The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Ex-

amination of Candidates for registration as Temporary Boy Clerks will be held in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Leeds, Liverpool, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Plymouth, Portsmouth, Glasgow, Belfast, and Cork, commencing on the 2nd February, 1915, under the Regulations dated the 13th December, 1912, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.

The number to be registered will depend partly on the requirements of the service, and partly on the number of Candidates who may show sufficient proficiency; but it is not likely to be less than 205, if so many shall be found competent; that is to say, 200 for service in London, Edinburgh, and provincial towns in England, Scotland, and Wales, and 5 for service in Dublin and provincial towns of Ireland exclusively.

No Candidate will be admitted to the Examination from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 17th December, an application, in a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

In the circumstances of the time it is impossible to say whether this will be the last competition for Temporary Boy Clerkships.
