## A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO TRADING WITH THE ENEMY.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS it is desirable to amend Our Proclamation of the 9th September, 1914, called "The Trading with the Enemy Proclamation, No. 2":—

Now, THEREFORE, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation declaring and it is hereby declared as follows:—

1. Paragraph 5, heading (6), of the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation, No. 2, is hereby revoked, and in lieu thereof the following heading shall be inserted in the said Paragraph 5 as from the date hereof:—

(6) "Not to make or enter into any new marine, life, fire or other policy or contract of insurance (including re-insurance) with or for the benefit of an enemy; nor to accept,

or give effect to any insurance of, any risk arising under any policy or contract of insurance (including re-insurance) made or entered into with or for the benefit of an enemy before the outbreak of war; and in particular as regards Treaties or Contracts of re-insurance current at the outbreak of war to which an enemy is a party or in which an enemy is interested not to cede to the enemy or to accept from the enemy under any such Treaty or Contract any risk arising under any policy or contract of insurance (including re-insurance) made or entered into after the outbreak of war, or any share in any such risk."

2. (1) The expression "Order of Council made and published on the recommendation of a Secretary of State" in Paragraph 5, heading (10), of the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation, No. 2, shall, as regards persons resident carrying on business or being in Our Dominions beyond the Seas, be taken to mean an Order of the Governor in Council published in the Official Gazette.

(2) The expression "Governor in Council" in this Paragraph means as respects Canada the

Governor-General of Canada in Council, as respects India the Governor-General of India in Council, as respects Australia the Governor-General of Australia in Council, as respects New Zealand the Governor of New Zealand in Council, as respects the Union of South Africa the Governor-General of the Union of South Africa in Council, as respects Newfoundland the Governor of Newfoundland in Council, and as respects any other British Possession the Governor of that Possession in Council.

3. The power to grant licences on Our behalf vested by Paragraph 8 of the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation, No. 2, in a Secretary of State may be exercised in Canada, India, Australia and the Union of South Africa by the Governor-General, and in any British Possession not included within the limits of Canada, India, Australia or South Africa by the Governor.

4. In this Proclamation the expression "Governor-General" includes any person who for the time being has the powers of the Governor-General, and the expression "Governor" includes the Officer for the time being administering the Government.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in Paragraph 6 of the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation, No. 2, where an enemy has a branch locally situated in British, allied or neutral, territory, which carries on the business of insurance or re-insurance of whatever nature, transactions by or with such branch in respect of the business of insurance or re-insurance shall be considered as transactions by or with an enemy.

6. This Proclamation shall be read as one with the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation, No. 2.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Eighth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and in the Fifth year of Our Reign.

**W**HEREAS by the Aliens Restriction (Consolidation) Order, 1914 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), His Majesty has been pleased to impose restrictions on aliens and to make various provisions for carrying those restrictions into effect:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to extend and amend the said Order in manner hereinafter provided:

Now, THEREFORE, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following Article shall be inserted after Article 25 of the Principal Order:—

"25A. An alien enemy shall not, after the twelfth day of October nineteen hundred and

fourteen, for any purpose assume or use, or purport to assume or use, or continue the assumption or use of any name other than that by which he was ordinarily known at the date of the commencement of the war.

"Where an alien enemy carries on or purports or continues to carry on, or is a member of a partnership or firm which carries on or purports or continues to carry on any trade or business under any name other than that under which the trade or business was carried on at the date of the commencement of the war, he shall, for the purposes of this Order, be deemed to be using or purporting or continuing to use a name other than that by which he was ordinarily known at the date of the commencement of the war.

"Nothing in this Article shall affect the right of a woman who after the commencement of the war marries an alien enemy to use the name which she acquires on her marriage.

"A Secretary of State may, if it appears desirable in any particular case, grant an exemption from the provisions of this Article."

2. In Article 20 of the Principal Order, the word "Order" shall be substituted for the word "Act."

3. This Order may be cited as the Aliens Restriction (Change of Name) Order, 1914.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 37, sections 6 and 8, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 24th day of September, in the year 1914, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the Parish of Heston, in the County of Middlesex, now vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of an Indenture, bearing date the 2nd day of September, in the year 1909, and made or expressed to be made between Lawrence James Baker of Number 10, Ennismore Gardens, Kensington, in the County of London, Esquire, and Walter Henry Macnamara of the Royal Courts of Justice, Strand, in the City of Westminster, Esquire, of the first part, Alice Mary Clark, the wife of the Reverend Paul Newbury Clark of Bodrean, Truro, in the County of Cornwall, Clerk in Holy Orders, of the second part, and

us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the third part, certain land situate in the Parish of Heston aforesaid, containing Four acres three roods and thirty-six perches or thereabouts, delineated and coloured pink on the plan drawn on the said Indenture became with its appurtenances and is now vested in us.

"And whereas the said land is not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but is now in our possession, but on account of its character or situation the said land or some part or parts thereof is unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our Common Fund it is expedient that the said land, or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such land or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any part of the said land so vested in us as aforesaid, with its appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title, and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of London.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of September, 1914, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty, by Your Order in Council of the 11th February, 1913, was graciously pleased to sanction two promotions to Commissioned Rank annually of Warrant Officers or Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that provision should be made for the promotion to Commissioned Rank of additional selected Warrant and Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines for service in the Royal Naval Division:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the promotion of 16 Warrant Officers or Non-Commissioned Officers, Royal Marines, for such service, under the same regulations as regards rank, pay, and allowances as those applicable to Acting Royal Marine Gunners promoted under the provisions of the Order in Council before-mentioned.

"We further beg leave to recommend that Officers so promoted for service in the Royal Naval Division should be permitted to retire either after 10 years' commissioned service or on attaining the age of 55, on the same conditions, as those applicable to Quartermasters, Royal Marines.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or

Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

AND WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade in the following words:

(1) That the exportation of—

Flaxen Canvas, namely:—

Royal Navy Canvas;

Merchant Navy Canvas;

Kitbag Canvas;

Hammock Canvas;

Linen Duck Cloth;

Linen close canvas;

Jute, raw.

should be prohibited to all foreign ports in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas other than those of Russia (except Baltic ports), Belgium, France, Spain, and Portugal.

(2) That the heading "Glacial acetic acid" should be deleted from the list of prohibitions contained in paragraph 6 of the Order of Council of the 8th September, 1914.

(3) That there should be added to the list of prohibitions of export to all destinations—

Hemp cordage and twine, not including cordage or twine of manila hemp or reaper or binder twine;

Blankets, coloured, exceeding 3½ lbs. in weight, known as "woollen" blankets;

Hides of all kinds, dry or wet;

Pig-skins, raw or dressed;

Leather, undressed or dressed, suitable for saddlery, harness, or military boots;

Sheep and lambs' wool, raw.

Now, THEREFORE, their Lordships having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved:

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.

## COUNTY COURTS.

ADDITIONAL RULES, DATED OCTOBER 9TH, 1914,  
 MADE BY THE LORD CHANCELLOR FOR THE  
 COUNTY COURTS PURSUANT TO THE COURTS  
 (EMERGENCY POWERS) ACT, 1914 (4 & 5  
 GEO. 5, c. 78).

The following Rules under the Courts (Emergency Powers) Act, 1914, shall apply to the County Courts, in addition to the Courts (Emergency Powers) Rules, 1914 (herein called the principal Rules).

These Rules shall be read and construed with the principal Rules, and expressions used herein shall have the same meaning as in those Rules.

These Rules shall come into force on the 15th day of October, 1914.

The directions to County Courts issued under the Act, and dated the 11th and 17th days of September, 1914, are hereby annulled, without prejudice to anything already done thereunder; and these Rules shall apply to all proceedings pending under the said directions on the day when these Rules come into force.

1. Proceedings under paragraph (a) of the Act shall include proceedings by way of judgment summons.

2. In the application of Rule 3 of the principal Rules to the County Courts, the word "summons" shall mean "interlocutory application."

3. Applications under Rule 3 may be made to the registrar in accordance with paragraph 3 of Rule 5.

4. A summons issued under paragraph 2 of Rule 5 shall be served on every person affected thereby four clear days at least before the day

fixed for the hearing of the summons, unless the judge or registrar gives leave for shorter service. Service shall be effected in accordance with the County Court Rules as to the service of notice of an interlocutory application.

5. The forms in the Appendix hereto, with such modifications as may be necessary, shall be used on applications to and summonses issued by the County Courts in lieu of the forms in the schedule to the principal Rules. Every such application or summons shall have appended thereto a note in the form in the said Appendix.

6. A notice of an application, or a summons, shall be prepared by the applicant and filed with the registrar, with as many copies as there are parties to be served; and the registrar shall examine, complete, seal, and where necessary sign the same, and shall, where notice of an application under paragraph (a) is pursuant to Rule 3 of the principal Rules to be served with the original summons, annex the copy of the notice to the copy summons for service, and shall in any other case return the copies of the notice or summons to the applicant for service.

7. An order giving leave to proceed under paragraph (a), if made pursuant to paragraph 2 of Rule 3 of the principal Rules at the time of the making of the judgment or order, shall be entered in the minute book and included in the judgment or order.

In any other case, where an order is made under either paragraph (a) or paragraph (b), the registrar shall make a note of the order on the application or summons, but no order need be drawn up or served unless the Court so directs. If the Court so directs, an order shall be prepared and sealed by the registrar and delivered to the bailiff, who shall within twenty-four hours send the same, by post or otherwise to the party against whom the order is made; but it shall not be necessary for the party in whose favour it is made to prove, previously to taking proceedings thereon, that it was posted or reached the opposite party.

8. Where process is issued by or any proceeding taken in the Court pursuant to any order made under either paragraph (a) or paragraph (b), it shall be stated on the face of the process or proceeding that it is issued or taken by leave of the Court.

NOTE.—The Courts (Emergency Powers) Act, 1914, provides that during its operation certain remedies for the payment or recovery of money, or in default of the payment or recovery of money (including the remedy above mentioned), shall not be enforced except upon application to the Court, and that if on any such application the Court is of opinion that time should be given to the person liable to make the payment on the ground that he is unable immediately to make the payment by reason of circumstances attributable directly or indirectly to the present war the Court may, in its absolute discretion, after considering all the circumstances of the case and the position of all the parties, by order defer the operation of any such remedies for such time and subject to such conditions as the Court thinks fit.

If you desire to take advantage of the Act you should attend in person or by your Solicitor at the time and place above mentioned and satisfy the Court that your inability to pay is due to such circumstances.

If you do not attend either in person or by your solicitor at the time and place above mentioned such order will be made and proceedings taken as the Court may think just and expedient.

# VESSELS DETAINED OR CAPTURED BY THE JAPANESE NAVAL AUTHORITIES.

With reference to the notification which appeared in the Supplementary London Gazette of September 12th, 1914, His Majesty's Ambassador at Tokio, having been informed that in accordance with the procedure followed in the British Prize Courts, innocent cargoes on vessels detained or captured will be released on production of proof of ownership, and particulars as to freight, whether paid or unpaid, now telegraphs that the Japanese Authorities are making arrangements with the view of affording similar facilities as regards goods belonging to British subjects on vessels detained or captured by them.

Sir C. Greene also reports that it is announced in the Japanese Official Gazette of October 3rd that the German s.s. "Suimow"

has been captured, and that a Prize Court inquiry will be held. Interested parties may present their petitions in writing to the Prize Court at Sasebo within 30 days.

1. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

## CITY OF COVENTRY.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that the following Bye-laws and Regulations were made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the city of Coventry on the 29th day of September, 1914, under the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Coventry Corporation Act, 1913.

1. In the construction of these Bye-laws and Regulations the following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereinafter respectively assigned to them, unless such meanings be repugnant to or inconsistent with the context or subject matter in which such words or expressions occur; that is to say:—

“Corporation” means the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Coventry.

“Tramways” means the tramways belonging to the Corporation.

“Carriage” means any carriage used by the Corporation on or in connection with the Tramways for the conveyance of passengers, or any Motor Omnibus run by the Corporation for that purpose.

“Driver” means any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation, driving or helping to drive a carriage.

“Conductor” means any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of a carriage.

“Interior of a carriage” does not include the upper deck of covered carriages.

“Premises” means any premises belonging to the Corporation in connection with their Tramways.

2. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindmost or conductor's platform and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor. When a carriage stops, no person shall board the carriage until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

4. No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage in motion.

5. No passenger shall smoke or carry any lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in the interior of a carriage, and no person shall spit in, on, from, or against any carriage.

6. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, whistle, sing, or play or perform upon any musical instrument.

7. No person shall distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or on any carriage.

8. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, or who from that or any other cause is

in the opinion of the conductor unfit to be a passenger in or on the carriage or who in the opinion of the person in charge of any premises is unfit to remain on such premises shall not board or enter any carriage or premises, and if any such person be found in or on any carriage or premises he shall be requested by the conductor or person in charge to leave the carriage or premises, failing which it shall be lawful for such person to be removed by or under the direction of a conductor or person in charge of such premises or any other duly authorised officer or servant of the Corporation.

9. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

10. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, from, or against any carriage or premises.

11. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage any seat, cushion, curtain or lining, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any carriage or premises, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage or premises. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law and Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

12. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure any seat, cushion, curtain or lining in or on any carriage or premises, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter, or remain on or in any carriage, and may be prevented from so doing, and, if found on or in any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the same, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a carriage under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

13. Any ticket for the time being issued by the Corporation in respect of a fare shall only be available for the carriage on or for which it is issued (except in the case of return tickets and transfer tickets), and no person shall (except as hereinafter provided) be entitled to leave any car for any purpose whatever at any stage and resume his journey by a different car to that on or for which such ticket was issued without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger entered the second or other car.

Tickets are not transferable.

No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any day for which such ticket is not available or use a ticket which has already been used on a previous journey.

14. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised

officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for the journey.

15. Each passenger shall show his ticket when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

16. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.

17. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not elsewhere.

18. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall travel on the step or platform of any carriage, or stand on the upper deck, or sit on the railing, guard or buffer of any carriage, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

19. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage.

20. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of a carriage with the consent of the conductor.

21. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a conspicuous notice to that effect shall be placed on the carriage.

22. When any carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage except by express permission of the conductor first obtained.

23. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

24. No person shall travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument or implement which may be dangerous to any passenger.

25. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway or premises, and no person other than the conductor, driver, or duly authorised person, shall

change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord or any other part of a carriage or its equipment.

26. If at any time a carriage becomes disabled or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall be entitled to resume their journey by the next carriage travelling in the same direction which does not contain the full licensed number of passengers.

No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured carriage.

27. No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel in or any carriage or attempt so to do, and no driver or conductor shall suffer or permit any such person so to do.

28. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any carriage, any breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the carriage by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

29. The conductor and driver shall enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof to the best of their ability.

30. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Ten Shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

31. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

32. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of January, 1915.

33. The Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Coventry Electric Tramways Company on the 28th day of February, 1899, are repealed as from the date on which these Bye-laws and Regulations come into force, but any proceedings pending at such date may be continued and prosecuted as if such repeal had not taken effect.

34. These Bye-laws and Regulations may be cited as the Coventry Tramways Bye-laws and Regulations, 1914.
