed to his Office before the 15th day of August, 1913, shall continue to hold such Office, pay to such last-mentioned Bishop's Secretary, Registrar, Apparitor-General, Sealer, or Record Keeper, of a Diocese or Bishoprick, or Registrar or other Officer of an Archdeaconry, one half of the net fees received by such Accounting Officer during the six months preceding the said 1st day of January or 1st day of July, as the case may be, for work done by such Accounting Officer in the exercise of his Office (or by any other Officer who may by usage or otherwise perform the duties of such Office) in or in relation to any Church, Parish, Place, or Benefice, so transferred, such fees to be calculated upon the scale of fees which shall be established for or shall be in force within the Diocese or Archdeaconry (as the case may be) of such Accounting Officer, and in computing such net fees there shall be deducted from the gross fees so received as aforesaid the out of pocket expenses incurred in relation to the matters in respect of which the fees have been received.

"12. Every Officer (other than the Chancellor of the Diocese and those referred to in
the last preceding clause of this Scheme) who
by virtue of an appointment bearing date prior
to the 15th day of August, 1913, now holds
any Office of emolument under the Archbishop
or Bishop of any Diocese, or the Dean and
Chapter of the Cathedral arch of any
Diocese, or otherwise in and or any Diocese
affected by the formation of the Diocese of
Sheffield, or by any Order of Your Majesty in
Council confirming this Scheme, or in and for
any part of any such Diocese, and who derived
or might have derived any portion of the
emoluments of his Office from sources arising
within Parishes or Places which by the formation of the Diocese of Sheffield, or by virtue of

any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, have been or shall be transferred from one Diocese to another, shall, for the term for which he was so appointed to his Office as aforesaid, or until his resignation or other avoidance thereof, continue within such transferred Parishes or Places to perform such duties in the same manner (that is to say either in person or by deputy as may be authorized by the terms of such his appointment) and to receive accordingly such emoluments (upon the scale which may be established or be in force in relation to such his Office in such transferred Parishes or Places) as an Officer of or within the Diocese to which such Parishes or Places have been so transferred as he has hitherto performed and received as an Officer of or within the Diocese wherein such Parishes or Places were formerly situate, and (if an Officer of the Bishop) shall as regards Parishes or Places transferred to the Diocese of Sheffield during his tenure of such his Office be one of the Officers mentioned in the second clause of this Scheme.

"13. Eighteen Honorary Canonries shall be founded in the said Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Sheffield, and it shall be lawful for the Bishop of Sheffield to appoint to such Honorary Canonries spiritual persons to whom the provisions of the 23rd section of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, in relation to the holders of Honorary Canonries founded thereunder, shall be applicable, save that so long as there shall be no Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church it shall be lawful for the Bishop of Sheffield of his own sole authority, and without the consent of any Dean and Chapter, to make regulations respecting the Honorary Canons so appointed, Provided always that any non-residentiary Prebendaries or Honorary Canons in the Cathedral Church of a Diocese of which any portion has been transferred to the said Diocese of Sheffield, who upon the foundation of the Bishoprick of Sheffield were holding Benefices in that part of such other Diocese which has now become part of the Diocese of Sheffield, and who by writing under their respective hands, duly registered or recorded as the Bishop of Sheffield shall direct, shall consent to such transfer, shall (notwithstanding anything in the last-mentioned Act and section contained) be transferred to and become Honorary Canons in the said Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Sheffield, and shall thereupon, that is to say, as to each of them upon his appointment as such Honorary Canon in the Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Sheffield cease, ipso facto, non-residentiary Prebendary or Honorary Canon in the Cathedral Church of such other Diocese, Provided also that in the first year after the passing of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme eight spiritual persons and no more (exclusive of any non-residentiary Prebendaries Honorary Canons who may be transferred from the Cathedral Church of another Diocese as aforesaid) may be appointed to Honorary Canonries in the said Cathedral Church of the Bishoprick of Sheffield.

"14. All terriers, tithe apportionments, maps, plans and other documents relating exclusively to any Parish or Parishes, Ecclesiastical Districts, or other Cures or Places situate within the Diocese of Sheffield as hereinbefore

defined, or otherwise relating exclusively to the said Diocese or relating exclusively to any part or parts of any Diocese hereinbefore recommended to be included in any other Diocese shall, subject to the provisions hereinbefore contained, be transferred from the custody of the Registrar or other Officer of the Diocese or of the Bishop of the Diocese within which the said Parish or Parishes, Ecclesiastical Districts, or other Cures or Places, were situate immediately before the foundation of the said Diocese of Sheffield as aforesaid, or (as the case may be) are now situate and shall become and be in the custody of such Registrar or other Officer or Officers of the Diocese or of the Bishop of the Diocese of Sheffield, or other the Diocese in which such Places are hereinbefore recommended to be included as the Bishop of such Diocese shall appoint in that behalf, and as to all documents which may remain in their present custody although relating to or affecting the Bishoprick of Sheffield, or any Parish, Ecclesiastical District, Cure, or Place, now situate in the Diocese of Sheffield as hereinbefore defined, or by this Scheme, and any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, transferred from one Diocese to another Diocese, the Registrar or other Officer of the Diocese of Sheffield or other the Diocese to which such Parish, Ecclesiastical District, Cure, or Place, shall be so transferred as aforesaid shall be at liberty at all convenient times to inspect such documents and take copies therefrom as freely as the Registrar or other Officer in whose custody such documents may so remain."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said Dioceses of York, Southwell, Wakefield, and Sheffield.

W HEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any Foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such Foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent

Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Îreaty was concluded on the 4th day of July, 1885, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the President of the Republic of Guatemala for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, in the case of which Treaty the Extradition Acts of 1870 and 1873 were applied by Order in Council of the 26th November, 1886:

And whereas a Protocol was concluded on the 30th day of May, 1914, between the British and Guatemalan Governments amending the

provisions of Article 10 of the said Treaty, which Protocol is in the terms following:—

Additional Protocol to the Treaty of Extradition between Great Britain and Guatemala.

THE Government of His Britannic Majesty and the Government of the Republic of Guatemala, being desirous of rendering more efficacious the provisions of article 10 of the Treaty of Extradition between Great Britain and Guatemala of the 4th July, 1885, the undersigned, duly authorized to that effect by their respective Governments, have agreed as follows:-

Protocolo adicional al Tratado de Extradición entre Guatemala y la Gran Bretaña.

Siendo el deseo del Gobierno de Majestad Británica y del Gobierno de la República de Guatemala, hacer eficaces las prescripciones del artículo 10 del Tratado de Extradición entre Guatemala y la Gran Bretaña, de 4 de julio de 1885, los infrascritos, debidamente autorizados para tal fin por sus respectivos Gobiernos, han convenido en lo siguiente:

ARTICLE 1.

The text of article 10 of the Extradition Treaty of the 4th July, 1885, is amended by the substitution of the words "sixty days" for the words "thirty days" in the last sentence of paragraph 1.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Protocol and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate at Guatemala City the 30th day of May, 1914.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I of Chapter 155 of "The Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906," and entitled "An Act respect-ing the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

DRAFT RULES under the Courts (Emergency Powers) Act, 1914, have been prepared and will shortly be issued.

The effect of the Rules will be that for the purposes of paragraph (a) of section one of the

Act the court to which application is made will be the court by which the judgment or order for the payment or recovery of a sum of money has been made or in which it is being sought; and for the purposes of paragraph (b)the court to which application is made will be the High Court, the County Court, or a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, according to the nature of the case.

The object of the Act and Rules is to prevent execution on or enforcement of a judgment or order if the court is of opinion that the inability is immediately to make the payment thereby directed by reason of circumstances attributable directly or indirectly to the present war.

And further under paragraph (b) that the court may have power to defer the operation of the remedy for such time and subject to such conditions as the court thinks fit, if they are of opinion that time should be given on the ground that the inability immediately to make the payment is by reason of circumstances attributable directly or indirectly to the present war; and on the hearing of the application by the court, there will be opportunity of placing before the court any of the circumstances.

GERMAN MERCHANT VESSELS DE-TAINED AT ANTWERP ON OUTBREAK OF HOSTILITIES.

With reference to the notification which appeared in the Supplementary London Gazette of the 2nd instant, respecting the claims of British owners of cargo on these vessels, His Majesty's Consul-General at Antwerp reports that, as the outcome of consultation with the Commission appointed to investigate such claims, it has been decided that the most satisfactory method of dealing with the matter would be for a British firm of high standing at Antwerp to undertake to represent the interested parties. would at the same time be reserved for those who wish to appoint their own agents.

Messrs. Gellatly Hankey and Company, of Antwerp, have in the meantime been good enough to offer their services for the purpose, and this offer has been accepted in the general interests of the British firms concerned.

British owners of cargo on those vessels, who may desire that their interests should be so represented, are accordingly advised to communicate in the matter with Messrs. Gellatly Hankey and Company at Antwerp, and to forward to that firm such documentary evidence as may be necessary to substantiate their claims.

YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) AND PEAK DISTRICT (SHEEP-DIPPING) ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Principal Order.

1. The Yorkshire (West Riding) and Peak District (Sheep-Dipping) Order of 1912 (herein referred to as "the principal Order") is modified by the substitution of Part I of this Order for Part I of that Order and otherwise as provided by this Order.

Part I.

MOVEMENT OF SHEEP OUT OF DIPPING AREA, AND EXPOSURE AT MARKETS, &C., WITHIN DIPPING AREA BETWEEN 31ST AUGUST AND 1ST OCTOBER.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of Dipping Area.

- 2.—(1.) Sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be moved out of the Dipping Area between the thirty-first day of August and the first day of October in each year unless—
 - (i.) they have been dipped twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than ten and not more than twenty-one days between the two dates, the second dipping having taken place within twenty-eight days before the date of movement, and are accompanied by a declaration signed by their owner, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the second dipping the sheep have been kept as far as practicable separate from other sheep not so dipped; or
 - (ii.) they are moved direct to a slaughterhouse having previous to such movement been marked by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each sheep, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (2.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Restriction on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, &c., within Dipping Area.

- 3. Between the thirty-first day of August and the first day of October in any year, sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in, any market, fairground, sale-yard, or place of exhibition in the Dipping Area unless they have been dipped—
 - (a) in the case of sheep on premises situate within the Dipping Area, twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than ten and not more than twenty-one days between the two dates, the second dipping having taken place within twenty-eight days before the date of entry or exposure; and
 - (b) in the case of sheep on premises situate outside the Dipping Area, once within twenty-eight days before the date of entry or exposure;

and are accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the dipping, or, where two dippings are required by this Order, since the second dipping, the sheep have been kept as far as practicable separate while in the Dipping Area from other sheep not so dipped.

Grant of Movement and Market Licences in special cases.

- 4.—(1.) Sheep may be moved out of the Dipping Area or be permitted to enter or be exposed for sale or exhibition in a market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in the Dipping Area with a movement licence or market licence, as the case may be, granted by an Inspector—
 - (a) upon production to him of a certificate by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the effect that he has within ten days before the licence is granted examined each of the sheep to be moved, and found it to be free from sheep-scab; and a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, to the effect that since such examination the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground, saleyard or exhibition; or
 - (b) upon production to him of an exemption from the annual compulsory dipping granted under Article 10 of the principal Order and relating to the sheep for which the licence is applied for.
- (2.) A licence under this Article shall only be granted where, in the opinion of the Inspector granting it, compliance with the provisions of Articles 2 and 3 is impracticable or inexpedient.
- (3.) A declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting a licence thereon. A certificate shall also be so retained unless it refers to more sheep than are proposed to be moved, in which case a note shall be made thereon and initialled by the Inspector who grants the licence, stating the number of the sheep for which the licence is granted. The licence shall be in force for eight days, inclusive of the day

of issue, and shall be in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule to the principal Order or to the like effect.

(4.) No certificate or declaration shall be required for the grant of a movement licence authorising movement of sheep out of the Dipping Area 1rom a market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition in the Dipping Area.

Special Provisions as to Lambs.

5. Where an Inspector of Local Authority is satisfied that any lambs in his District are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before movement for such purpose, or that the lambs are to be moved direct to a slaughterhouse, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority, by licence authorise the movement of the lambs to any market, fairground, saleyard, or other premises, whether in the Dipping Area or not, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the lambs may be moved in accordance with such licence and conditions, and be exposed for sale in the market, fairground, or saleyard free from any restrictions imposed by any Order of the Board; provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority unless the consent of such Local Authority, either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained. This Article does not apply to lambs more than nine months old.

PART II.

GENERAL.

Declaration after Dipping Period.

6.—(1.) The occupier of a farm or holding in the Dipping Area on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, on or after the first day of October, but not later than the fifteenth day of October, send a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep in the Form set forth in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is

(2.) In any case where the prescribed dipping period is extended the declaration shall be so sent not later than fourteen days after the expiration of the extension.
