A PROCLAMATION

VARYING THE PROCLAMATIONS IN RESPECT OF THE POSTPONEMENT OF PAYMENTS, DATED RESPECTIVELY THE 2ND AUGUST, 6TH AUGUST, 12TH AUGUST, AND 3RD SEPTEMBER, 1914.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS under the Postponement of Payments Act, 1914, We have power by Proclamation to authorise the postponement of the payment of any bill of exchange or of any negotiable instrument or any other payment in pursuance of any contract to such extent and for such time and subject to such conditions or other provisions as may be specified in the Proclamation:

AND WHEREAS in pursuance of that power We have issued Proclamations in relation to the postponement of payments due before We were in a state of war or due in respect of contracts made before that time, dated the sixth day of August, the twelfth day of August, and the third day of September, nineteen hundred and fourteen (which are respectively referred

to in this Proclamation as the first, second, and third General Proclamation), and on the second day of August, nineteen hundred and fourteen, We also issued a Proclamation which is confirmed by the said Postponement of Payments Act, 1914, and is deemed to have been issued under that Act and is referred to in this Proclamation as the Bills (Re-acceptance) Proclamation:

AND WHEREAS under the Postponement of Payments Act, 1914, We have power to vary, extend or revoke any Proclamation under that Act by a subsequent Proclamation:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable in the best interests of Our Realm at the present juncture that all persons who can discharge their liabilities should do so without delay, but it is at the same time expedient for the benefit of persons who cannot so discharge their liabilities that a further limited and final extension of the postponement of payments authorised by the said Proclamations should be made:

Now, THEREFORE, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby proclaim direct and ordain as follows:—

1. The first General Proclamation as ex-

tended by paragraph (b) of the second General Proclamation shall, subject to the limitations of this Proclamation, apply to payments which become due and payable on or after the fourth day of October and before the fourth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen (whether they so become due and payable by virtue of the said Proclamations or the third General Proclamation or otherwise), in like manner as it applies to payments which became due and payable after the date of the first General Proclamation and before the beginning of the fourth day of September, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Provided that, if the payment is one the date whereof has been postponed by virtue of any of the said General Proclamations, and is one which carries interest either by virtue of the terms of the contract or instrument under which it is due and payable or by virtue of the said General Proclamations, then the person from whom the payment is due shall not be entitled to claim the benefit of this Article unless, within three days after the date to which the payment has been postponed by virtue of the said General Proclamations, all interest thereon up to that date is paid.

This Article shall not apply to—

(a) Any payment in respect of rent;

(b) Any payment due and payable to or by a retail trader in respect of his business as such trader.

2. The Bills (Re-acceptance) Proclamation shall continue to apply to bills of exchange (other than cheques and bills on demand) accepted before the beginning of the fourth day of August, nineteen hundred and fourteen, the date of the original maturity whereof is after the third day of October.

If on the presentation for payment of any such bill the bill is not paid and is not re-accepted under the said Proclamation, then, unless on such presentation the acceptor has expressly refused re-acceptance thereof, the bill shall for all purposes, including the liability of any drawer and indorser or any other party thereto, be deemed to be due and payable on a date one calendar month after the date of its original maturity instead of on the date of its original maturity, and to be a bill for the original amount thereof increased by the amount of interest thereon, calculated from the date of the original maturity to the date of payment at the Bank of England rate current on the date of its original maturity, and paragraph (a) of the second General Proclamation shall not apply to any such bill.

3. If on the presentation for payment of a bill of exchange, the date of maturity of which has before the fourth day of October, nineteen hundred and fourteen, become postponed either by virtue of the Bills (Re-acceptance) Proclamation or paragraph (a) of the second General Proclamation (whether or not the date of maturity has been further postponed by virtue of the third General Proclamation), the bill is not paid, then the date of maturity shall be deemed to be further postponed for fourteen days from the date of such presentation for payment, and the original amount of the bill shall be deemed to be further increased by the amount of interest on the original amount of the bill for fourteen days, calculated at the

Bank of England rate current on the date of such presentation for payment.

4. Save as otherwise expressly provided, nothing in this Proclamation shall affect the application of the General Proclamations to payments to which those Proclamations apply, and nothing in this Proclamation shall prevent payments to which this Proclamation applies being made before the expiration of the period for which they are postponed thereunder.

A PROCLAMATION

EXTENDING THE PROHIBITIONS CONTAINED IN THE PROCLAMATION OF THE 9TH SEPTEMBER, 1914, RELATING TO TRADING WITH THE ENEMY.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS the State of War between Us and the German Empire and the State of War between Us and the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary referred to by Us in Our Proclamation of the ninth day of September, 1914, still continue to exist:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to extend the prohibitions contained in Our said Proclamation:

NOW, THEREFORE, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation declaring and it is hereby declared as follows:—

1. From and after the date of this Proclamation—

(1) The importation of such sugar as is hereinafter mentioned is prohibited.

(2) The following prohibition shall have effect (save so far as licences may be issued as hereinafter provided) in addition to the prohibitions contained in Our said Proclamation, and We do hereby accordingly warn all persons resident carrying on business or being in Our Dominions—

(a) Not directly or indirectly to import or cause or procure to be imported or to be concerned with the importation into any part of Our Dominions or into any other country or place whatever through or from any port in Europe of raw or refined sugar made or produced by an enemy or in an enemy country or refined sugar (wherever made or produced) made or produced from raw sugar made or produced by an enemy or in an enemy country.

(b) Not directly or indirectly to deal in any sugar as aforesaid.

2. And We do hereby further warn all persons that whoever in contravention of the law shall commit aid or abet any of the aforesaid acts is guilty of a crime and will be liable to punishment and penalties accordingly.

3. Nothing in this Proclamation shall be taken to prohibit anything which shall be expressly permitted by Our licence or by the licence given on Our behalf by a Secretary of State or the Board of Trade, whether such licence be granted especially to individuals or be announced as applying to classes of persons.

4. The words "enemy" and "enemy country" and "person" shall have the same meaning in this Our Proclamation as in Our said Proclamation of the ninth day of September, 1914.

WHEREAS His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, has been pleased to order that the Aliens Restriction Act, 1914, shall, under the provisions of The Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, extend to the Isle of Man:

And whereas, by the said Aliens Restriction Act, 1914, power is conferred upon His Majesty in time of War or imminent national danger or great emergency by Order in Council to impose restrictions on aliens and to make such provisions as may be necessary or expedient for carrying such restrictions into effect:

And whereas a state of War at present exists between Great Britain and Germany and also between Great Britain and Austria-Hungary:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. All aliens resident in the Isle of Man shall be registered in manner hereinafter provided.

2.—(1) For the purposes of this Order, the Chief Officer of Police of the said Island shall be the Registration Officer.

(2) The Registration Officer shall keep a Register wherein shall be entered particulars of all aliens resident in the said Island, as set out in the Schedule hereto.

(3) Every alien shall, as soon as may be, furnish to the Registration Officer particulars as to the matters set out in the Schedule to this Order.

(4) Every alien shall furnish to the Registration Officer any additional information which may be reasonably required for the purpose of

registering an alien or maintaining the correctness of the particulars entered on the Register.

3. An alien enemy shall not travel more than five miles from his registered place of residence unless furnished with a licence from the Registration Officer, which licence shall not cover a period exceeding twenty-four hours from the date of its issue and shall be returned to the Registration Officer at the end of the period for which it was issued.

4.—(1) An alien enemy shall not, except with the written permission of the Registration Officer, be in possession of—

(a) any firearms or other weapons, ammunition or explosives, or material intended to be used for the manufacture of explosives;

(b) any petroleum spirit, naphtha, benzol, petroleum, or other inflammable liquid in quantities exceeding three gallons;

(c) any apparatus or contrivance intended for, or capable of being used for, a signalling apparatus, either visual or otherwise;

(d) any carrier or homing pigeons;

(e) any motor car, motor cycle, motor boat, yacht, or aircraft;

(f) any cipher code or other means of conducting secret correspondence;

(g) any telephone installation;

(h) any camera or other photographic apparatus;

(i) any military or naval map, chart or handbook.

(2) If a justice of the peace is satisfied by information on oath that there is reasonable ground for suspecting any contravention of the foregoing provision, he may grant a search warrant authorizing any constable named therein to enter at any time any premises or place named in the warrant, if necessary by force, and to search the premises or place and every person found therein, and to seize any article which is being kept in the premises or place in contravention of this Article.

Where it appears to a superintendent or inspector of police, or any police officer of higher rank, that the case is one of great emergency, and that in the interests of the State immediate action is necessary, he may, by a written order under his hand, give to any constable the like authority as may be given by the warrant, of a justice under this Article.

5.—(1) The circulation among alien enemies of any newspaper wholly or mainly in the language of a State, or any part of a State, at war with His Majesty, is prohibited, unless the permission in writing of a Secretary of State has been first obtained, and such conditions as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State are complied with.

(2) In this Article the expression "newspaper" includes periodical.

6. If any person acts in contravention of or fails to comply with any provisions of this Order, he is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding six months, and the court before which he is convicted may, either in addition to or in lieu of any such punishment,

require that person to enter into recognizances with or without sureties to comply with the provisions of this Order or such provisions thereof as the court may direct.

If any person fails to comply with an order of the court requiring him to enter into recognizances the court may order him to be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding six months.

7. If any person furnishes or causes to be furnished to a Registration Officer any false particulars, or, with a view to obtaining any permit or permission under this Order, makes or causes to be made any false statement or false representation, he shall be deemed to have acted in contravention of this Order.

8. If any person aids or abets any person in any contravention of this Order, or knowingly harbours any person whom he knows or has reasonable ground for supposing to have acted in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed himself to have acted in contravention of this Order.

9. Any person who acts in contravention of this Order, or is reasonably suspected of having so acted, or being about so to act, may be taken into custody without warrant by any constable.

10.—(1) A Secretary of State may, if he thinks it necessary in the interests of public safety, direct that any of the provisions of this Order as to alien enemies shall in particular cases be applicable to other aliens, and thereupon such provisions shall apply accordingly.

(2) A Secretary of State may, if he thinks fit, direct that any powers or duties assigned under this Order to the Registration Officer shall be discharged by other persons deputed by the Secretary of State for the purpose.

11. For the purposes of this Order the expression "alien enemy" means an alien whose Sovereign or State is at War with His Majesty.

12. In the application of this Order the expression "court" means any court of summary jurisdiction and "justice of the peace" shall include a High Bailiff.

13. This Order may be cited as the "Aliens Restriction (Isle of Man) Order, 1914."

WHEREAS a state of war now exists between this country on the one hand and the German Empire and the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary on the other hand, so that His Majesty's fleets and ships may lawfully seize all ships, vessels and goods belonging to the German Empire or to the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary or the citizens and subjects of either country or other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories or dominions of the said Empire or of the said Dual Monarchy, and bring the same to judgment within any such Courts as shall be duly commissioned to take cognizance thereof.

AND WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Prize Courts (Egypt, Zanzibar, and Cyprus) Act, 1914, it is enacted that:—

"If His Majesty is pleased to confer jurisdiction in matters of prize on any of the following courts, that is to say:—

"(a) His Britannic Majesty's Supreme Court for the Dominions of the Sublime Ottoman Porte in Egypt;

"(b) His Britannic Majesty's Court for Zanzibar in Zanzibar;

"(c) The Supreme Court of Cyprus in Cyprus; the Court shall, in respect of the present war, have, under the Naval Prize Courts Acts, 1864 to 1914, the jurisdiction thereby conferred on a Vice-Admiralty Prize Court, and those Acts and any Order in Council made thereunder shall apply accordingly, subject to such modifications (if any) as to His Majesty in Council may appear expedient or necessary."

AND WHEREAS His Majesty is of opinion that jurisdiction in matters of prize should be conferred on all of the said courts:

HIS MAJESTY is therefore pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that a Commission in the form of the draft annexed hereto shall issue under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom authorizing the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral to will and require His Britannic Majesty's Supreme Court for the Dominions of the Sublime Ottoman Porte in Egypt, His Britannic Majesty's Court for Zanzibar in Zanzibar, and the Supreme Court of Cyprus in Cyprus, and all the Judges of those Courts to take cognizance of and judicially proceed upon all and all manner of captures, seizures, prizes and reprisals of all ships, vessels and goods that are or shall be taken, and all other matters of prize falling within the jurisdiction of Prize Courts, and to hear and determine the same and, according to the

course of Admiralty and the Law of Nations, and the Statutes, Rules, and Regulations for the time being in force in that behalf, to adjudge and condemn all such ships, vessels and goods as shall belong to the German Empire or to the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary or to the citizens or subjects of either country, or to any other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of the said Empire or of the said Dual Monarchy.

WHEREAS a state of war now exists between this Country on the one hand and the German Empire and the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary on the other hand so that His Majesty's fleets and ships may lawfully seize all ships, vessels and goods belonging to the German Empire or to the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary or to the citizens and subjects of either country or other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories or dominions of the said Empire or of the said Dual Monarchy and bring the same to judgment within any such Courts as shall be duly commissioned to take cognizance thereof.

And whereas by section 1 of the Prize Courts (Egypt, Zanzibar, and Cyprus) Act, 1914, it is enacted that:—

"If His Majesty is pleased to confer jurisdiction in matters of prize on any of the following Courts, that is to say:—

"(a) His Britannic Majesty's Supreme Court for the Dominions of the Sublime Ottoman Porte in Egypt;

"(b) His Britannic Majesty's Court for Zanzibar in Zanzibar;

"(c) The Supreme Court of Cyprus in Cyprus;

the Court shall, in respect of the present war, have, under the Naval Prize Courts Acts, 1864 to 1914, the jurisdiction thereby conferred on a Vice-Admiralty Prize Court, and those Acts and any Order in Council made thereunder shall apply accordingly, subject to such modifications (if any) as to His Majesty in Council may appear expedient or necessary."

AND WHEREAS We are of opinion that jurisdiction in matters of prize should be conferred on all of the said Courts.

THESE ARE THEREFORE to authorize and We do hereby authorize and enjoin you Our said Commissioners now and for the time being or

any two or more of you by Warrant to will and require His Britannic Majesty's Supreme Court for the Dominions of the Sublime Ottoman Porte in Egypt, His Britannic Majesty's Court for Zanzibar in Zanzibar, and the Supreme Court of Cyprus in Cyprus, and the judges of these Courts; and the said Courts and the judges thereof are hereby authorized and required, to take cognizance of and judicially proceed upon all and all manner of captures, seizures, prizes and reprisals of all ships, vessels and goods held, seized, and taken, and which hereafter shall be seized and taken, and all other matters of prize falling within the jurisdiction of Prize Courts and to hear and determine the same and, according to the course of Admiralty, and the Law of Nations and the Statutes, Rules, and Regulations for the time being in force in that behalf to adjudge and condemn all such ships, vessels and goods as shall belong to the German Empire or to the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary or to the citizens or subjects of either country or to any other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories or dominions of the said Empire or of the said Dual Monarchy.

In witness whereof We have caused the Great Seal of the United Kingdom to be put and affixed to these Presents.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Thirtieth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and in the Fifth year of Our reign.

PRIZE COURTS ACT, 1894.

NOTICE is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council the Draft of an Order in Council for the amendment of the Rules of Court regulating the procedure and practice of Prize Courts, approved as *provisional* Rules under section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, by Order in Council of the 5th August, 1914, and confirmed by Order in Council of the 17th September, 1914.

The said amending Rules were approved as *provisional* Rules under section 2 of the last-named Act by Order in Council of the 30th September, 1914.

Notice is hereby further given, that in accordance with the provisions of the last-named Act, copies of the proposed Rules can be obtained by any public body within forty days of the date of this Notice, at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Acts, 1860, and 1898.

that is to say, the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 142, and of the Act of the 61st and 62nd years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 23, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 14th day of May, in the year 1914, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Acts, 1860, and 1898, that is to say, the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 142, and of the Act of the 61st and 62nd years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 23, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a union of two contiguous Benefices situate within the Metropolis, and within the Diocese of London, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of All Saints, Mile End New Town, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, and for effecting certain other measures incidental to or arising out of such union.

"Whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, has caused proposals for a Scheme for effecting a union of the said two Benefices to be laid before us, which proposals were prepared under the seventh and eighth sections of the first-mentioned Act, and were approved by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, and were assented to by the Patrons of the two Benefices to be affected thereby, that is to say, by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as the Patron in right of his See of the said Benefice and Vicarage of All Saints, Mile End New Town, and by Thomas Pallister Young, of No. 29 Mark Lane, in the City of London, Esquire, William Claud Holdsworth Hunt, of No. 40 Trinity Square, in the said City of London, Esquire, Bryan Corcoran, of No. 31 Mark Lane, in the said City of London, Esquire, Robert Gresley Hall, of No. 24 Mark Lane, in the said City of London, Esquire, Arthur Tayler Young, of No. 29 Mark Lane, in the said City of London, Esquire, Nathaniel Fortescue, of Roman Wall House, Crutched Friars, in the said City of London, Esquire, Herbert George Pohl, of No. 25 Savage Gardens, in the said City of London, Esquire, Douglas Odell Kerr, of No. 59 Mark Lane, in the said City of London, Esquire, and Basil Carter Sharp, of No. 41 Crutched Friars, in the said City of London, Esquire, the Trustees of the Advowson of Saint Olave, Hart Street, as the Patrons of the said Benefice and Vicarage of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, and the same proposals were also assented to, subject to certain modifications, by the Vestries of the Parishes concerned, that is to say, by the Vestry of the Parish of All Saints, Mile End New Town, and by the Vestry of the Parish of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town.

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, to be expedient that the said proposed union of the said two Benefices should be effected, and that such arrangements relating thereto, and to the other matters hereinafter contained should be made as are hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the said Benefice of All Saints, Mile End New Town, is now full, the Reverend John Basil Rust, Clerk in Holy Orders, being the present Incumbent thereof,

and the said Benefice of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, is vacant.

"And whereas the said John Basil Rust has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect.

"And whereas the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron of the said Benefice of All Saints, Mile End New Town, and the said Trustees of the Advowson of Saint Olave, Hart Street, as the Patrons of the said Benefice of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, and the Vestries of the said Parishes respectively are willing that the Scheme for effecting the said union should embody certain modifications of the said proposals, and this present Scheme does embody the same modifications accordingly, but otherwise is based upon the said proposals.

"Now, therefore, with the Consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has to this Scheme set his hand and episcopal seal), and with the Consents of the said Thomas Pallister Young, William Claud Holdsworth Hunt, Bryan Corcoran, Robert Gresley Hall, Arthur Tayler Young, Nathaniel Fortescue, Herbert George Pohl, Douglas Odell Kerr, and Basil Carter Sharp, the Trustees of the Advowson of Saint Olave, Hart Street, (in testimony whereof they have to this Scheme set their hands and seals), and with the Consents of the Vestry of the said Parish of All Saints, Mile End New Town, and of the Vestry of the said Parish of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, (in testimony of which Consents this Scheme is signed in the case of each of the said Vestries by the Chairman of a Meeting of the same Vestry duly convened for the purpose of giving such Consent), we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council all that is in this Scheme contained under the several parts or headings hereinafter-mentioned as follows:—

"PART I.

"As to the proposed union itself, and certain immediate incidents thereof we recommend and propose:—

"1. That the said Benefice of All Saints, Mile End New Town, and the said Benefice of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, be united into one Benefice under the style of 'The Benefice of All Saints with Saint Olave, Mile End New Town,' which said United Benefice is hereinafter called the United Benefice.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect; and the said John Basil Rust, if he is then the Incumbent of the said Benefice of All Saints, Mile End New Town, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the said Diocese of London to admit the said John Basil Rust to the United Benefice without any form or fee of or for presentation, and he shall thereupon become the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"PART II.

"As to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and the Church of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, and certain Officers of the same, and certain matters connected therewith,

we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That upon the union taking effect the Church of All Saints, Mile End New Town, shall become, and thereafter continue to be, the Parish Church of the United Benefice.

"2. That upon the union taking effect the following articles belonging to the Church of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, shall be transferred to the Church of the United Benefice, namely, the bell, the altar books, two altar candlesticks, the vestry fittings and effects, the robes and surplices, the pictures and books, the clock, and twenty benches; and the remainder of the furniture and fittings (including the font, the communion table, the sacramental plate, and the stained glass windows) belonging to the Church of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, shall be transferred to the Church of the proposed New Benefice hereinafter mentioned, but any of such furniture or fittings as are not needed for that Church shall be transferred to such other Church or Chapel within the Diocese of London as the Bishop may select; provided always that any articles that shall not be appropriated in any of the above ways, except the font, communion table, and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the aggregate fund which is contemplated by Clause 3 of Part V. of this Scheme.

"3. That upon the union taking effect, if the tables of fees used in the two Churches be alike in all particulars, the table of fees used in the Church which will become the Church of the United Benefice shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the table of fees for the United Parishes, but if such tables of fees be not alike in all particulars, the same shall be of no authority, and a new table of fees shall be made by the proper authority for the use of the United Parishes as if the same were one Parish.

"4. That in the event of the services of any of the Church servants of the Parish of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, who at present hold Office being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect, such servants shall, out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, under the provisions of Part V. of this Scheme, receive such reasonable compensation as, having regard to the length of his or her or their tenure of office, and other circumstances of the case, shall seem to us and to the Bishop of the said Diocese of London equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us, if we shall see fit so to do, in all or in any of these cases to advance the compensation money, or any part thereof, out of the fund created by the twenty-second section of the said Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 142.

"5. That upon the final closing of the Church of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, the register books of baptisms, marriages, and burials of the Parish of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, shall be transferred to the Church of the United Benefice.

"PART III.

"As to the endowments of the United Benefice we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That upon the union taking effect all the properties, revenues and income constituting the endowments of the Vicarage of All Saints,

Mile End New Town, and all the properties, revenues and income constituting the endowments of the Vicarage of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, other than the annual sum of £600, which, under the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 22nd day of April, in the year 1872, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, is payable by the Rector of the United Rectory of Saint Olave, Hart Street, and All Hallows, Staining, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice.

"2. That upon the union taking effect, and the said John Basil Rust becoming the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, a sum of £150 per annum, being part of the said annual sum of £600, shall become payable to the Incumbent of the United Benefice by the Rector of the United Rectory of Saint Olave, Hart Street, and All Hallows, Staining, aforesaid, and such payment of £150 per annum shall continue so long as the said John Basil Rust remains Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if he shall retire from the United Benefice upon a pension under the Incumbents' Resignation Acts the said payment of £150 per annum shall continue payable to the Incumbent of the United Benefice so long as such pension continues payable, and upon the cesser of the said payment of £150 per annum, or if the said John Basil Rust do not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, then upon the union taking effect there shall become payable by the Rector of the said United Rectory of Saint Olave, Hart Street, and All Hallows, Staining, to the Incumbent of the United Benefice, and his successors, for ever, the yearly sum of £100 (part of the said annual sum of £600) Provided always that in the event of the said United Benefice being united to any other Benefice under the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Acts, 1860, and 1898, such payment of £150 per annum or (as the case may be) £100 per annum shall thereupon be reduced to £75 per annum.

"3. That the residue of the said annual sum of £600, after the deduction of the said payment to the Incumbent of the United Benefice, as provided in the last preceding clause of this Scheme, accruing between the date when the union shall take effect and the date of the licence or institution of the first Minister or Incumbent of the proposed new Benefice which is contemplated by Part VI. of this Scheme, together with any surplus accrued in respect of the income of the said Benefice of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, between the date of the last avoidance of the said Benefice and the date when the union shall take effect, shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be added to the aggregate fund which is contemplated by clause 3 of Part V of this Scheme.

"4. That from the date of the licence or institution of the first Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed new Benefice the residue of the said annual sum of £600 after the deduction of the annual payment to the Incumbent of the United Benefice as provided in clause 2 of this part of this Scheme, shall be paid by the Rector of the United Rectory of Saint Olave, Hart Street, and All Hallows, Staining, aforesaid, to the Minister or Incum-

bent of the said proposed new Benefice and to his successors for ever.

"5. That upon the union taking effect the present Parsonage House of the Vicarage of All Saints, Mile End New Town, shall be the Parsonage House of the United Benefice, and the present Parsonage House of the Vicarage of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, with its appurtenances, shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds arising from such sale or sales shall be added to the aggregate fund which is mentioned in clause 3 of Part V. of this Scheme.

"PART IV.

"Upon the subject of patronage, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"That the patronage of the United Benefice shall be vested in the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors for ever, and that the patronage of the new Church and Benefice, which are referred to in Part VI. of this Scheme shall be vested in the said Thomas Pallister Young, William Claud Holdsworth Hunt, Bryan Corcoran, Robert Gresley Hall, Arthur Tayler Young, Nathaniel Fortescue, Herbert George Pohl, Douglas Odell Kerr, and Basil Carter Sharp, the Trustees of the Advowson of Saint Olave, Hart Street, upon the same trusts, and subject to the same provisions, as affect the said Advowson of Saint Olave, Hart Street.

"PART V.

"As to the Church of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, and the site and appurtenances thereof, and as to the proceeds of any sale or sales of the materials, site, furniture or fittings of the same Church, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That as soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, be taken down.

"2. That subject to the provisions contained in clause 2 of Part II. of this Scheme, the furniture or fittings, and the materials and site of the said Church together with any ground annexed thereto, and necessary for the use or enjoyment thereof, shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, such sale or disposal being made in all respects subject to the provisions contained in the seventeenth Section of the said Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 142.

"3. That the net proceeds to arise from the sale or sales to be made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as aforesaid, of the site and materials and furniture or fittings of the said Church, shall form one aggregate fund, which, together with the sums hereinbefore directed to be added to such aggregate fund, shall be applied by us as follows, and in the following order, that is to say:—

"First in payment of the compensation or compensations mentioned in Part II., Clause 4, of this Scheme, or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of the payment of such

compensation or compensations as in the same Clause is provided.

"Secondly in or towards the acquisition of a suitable site for, and the erection of a new Church for, (and within the limits of), the new District constituted, or to be constituted, as contemplated by Part VI. of this Scheme, or in the repayment with interest at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum of any sum or sums advanced for that purpose out of any fund held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, the amount to be so applied being such as shall appear to us, and to the Bishop of London, to be adequate for that purpose.

"Thirdly in or towards the acquisition of a suitable site for and the erection of a Parsonage House or the purchase (and, if required, enlargement or alteration) of any existing suitable house for a Parsonage House for, and within the limits of, the said new District constituted, or to be constituted, as aforesaid, the amount to be so applied being such as to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and to the Bishop of London, shall appear to be reasonable.

"Fourthly as to any residue of the said aggregate fund in augmentation of the endowment of the Minister or Incumbent of the same new District.

"PART VI.

"As to a certain new District and Benefice, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That an Ecclesiastical District within the limits of the Metropolis, or its vicinity, (such District then having been, or then being about to be, formed or legally constituted under some or one of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, authorizing the formation or constitution of such District), shall be selected by the Bishop of London as the District for which a Church and a Parsonage House shall be provided out of the proceeds of the sale or sales hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

"2. That when a Church for such District has been built out of the proceeds of the sale or sales hereinbefore recommended, it shall be consecrated by the name and style of Saint Olave, or by such other name and style as may appear to the Bishop of the Diocese to be more expedient.

"Provided always that this Scheme shall not take effect until the Consents and approval, which by the seventeenth section of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1860, are made requisite to the sale or letting or appropriation under the powers conferred by that Act of the site of any Church, shall be obtained to the sale and appropriation hereby proposed of the Church of Saint Olave, Mile End New Town, and of the site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto, and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof, and provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid. or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months.

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 1ST OCTOBER 1914.)

**LINCOLNSHIRE (PARTS OF LINDSEY)
(FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE)
ORDER OF 1914 (No. 7).**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Withdrawal of Existing Orders.

1. The provisions of the Lincolnshire (Parts of Lindsey) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1914 (Nos. 4, 5, and 6) shall cease to operate, and instead of those provisions the following provisions shall take effect.

Prohibition of Movement out of Certain Area.

2. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals out of such Area where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

4. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of October, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the LINCOLNSHIRE (PARTS OF LINDSEY) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 7).
