PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 30th day of July, in the year 1914, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Barnabas, Woodside Park, situate within the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry)

of Christ Church, North End, Finchley, in the County of Middlesex, and in the Diocese

"Whereas at certain extremities of the New Parish of Christ Church, North End, Finchley, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint John, Whetstone, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several

Churches of such New Parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Christ Church, North End, Finchley, and of the said New Parish of Saint John, Whetstone, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Barnabas, Woodside Park, situate as afore-

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint John, Whetstone, and with the consents of Francis Augustus Bevan, of Number 54, Lombard Street, in the City of London, Banker, John Francis William Deacon, of Number 20, Birchin Lane, in the said City of London, Banker, the Reverend Ernest Newton Sharpe, of the Holy Trinity Rectory, St. Marylebone, in the County of Middlesex, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Reverend Henry Lawe Corry Vully de Candole, of Clifton Vicarage, Bristol, Clerk in Holy Orders, and the Reverend Edward Grose Hodge, of the Vicarage, Paddington, in the said County of Middlesex, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Christ Church, North End, Finchley, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, North End, Finchley, and of the said New Parish of Saint John, Whetstone, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Barnabas, Woodside Park, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Woodside Park.'
"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your

Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall

seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Woodside Park, comprising:

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Christ Church, North End, Finchley, in the County of Middlesex, and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Long Lane, Finchley, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west partly by the Parish of Hendon, partly by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Mill Hill, both in the said County and Diocese, and partly by the Parish of Totteridge, in the County of Hertford, and in the Diocese of Saint Albans, upon the north and upon part of the east by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint John, Whetstone, in the said County of Middlesex, and in the said Diocese of London, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the east and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Whetstone, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, North End, Finchley, at the junction of the road called Torrington Park with the great North Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of the Great North Road for a distance of seven chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Percy Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Percy Road for a distance of nine chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Grange Avenue, and extending thence southward along the middle of Grange Avenue for a distance of four chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 27, Grange Avenue, and continuing thence southward in the same direction and in a straight line across the premises attached to the said house for a distance of six yards or thereabouts to the fence forming the southern boundary of such premises, and extending thence west-ward along the last mentioned fence and fences forming the southern the boundaries of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Grange Avenue for a distance in all of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to a point on the south-eastern side of Netherfield Road, and extending thence first westward to and then south-westward along the middle of Netherfield Road for a distance of six chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with Nether Street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Nether Street (thereby crossing the High Barnet Branch Line of the Great Northern Railway) for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to the point where such road is crossed by the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, North End, Finchley, from the said New Parish of Saint

Paul, Long Lane, Finchley.
"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Whetstone, which is bounded upon the south by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, North End, Finchley, upon the west by the said Parish of Totteridge, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the north-east, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Totteridge from the said New Parish of Saint John, Whetstone, at the centre of the footbridge which carries the footpath leading from Totteridge Green to the northern end of Holden Road across Dollis Brook, and extending thence first south-eastward, then eastward, and then again south-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Holden Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Holden Road for a distance of two chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Holden Road across the High Barnet Branch Line of the Great Northern Railway, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the premises attached to the house known as Woodside Grange, and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of three chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of Woodside Grange Road, and extending thence first eastward to the middle of Wood-side Grange Road, and then first north-eastward, then eastward, and then again northeastward along the middle of such road for a distance in all of nine chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Woodside Avenue, and extending thence southward along the middle of Woodside Avenue for a distance of five chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the boundary between the

house and premises known as Highfield and the house and premises known as St. Andrew's, and extending thence eastward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of Church Path, and extending thence first eastward to and then southward along the middle of Church Path for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Frederick's Place, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Frederick's Place, for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Great North Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of the Great North Road for a distance of eight chains and threequarters or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Whetstone, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, North End, Finchley."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the pursuant Majesty, London Gazette to the And His by and the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, it is (amongst other things) provided that, if a majority of the whole Council of a Borough agree to petition, and the Council thereupon petition, The King for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the Borough, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, from time to time, by Order in Council, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough shall be divided, and that the Borough shall be divided into that number of Wards, and that where an Order in Council has been so made the Secretary of State shall appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of the Wards and apportioning the Councillors among them.

And whereas a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Pontefract did, on the 4th day of March, 1914, agree to petition, and the Council of the said Borough thereupon petitioned, His Majesty for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough.

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 14th day of May, 1914, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough of Pontefract should be henceforth divided, and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be six.

And whereas on the 29th day of May, 1914, the Right Honourable Reginald McKenna, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Harold McKenna, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of such Wards, and for apportioning the Councillors of the said Borough among such Wards.

And whereas by Section 30 (5) of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is provided that, in case of alteration of Wards, the Commissioner shall so apportion among the altered Wards the Councillors for those Wards as to provide for their continuing to represent as large a number as possible of their former constituents.

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 29th day of July, 1914:-

"BOROUGH OF PONTEFRACT.

"I, Harold McKenna, in pursuance of the powers given me by virtue of the appointment under the said Act, do hereby determine, as hereinafter mentioned, the boundaries of the six Wards into which the said Borough is divided, which Wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows, that is to say:-

No. 1. West Ward. No. 2. North Ward.

No. 3. East Ward.

No. 4. South Ward.

No. 5. MILL HILL WARD.

No. 6. CENTRAL WARD.

And where in the following descriptions of the Ward boundaries (so far as such descriptions do not refer to the Borough boundary) a street, road or footpath is given as the boundary of a Ward, the boundary is to be taken as the centre of such street, road or footpath, and where any street or road is described as joining another street or road, the point of junction is to be taken as the point at which lines drawn along the centres of the two streets or roads and continued would intersect each other, and a point described as being opposite a street or road is to be taken as opposite the centre of the street or road.

And where a river or stream is given as the boundary of a Ward, the boundary (except when it refers to the Borough boundary) is to be taken as the medium filum of such river or

No. 1. WEST WARD.

I do hereby determine that West Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Pontefract as is contained within the following boundary:-

Commencing at the northern boundary of the Borough at the point of intersection of the Borough boundary with the Leeds and Barnsdale Main Road and thence proceeding in a south-easterly and easterly direction along the centre of the Leeds and Barnsdale Main Road to the intersection of Back Tanshelf thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Back Tanshelf to and along the centre of Crab Hill and Love Lane to the Pontefract Barracks wa?l thence following the said wall in a south-easterly direction to the centre of the Wakefield and Weeland Main Road thence along the centre of the said road in a south-westerly direction to the Borough boundary thence following the Borough boundary in a generally

northerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 2. NORTH WARD.

I do hereby determine that North Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Pontefract as is contained within the following boundary:—

Commencing at the northern boundary of the Borough at the point of intersection of the Borough boundary with the Leeds and Barns-dale Main Road thence along the centre of the said road in a south-easterly direction following the eastern boundary of West Ward as hereinbefore described to the junction of Watergate thence along the centre of Watergate in a north-easterly direction to its terminus in Sessions House Yard thence north-eastward along the centre of Headlands Lane to and along the centre of Skinner Lane to the intersection of Backnorthgate thence north-eastward along the centre of Backnorthgate to its junction with Northbaileygate and continuing north-eastward along the centre of North-baileygate to the junction of Mill Dam Road thence in a north-westerly direction along the centres successively of Mill Dam Road, Monk-hill Lane and Spittall Hardwick Lane to the Borough boundary at Toll Hill thence following the Borough boundary commencing in a westerly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 3, East Ward.

I do hereby determine that East Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Ponte-fract as is contained within the following boundary:

Commencing on the northern boundary of the Borough at the point of intersection of the eastern boundary of North Ward as herein-before described with the Borough boundary and thence following the said eastern boundary of North Ward in a south-easterly direction to the intersection of Backnorthgate with Skinner Lane thence south-eastward along the centre of Cockpit Lane across Northgate and continuing to and along the centre of Trinity Street to the centre of Horsefair thence along the centre of Horsefair north-eastward and continuing north-eastward along the centres successively of Micklegate, Castle Chain, the Booths and Northbaileygate to the intersection of the Wakefield and Weeland Road thence along the centre of the said road in a north-easterly direction to the Borough boundary near Bubwith Bridge thence following the Borough boundary commencing in a north-westerly direction to the point of commencement afore-

No. 4. South Ward.

I do hereby determine that South Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Ponte-fract as is contained within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point on the Borough boundary at the intersection of the southern boundary of East Ward as hereinbefore described with the Borough boundary thence proceeding commencing in a southerly direction and following the Borough boundary to the point at which the public footpath from Carleton Lane to Green Lane intersects the Borough boundary thence in a straight line to the point of conjunction of Friarwood Lane and Friar-

wood Steps thence along the centre of Friarwood Steps to the intersection of the Wakefield and Weeland Main Road thence along the centre of the said road in a north-easterly direction to the intersection of Gillygate thence along the centre of Gillygate to the intersection of Bridge Street thence along the centres successively of Bridge Street and Horsefair and thence continuing following the southern boundary of East Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 5. MILL HILL WARD.

I do hereby determine that Mill Hill Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Pontefract as is contained within the following boundary:—

Commencing at the Borough boundary at the intersection of the public footpath from Carleton Road to Green Lane with the Borough boundary thence following the western boundary of South Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of conjunction of Friarwood Steps with the Wakefield and Weeland Main Road thence south-westward along the centre of the said road to the intersection of Newgate thence along the centre of Newgate to the intersection of Newgate and Love Lane thence following the boundary of West Ward as hereinbefore described in a generally westerly direction to the Borough boundary and thence following the Borough boundary commencing in a southeasterly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

No. 6. CENTRAL WARD.

I do hereby determine that Central Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Pontefract as is contained within the following boundary:—

Commencing at the point of conjunction of Friarwood Steps with the Wakefield and Weeland Main Road thence continuing commencing in a westerly direction and following successively the boundaries of Mill Hill Ward, West Ward, North Ward, East Ward and South Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

And I do hereby assign and apportion three Councillors to each and every of the said Wards as follows, that is to say:—

To No. 1. West Ward.

Councillors:—Richard Pulleine Husband, Samson Garside, and Thomas Hiley.

To No. 2. North Ward.

Councillors: —George Spurr, Walter Scholfield, and Edwin Heckingbottom.

To No. 3. East Ward.

Councillors:—Archibald Scholfield, Joseph Edward Booth, and Thomas Firth.

To No. 4. South Ward.

Councillors:—Charles Pease, John Harner Ramsden, and Thomas Glover.

To No. 5. Mill Hill Ward.

Councillors: —William Bentley, Benjamin Thomas Wales, and George Richard Hemingway.

To No. 6. Central Ward.

Councillors: -Oswald Holmes, Fred Austwick, and Edward Lee.

> Harold McKenna," Commissioner."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said Scheme of the said Commissioner into consideration, doth hereby, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, approve thereof, and order that the same be published in the London Gazette accordingly.

WHEREAS by Treaty, Capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of the King of Siam:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as "The Siam

Order in Council, 1914."

2. In the construction of this Order the following words and expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant thereto, that is to say:-

"Administration" means letters of administration, including the same with will annexed or granted for special or limited purposes, or limited in duration. "The Minister" means His Majesty's

Minister, and includes Chargé d'Affaires or other chief Diplomatic Representative of His Majesty in Siam for the time being. "British Ship" includes every ship which

is a British Ship within the meaning of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and every ship which belongs to a British Subject and is not registered under a foreign flag.
"British Subject" includes a British-

protected person.
"Consular Officer" includes a Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, Consular Agent, or Pro-Consul of His Majesty resident in Siam, including a person acting temporarily, with the approval of the Secretary of State, as a Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent, and shall also include a First and Second Assistant and Acting Assistant in the Consular Service for Siam.

"The Court," except where the context otherwise requires, means the Court estab-

lished under this Order.

- "Foreigner" means a subject or citizen of a State in amity with His Majesty, other than Siam.
- "Legal practitioner" includes barristerat-law, advocate, solicitor, writer to the signet, and any person possessing similar qualifications.

"Master," with respect to any ship, includes every person (except a pilot) having command or charge of that ship.

"Month" means calendar month.

"Oath" and "affidavit," in the case of persons for the time being allowed by law to affirm or declare, instead of swearing, include affirmation and declaration, and the expression "swear," in the like case, includes affirm and declare.

"Office copy" means a copy made under the direction of the Court, or produced to the proper Officer of the Court for examination with the original, and examined by him and sealed with the seal of the Court.

"Person" includes Corporation. "Pounds" means pounds sterling.

"Prescribed" means prescribed by Rules

of Court.
"Proved" means shown by evidence on oath, in the form of affidavit, or other form, to the satisfaction of the Court; and "proof" means the evidence adduced in that behalf.

"Resident" means having a fixed place

of abode in Siam.
"Rules of Court" means Rules Court made under the provisions of this

"Secretary of State" means one of His

Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.
"Ship" includes any vessel used in navigation, however propelled, with her tackle, furniture, and apparel, and any boat or other craft.

"The Treasury" means the Commis-

sioners of His Majesty's Treasury.

"Treaty" includes any Convention, Agreement, or Arrangement, made by or on behalf of His Majesty with any State or Government, King, Chief, people, or tribe, whether His Majesty the King of Siam is or is not a party thereto.
"Will" means will, codicil, or other testa-

mentary instrument.

Expressions used in any rules, regulations, or orders made under this Order shall, unless a contrary intention appears, have the same respective meanings as in this Order.

3.—(1) Words importing the plural or the singular may be construed as referring to one person or thing, or to more than one person or thing, and words importing the masculine as referring to the feminine (as the case may require).

(2) Where this Order confers any power or imposes any duty, then, unless a contrary intention appears, the power may be exercised and the duty shall be performed from time to

time as occasion requires.

(3) Where this Order confers a power or imposes a duty on, or with respect to, a holder of an office, as such, then, unless a contrary intention appears, the power may be exercised and the duty shall be performed by, or with respect to, the holder for the time being of the office or the person temporarily acting for the holder.

(4) Where this Order confers a power to

make any rules, regulations, or orders, the power shall, unless a contrary intention appears, be construed as including a power exercisable in the like manner and subject to the like consent and conditions, if any, to rescind, revoke, vary, or amend the rules, regulations, or orders.

- (5) This Article shall apply to the construction of any rules, regulations, or orders made under this Order, unless a contrary intention appears.
- 4. The provisions of this Order shall not operate except with respect to:-
 - (i) Civil cases which have been transferred by an exercise of the right of evocation in accordance with the Protocol printed in the Schedule hereto from the International Courts established in Siam to the Court established under this Order; and
 - (ii) Non-contentious business in relation to the probate of wills and the administration of the estates of deceased British Subjects who were registered in Siam as British Subjects on or before the 10th day of March, 1909;

but subject thereto shall extend to the persons and matters following, in so far as by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means, His Majesty has jurisdiction in Siam in relation to such matters and things, that is to say:

(1) British subjects, as herein defined,

within the limits of this Order.

(2) The property and all personal or proprietary rights and liabilities in Siam of British subjects, whether such subjects are within the said limits or not.

(3) Siamese subjects and foreigners in the cases and according to the conditions specified

in this Order, and not otherwise.

(4) Foreigners, with respect to whom any State, King, Chief, or Government, whose subjects or under whose protection they are, has by any Treaty as herein defined or otherwise agreed with His Majesty for, or consents to, the exercise of power or authority by His Majesty.

(5) British Ships with their boats, and the persons and property on board thereof, or belonging thereto, being within the Siamese

dominions.

- 5. All His Majesty's jurisdiction exercisable in Siam for the hearing and determination of civil matters, or for the maintenance of order, or for the control or administration of persons or property, or in relation thereto, shall be exercised under and according to the provisions of this Order, and not otherwise.
- 6.—(1) There shall be a Court styled "His Britannic Majesty's Court for Siam'' (in this Order referred to as "the Court for Siam," or the Court ").
- (2) The members of the Court shall be the Consular Officers, but-
 - (i) As regards the commissioned Consular Officers, with such exceptions, if any, as the Secretary of State from time to time thinks fit to make; and
 - (ii) As regards the uncommissioned Consular Officers, with such exceptions, if any, as the Minister from time to time thinks fit to make by writing signed by him.
- B) Each member of the Court, in exercising the jurisdiction thereof in conformity with

Order, be deemed to form and be the Court; and the term "the Court for Siam" or "the Court" in this Order includes and applies to the Court of Siam and every member so exercising jurisdiction.

- (4) Subject to the provisions of this Order, and to any directions of the Secretary of State, each member of the Court may exercise the jurisdiction thereof at any place in Siam where he may happen to be in the course of his official duties.
- (5) The Court for Siam shall be a court of record.
- 7.—(1) There shall be attached to the Court for Siam a Registrar, a Marshal, and such other officers and clerks under such designations as the Minister thinks fit.
- (2) Every officer and clerk thus attached shall discharge such duties and exercise such powers in connection with the Court as may be prescribed, subject to any instructions of the Minister.
- 8. The Court for Siam shall have a seal, bearing the style of the Court, and such device as the Secretary of State approves; but the seal in use at the commencement of this Order shall continue to be used until a new seal is
- 9. Subject to the provisions of this Order civil cases may be tried in the Court by the Court itself, or by the Court with Assessors.
- 10.—(1) An Assessor shall be a competent and impartial British subject of good repute, nominated and summoned by the Court for the purpose of acting as Assessor.
- (2) There may be one Assessor or two Assessors, as the Court thinks fit.
- (3) An Assessor shall not have any voice in the decision of the Court in any case; but an Assessor dissenting from any decision of the Court may record in the Minutes his dissent, and the grounds thereof, and shall be entitled to receive without payment a certified copy of the Minutes.
- (4) If any person summoned to act as Assessor fails, without lawful excuse, to attend at the trial, or at any adjournment thereof, or to continue to serve throughout the trial, he shall be liable, under a summary order of the Court, to a fine not exceeding £10.
- 11. Where a case is transferred to the Court from an International Court, the Court shall give such directions as seem proper for its determination, having regard to the proceedings (if any) in the International Court. In determining such case the Court shall, subject to the provisions of this Order, apply any Siamese law other than a law relating to procedure, which would have been applied in the International Court.
- 12. In matters of procedure the jurisdiction of the Court shall, subject to the provisions of this Order, or any other Order in Council, or to Rules of Court, be exercised, as far as circumstances admit, in accordance with English law and practice for the time being.
- 13.—(1) Any member of the Court may, either of his own motion or on the application of any of the parties to the case, report to the Minister that a case which has been tried before him is proper to be re-heard.
- (2) The Minister may, either of his own motion or on the application of any of the this Order, shall, for the purposes of this parties to the case, direct that any case which

has been tried before the Court shall be re-

- (3) The Minister shall thereupon select two members of the Court to re-hear the case in question at such place as he may think convenient, and the case shall thereupon be re-heard accordingly. At such re-hearing the Court may give any judgment and make any order which ought to have been made, an may make such further or other order as the case may require.
- 14.—(1) There shall be no appeal to His Majesty the King in Council from a decision of the Court for Siam, except by special leave of His Majesty in Council.
- (2) Where special leave to appeal to His Majesty in Council is granted, the appeal shall be admitted on such terms and in such manner as His Majesty in Council may think fit.
- 15. Subject to the provisions of this Order and of the Foreign Jurisdiction (Probates Order in Council, 1908, the non-contentious probate jurisdiction of the Court for Siam, as described in Article 4 (ii) of this Order, shall be exercised, as far as circumstances admit, in conformity with English law for the time being.
- 16. All real or immovable property situate in Siam, and belonging at the time of his death to any British Subject, shall be deemed to be personal estate; and the devolution thereof, in case of intestacy, shall be regulated according to the law of England for the time being relating to personal estate.
- 17.—(1) The Court for Siam shall, as far as circumstances admit, have, for and within Siam, with respect to the wills and the property in Siam of deceased British subjects, all such jurisdiction as for the time being belongs to the High Court in England.
- (2) Probate or administration granted by the Court under this Order shall have effect over all the property of the deceased within Siam, and shall effectually discharge persons dealing with an executor or administrator thereunder, notwithstanding that any defect afterwards appears in the grant.
- 18. Section 51 of the Conveyancing (Scotland) Act, 1874, and any enactment for the time being in force amending or substituted for the same, are hereby extended to Siam, with the adaptation following, namely:—

The Court for Siam is hereby substituted for a Court of Probate in a Colony.

19.—(1) Where a Court of Probate in the United Kingdom or in any British Possession to which the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, for the time being extends has granted probate or letters of administration or confirmation in respect of the estate of a deceased person, the probate letters or confirmation so granted may, on being produced to, and a copy thereof deposited with, the Court for Siam, be sealed with the seal of that Court, and thereupon shall be of the like force and effect and have the same operation as if granted by that Court.

(2) The Court for Siam may, if it thinks fit, on the application of any creditor, require, before sealing, that adequate security be given for the payment of debts due from the estate

to creditors residing in Siam.

(3) For the purposes of this Article a duplicate of any probate or letters of administration or confirmation sealed with the seal of the Court granting the same, or a copy thereof certified as correct by or under the authority of

the Court granting the same, shall have the same effect as the original.

- 20.—(1) Where a British Subject dies in Siam or elsewhere, intestate, then, until administration is granted, his personal property in Siam shall be vested in the Court for Siam.
- (2) The Court shall, where the circumstances of the case appear to the Court so to require, forthwith on his death, or as soon after as may be, take possession of his personal property within the jurisdiction, or put it under the seal of the Court, (in either case, if the nature of the property or other circumstances so require, making an inventory), and so keep it until it can be dealt with according to law.
- 21. If any person named executor in the will of the deceased takes possession of and administers or otherwise deals with any part of the personal property of the deceased, and does not obtain probate within one month after the death, he shall be deemed guilty of a contempt of Court, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £50.
- 22. If any person, other than the person named executor or an administrator or an Officer of the Court, takes possession of and administers or otherwise deals with any part of the personal property of a deceased British Subject, whether resident or not, he shall be deemed guilty of a contempt of Court, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £50.
- 23. Where a person appointed executor in a will survives the testator, but either dies without having taken probate, or, having been called on by the Court to take probate, does not appear, his right in respect of the executorship wholly ceases; and without further renunciation the representation to the testator and the administration of his property shall go and may be committed as if that person had not been appointed executor.
- 24.—(1) Where a British Subject dies in Siam, any other such Subject having in his possession, or under his control, any paper or writing of the deceased, being, or purporting to be, testamentary, shall, where no suit or proceeding respecting probate or administration is pending, forthwith bring the original to the Court and deposit it there.

If any person fails to do so for fourteen days after having knowledge of the death of the deceased, he shall be deemed guilty of a contempt of Court, and liable to a fine not

exceeding £50.

(2) Where it is proved that any paper of the deceased, being, or purporting to be, testamentary, is in the possession or under the control of a British Subject, the Court may, where no suit or proceeding respecting probate or administration is pending, order him to produce the paper and bring it into Court.

- (3) Where it appears to the Court that there are reasonable grounds for believing that any person has knowledge of any paper, being, or purporting to be, testamentary, (although it is not shown that the paper is in his possession or under his control), the Court may order that he be examined respecting it before the Court or elsewhere, and that he do attend for that purpose, and after examination order that he do produce the paper and deposit it in Court.
- 25. Where it appears to the Court that the value of the property or estate of a deceased person does not exceed £100, the Court may,

without any probate or letters of administration, or other formal proceeding, pay thereout any debt or charges, and pay, remit, or deliver any surplus to such persons and subject to such conditions, as the Court thinks proper, and shall not be liable to any action, suit, or proceedings in respect of anything done under this Article. Every proceeding of the Court under this Article shall be recorded in the Minutes.

26.—(1) In every case Minutes of the proceedings shall be drawn up, and shall be signed by the Consular Officer before whom the proceedings are taken, and shall, where the trial is held with assessors, be open for their inspection and for their signature if concurred in by

(2) These Minutes, with the depositions of witnesses, and the notes of evidence taken at the hearing or trial by the Consular Officer before whom the proceedings are taken, shall be preserved in the public office of the Court.

27.—(1) The Minister may make Rules of Court for the regulation of all matters of pro-

cedure.

Provision may, amongst other things, be made by such Rules:

For prescribing forms of procedure;

(b) For regulating the mode in which legal practitioners are to be admitted to

practice as such;

(c) For prescribing and enforcing the fees to be taken in respect of any proceedings under this Order, not exceeding, as regards any matters provided for by Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891, fees fixed and allowed from time to time by any Order in Council made under that Act

(d) For prescribing a scale of payments to be made to a witness or assessors, and the conditions upon which an order may be made by the Court for such payments

(e) For prescribing scales of costs to be paid to practitioners.

(2) Rules framed under this Article shall not have effect until approved by the Secretary of State, and, so far as they relate to fees and costs, sanctioned by the Treasury; but in case of urgency declared in any such Rules, the same shall have effect unless and until they are disapproved by the Secretary of State, and notification of such disapproval is received and

(3) In relation to matters to which such Rules do not extend, the Court may adopt and use any procedure or forms heretofore in use in the Court for Siam, with any modifications or adaptations which may be necessary.

28.—(1) The Court may, in any case, if it thinks fit, on account of the poverty of a party, or for any other reason, dispense with the pay-

ment of any fee in whole or in part.

published by the Minister.

(2) Payment of fees payable under any Rules to be made in pursuance of this Order, and of costs and of charges and expenses of witnesses, and of other charges and expenses, and of fines respectively payable under this Order, may be enforced under order of the Court by seizure and sale of goods, and, in default of sufficient goods, by imprisonment as a civil prisoner for a term not exceeding one month; but such imprisonment shall not operate as a satisfaction or extinguishment of the liability.

(3) Any bill of sale or mortgage or transfer

of property made with a view of avoiding seizure or sale of goods or ship under any provision of this Order shall not be effectual to defeat the provisions of this Order.

29.—(1) Every person doing an act or taking a proceeding in the Court as plaintiff in a case, or otherwise, shall do so in his own

name and not otherwise, and either-

(a) By himself; or(b) By a legal practitioner; or

(c) By his attorney or agent thereunto lawfully authorized in writing and approved by the Court.

- (2) Where the act is done or proceeding taken by an attorney (other than a legal practitioner) or by an agent, the power of attorney, or instrument authorizing the agent, or an authenticated copy thereof, shall be first filed in the Court.
- (3) Where the authority has reference only to the particular proceeding, the original document shall be filed.
- (4) Where the authority is general, or has reference to other matters in which the attorney or agent is empowered to act, an authenticated copy of the document may be
- (5) Any person doing any act or taking any proceeding in the Court in the name or on behalf of another person, not being lawfully authorized thereunto, and knowing himself not to be so authorized, is guilty of a contempt of

30.—(1) In any case, and at any stage thereof, the Court, either of its own motion or on the application of any party, may summon a British Subject to attend to give evidence, or to produce documents, or to be examined.

- (2) If the person summoned, having reasonable notice of the time and place at which he is required to attend, and his reasonable expenses having been paid or tendered, fails to attend and be sworn, and give evidence, or produce documents or submit to examination accordingly, and does not excuse his failure to the satisfaction of the Court, he shall be deemed guilty of a contempt of Court, and shall be liable to a fine of £5.
- 31. The Court for Siam may, if it thinks fit, order that a Commission do issue for examination of witnesses at any place out of Siam on oath, by interrogatories or otherwise, and may, by order, give such directions touching the time, place, and manner of the examination, or anything connected therewith, as to the Court appear reasonable and just.
- 32.—(1) Where any civil case in which a Siamese or foreigner is plaintiff is transferred to the Court from any International Court in Siam, the Court shall hear and determine the case in all respects according to the ordinary course of the Court.
- (2) Provided that the Court may, if it thinks fit, first require the Siamese or foreigner to obtain and file in the Court the consent in writing of the competent authority on behalf of his own nation to his submitting to the jurisdiction of the Court, and to give security to the satisfaction of the Court, and to such reasonable amount as the Court thinks fit, by deposit or otherwise, to pay fees, damages, costs, and expenses, and abide by and perform such decision as shall be given by the Court.

(3) A cross action shall not be brought in any such case against a plaintiff, being a

Siamese or foreigner.

- (4) Where a Siamese or foreigner obtains in any such case an order against a defendant being a British Subject, and in another suit that defendant is plaintiff and the Siamese or foreigner is defendant, the Court may, if it thinks fit, on the application of the British Subject, stay the enforcement of the order pending that other suit, and may set off any amount ordered to be paid by one party in one suit against any amount ordered to be paid by the other party in the other suit.
- (5) Where a plaintiff, being a Siamese or foreigner, obtains in any such case an order of the Court against two or more defendants being British Subjects jointly, and in another action one of them is plaintiff and the Siamese or foreigner is defendant, the Court may, if it thinks fit, on the application of the British Subject, stay the enforcement of the order pending that other action, and may set off any amount ordered to be paid by one party in one action against any amount ordered to be paid by the other party in the other action, without prejudice to the right of the British Subject to require contribution from his co-defendants under the joint liability.
- (6) Where in any such case a Siamese or foreigner is co-plaintiff in a suit with a British Subject who is within the jurisdiction, it shall not be necessary for the foreigner to give security for costs, unless the Court so directs, but the co-plaintiff British Subject shall be responsible for all fees and costs.
- 33. Where, by virtue of any Imperial Act or of this Order or otherwise, any provisions of any Imperial Acts, or of any Law or of any Orders in Council other than this Order, are applicable in Siam, or any forms, regulations, or procedure prescribed or established by or under any such Act or Law or Order, are made applicable for any purpose of this Order, such Act, Law, Order, form, regulation, or procedure shall be deemed applicable so far only as the constitution and jurisdiction of the Court and the local circumstances permit; and, for the purpose of facilitating application, may be construed or used with such alterations and adaptations as may be necessary, and anything required to be done by, to, or before any Court, Judge, Officer, or Authority may be done by, to, or before the Court, Consular Officer, or Authority having the like or analogous functions, or by, to, or before any Officer, delegated by the Minister or by the Court (as the case may require) for that purpose; and the seal of the Court may be substituted for any other seal; and in case any difficulty occurs in the application, it shall be lawful for the Minister to direct by, to, or before whom and in what manner anything is to be done, and such Act, Law, Order, form, regulation, or procedure shall be construed accordingly.
- 34.—(1) Nothing in this Order shall deprive the Court of the right to observe, and to enforce the observance of, or shall deprive any person of the benefit of, any reasonable custom existing in Siam, unless this Order contains some express and specific provision incompatible with the observance thereof.
- (2) Nothing in this Order shall prevent any Consular Officer in Siam from doing anything which His Majesty's Consuls in the dominions of any other State in amity with His Majesty are, for the time being, by law, usage, or sufferance, entitled or enabled to do.

- 35. Section 48 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1881, (which relates to the deposit of instruments creating powers of attorney in the Central Office of the Supreme Court in England or Ireland), shall apply to Siam with these modifications, that is to say: the Office of the Court is substituted for the Central Office, and Rules of Court under this Order are substituted for General Rules.
- 36.—(1) All fees, fines, or other sums of money which, under the provisions of this Order or any Regulations or Rules of Court, are stated or imposed in terms of British currency shall, if not paid in British gold, be paid in Siam in ticals at such rates as may from time to time be authorized by the Treasury.
- (2) Except as in this Order otherwise provided, all fees, dues, fines, and other receipts under this Order shall be carried to the public account, and shall be accounted for and paid as the Secretary of State, with the concurrence of the Treasury, directs.
- 37. Not later than the 31st March in each year, the Minister shall send to the Secretary of State a report on the operation of this Order up to the 31st January in that year, showing for the then last twelve months the number and nature of the proceedings transferred to the Court, and the result thereof, and the number of estates dealt with under the non-contentious probate jurisdiction of the Court, and the number and amount of fees received, and giving such other information, and being in such form, as the Secretary of State from time to time directs.
- 38.—(1) A printed copy of this Order shall be kept exhibited in the Office of the Court.
- (2) Printed copies shall be sold at such reasonable price as the Minister directs.
- (3) Judicial notice shall be taken of this Order, and of the commencement thereof, and of the constitution of the Court, and of Consular seals and signatures, and of any Rules made or in force under this Order, and no proof shall be required of any of such matters.
- 39. The provisions of the Evidence Act, 1851, (14 and 15 Vict., cap. 99), sections 7 and 11, relating to the proof of judicial and other documents, shall extend and be applied for all purposes as if the Court were in a British Colony.
- 40.—(1) The Siam Order in Council, 1906, the Siam Order in Council, 1909, and the Siam Order in Council, 1913, are hereby repealed, but this repeal shall not—
 - (i) Affect the past operation of those Orders, or any appointment made, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued, or the validity or invalidity of anything done or suffered thereunder, before the making of this Order;
 - (ii) Take away or abridge any protection or benefit given or to be enjoyed in relation thereto.
- (2) Proceedings begun under the Orders in Council repealed by this Order and pending at the date of this Order shall be regulated by the provisions of this Order so far as the circumstances of the case admit.
- 41. This Order shall commence and have effect as follows:---
 - (1) As to the making of any appointment under this Order, immediately from and after the date of this Order.

(2) As to all other matters and provisions comprised and contained in this Order, immediately from and after the date when this Order is first exhibited in the public office of the Court, for which purpose the Minister is hereby required, on receipt of a copy from the Secretary of State, to cause it to be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in the public office of the Court.

(3) Proof shall not in any proceeding or matter be required that the provisions of this Article have been complied with, nor shall any Act or proceeding be invalidated by any failure to comply with any of such

provisions.

And the Right Honourable Sir Edward Grey, Baronet, K.G., M.P., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

SCHEDULE.

PROTOCOL CONCERNING THE JURISDICTION APPLICABLE IN THE KINGDOM OF SIAM TO BRITISH SUBJECTS AND ANNEXED TO THE TREATY, DATED THE 10TH MARCH, 1909.

Section 1. International Courts shall be established at such places as may seem desirable in the interests of the good administration of Justice; the selection of these places shall form the subject of an understanding between the British Minister at Bangkok and the Siamese Minister for Foreign Affairs.

Section 2. The jurisdiction of the International Courts shall extend—

1. In civil matters: To all civil and commercial matters to which British Subjects shall be parties.

2. In penal matters: To breaches of law of every kind whether committed by Britsh Sub-

jects or to their injury.

Section 3. The right of evocation in the International Courts shall be exercised in accordance with the provisions of Article 8 of the Treaty of the 3rd September, 1883.

The right of evocation shall cease to be exercised in all matters coming within the scope of codes or laws regularly promulgated as soon as the text of such codes or laws shall have been communicated to the British Legation in Bangkok. There shall be an understanding between the Ministry for Foreign Affairs and the British Legation at Bangkok for the disposal of cases pending at the time that the said codes and laws are communicated.

Section 4. In all cases, whether in the International Courts or in the ordinary Siamese Courts in which a British Subject is defendant or accused, a European legal adviser shall sit

in the Court of First Instance.

In cases in which a British-born or naturalized Subject not of Asiatic descent may be a party, a European adviser shall sit as a Judge in the Court of First Instance, and where such British Subject is defendant or accused the opinion of the adviser shall prevail.

A British Subject who is in the position of defendant or accused in any case arising in the provinces may apply for a change of venue, and should the Court consider such change desirable, the trial shall take place either at Bangkok or before the Judge in whose Court the case would be tried at Bangkok. Notice of any such application shall be given to the British Consular Officer.

Section 5. Article 9 of the Treaty of the 3rd

September, 1883, is repealed.

Appeals against the decisions of the International Courts of First Instance shall be adjudged by the Siamese Court of Appeal at Bangkok. Notice of all such appeals shall be communicated to His Britannic Majesty's Consul, who shall have the right to give a written opinion upon the case to be annexed to the record.

The judgment on appeal from either the International Courts or the ordinary Siamese Courts shall bear the signature of two European Judges.

Section 6. An appeal on a question of law shall lie from the Court of Appeal at Bangkok

to the Supreme or Dika Court.

Section 7. No plea of want of jurisdiction based on the rules prescribed by the present Treaty shall be advanced in any Court after a defence on the main issue has been offered.

Section 8. In order to present difficulties which may arise in future from the transfer of jurisdiction contemplated by the present Treaty and Protocol, it is agreed—

- (a) All cases in which action shall be taken subsequently to the date of the ratification of this Treaty shall be entered and decided in the competent International or Siamese Court, whether the cause of action arose before or after the date of ratification.
- (b) All cases pending in His Britannic Majesty's Courts in Siam on the date of the ratification of this Treaty shall take their usual course in such Courts and in any Appeal Court until such cases have been finally disposed of, and the jurisdiction of His Britannic Majesty's Courts shall remain in full force for this purpose.

The execution of the judgment rendered in any such pending case shall be carried out by the International Courts.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Protocol and affixed their seals.


