A PROCLAMATION REVISING THE LIST OF CONTRABAND OF WAR.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS on the fourth day of August, 1914, We did issue Our Royal Proclamation specifying the articles which it was Our intention to treat as contraband of war during the war between Us and the German Emperor; and

WHEREAS on the twelfth day of August, 1914, We did by Our Royal Proclamation of that date extend Our Proclamation aforementioned to the war between Us and the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary; and

WHEREAS on the twenty-first day of September, 1914, We did by Our Royal Proclama-

tion of that date make certain additions to the list of articles to be treated as contraband of war; and

WHEREAS it is expedient to consolidate the said lists and to make certain additions thereto:

Now, THEREFORE, We do hereby declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that the lists of contraband contained in the schedules to Our Royal Proclamations of the fourth day of August and the twenty-first day of September aforementioned are hereby withdrawn, and that in lieu thereof during the continuance of the war or until We do give further public notice the articles enumerated in Schedule I hereto will be treated as absolute contraband, and the articles enumerated in Schedule II hereto will be treated as conditional contraband.

SCHEDULE I.

1. Arms of all kinds, including arms for sporting purposes, and their distinctive component parts.
2. Projectiles, charges, and cartridges of all kinds, and their distinctive component parts.
3. Powder and explosives specially prepared for use in war.
4. Sulphuric acid.
5. Gun mountings, limber boxes, limbers, military wagons, field forges and their distinctive component parts.

6. Range-finders and their distinctive component parts.
7. Clothing and equipment of a distinctively military character.
8. Saddle, draught, and pack animals suitable for use in war.
9. All kinds of harness of a distinctively military character.
10. Articles of camp equipment and their distinctive component parts.
11. Armour plates.
12. Hæmatite iron ore and hæmatite pig iron.
13. Iron Pyrites.
14. Nickel ore and nickel.
15. Ferrochrome and chrome ore.
16. Copper, unwrought.
17. Lead, pig, sheet, or pipe.
18. Aluminium.
19. Ferro-silica.
20. Barbed wire, and implements for fixing and cutting the same.
21. Warships, including boats and their distinctive component parts of such a nature that they can only be used on a vessel of war.
22. Aeroplanes, airships, balloons, and aircraft of all kinds, and their component parts, together with accessories and articles recognisable as intended for use in connection with balloons and aircraft.
23. Motor vehicles of all kinds and their component parts.
24. Motor tyres; rubber.
25. Mineral oils and motor spirit, except lubricating oils.
26. Implements and apparatus designed exclusively for the manufacture of munitions of war, for the manufacture or repair of arms, or war material for use on land and sea.

SCHEDULE II.

1. Foodstuffs.
2. Forage and feeding stuffs for animals.
3. Clothing, fabrics for clothing, and boots and shoes suitable for use in war.
4. Gold and silver in coin or bullion; paper money.
5. Vehicles of all kinds, other than motor vehicles, available for use in war, and their component parts.
6. Vessels, craft, and boats of all kinds; floating docks, parts of docks, and their component parts.
7. Railway materials, both fixed and rolling stock, and materials for telegraphs, wireless telegraphs, and telephones.
8. Fuel, other than mineral oils. Lubricants.
9. Powder and explosives not specially prepared for use in war.
10. Sulphur.
11. Glycerine.
12. Horseshoes and shoeing materials.
13. Harness and saddlery.
14. Hides of all kinds, dry or wet; pigskins, raw or dressed; leather, undressed or dressed, suitable for saddlery, harness, or military boots.
15. Field glasses, telescopes, chronometers, and all kinds of nautical instruments.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 29th day of *October*, 1914.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 20th day of August, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to declare that during the present hostilities the Convention known as the Declaration of London should, subject to certain additions and modifications therein specified, be adopted and put in force by His Majesty's Government; and

WHEREAS the said additions and modifications were rendered necessary by the special conditions of the present war; and

WHEREAS it is desirable and possible now to re-enact the said Order in Council with amendments in order to minimise, so far as possible, the interference with innocent neutral trade occasioned by the war:

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. During the present hostilities the provisions of the Convention known as the Declaration of London shall, subject to the exclusion of the lists of contraband and non-contraband, and to the modifications hereinafter set out, be adopted and put in force by His Majesty's Government.

The modifications are as follows:—

(i.) A neutral vessel, with papers indicating a neutral destination, which, notwithstanding the destination shown on the papers, proceeds to an enemy port, shall be liable to capture and condemnation if she is encountered before the end of her next voyage.

(ii.) The destination referred to in Article 33 of the said Declaration shall (in addition to the presumptions laid down in Article 34) be presumed to exist if the goods are consigned to or for an agent of the enemy State.

(iii.) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 35 of the said Declaration, conditional contraband shall be liable to capture on board a vessel bound for a neutral port if the goods are consigned "to order," or if the ship's papers do not show who is the consignee of the goods or if they show a consignee of the goods in territory belonging to or occupied by the enemy.

(iv.) In the cases covered by the preceding paragraph (iii.) it shall lie upon the owners of the goods to prove that their destination was innocent.

2. Where it is shown to the satisfaction of one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State that the enemy Government is drawing supplies for its armed forces from or through a neutral country, he may direct that in respect of ships bound for a port in that country, Article 35 of the said Declaration shall not apply. Such direction shall be notified in the "*London Gazette*," and shall operate until the same is withdrawn. So long as such direction is in force, a vessel which is carrying conditional contraband to a port in that country shall not be immune from capture.

3. The Order in Council of the 20th August, 1914, directing the adoption and enforcement during the present hostilities of the Convention

known as the Declaration of London, subject to the additions and modifications therein specified, is hereby repealed.

4. This Order may be cited as "the Declaration of London Order in Council, No. 2, 1914."

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and each of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the President of the Probate, Divorce, and Admiralty Division of the High Court of Justice, all other Judges of His Majesty's Prize Courts, and all Governors, Officers, and Authorities whom it may concern, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

"WHEREAS by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is

enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 28th day of March, 1903, the 1st day of August, 1908, and the 13th day of June, 1913, rates of pay were sanctioned for Officers of Your Majesty's Royal Marine Force:

"And whereas Your Majesty, by Your Warrant bearing date the 31st day of December, 1913, was pleased to approve of certain additions to the pay of Officers of Your Majesty's Army:

"And whereas we are of opinion that corresponding additions should be made to the pay of Officers of certain ranks in the Royal Marines who entered prior to the 1st January, 1912:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant of increases of pay to the Officers in question, as indicated in the annexed Schedule, with effect as from the 1st day of January, 1914.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of *October*, 1914, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have found it necessary to enter a certain number of Engineer Lieutenants and Engineer Sub-Lieutenants for temporary service in Your Majesty's Fleet during the period of hostilities, under the authority conferred by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 30th September, 1914:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the Regulations for such Officers set forth in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"ENGINEER LIEUTENANTS AND ENGINEER SUB-LIEUTENANTS FOR TEMPORARY SERVICE.

"1. *Pay*.—The scale of pay to be as follows:—

Engineer Lieutenants - 14s. 0d. a day.
" Sub-Lieutenants 9s. 0d. "

"Charge pay to be on the same scale and under the same conditions as for Officers of corresponding rank on the Permanent List of the Royal Navy.

"2. *Equipment Allowance* to be as follows:—

Engineer Lieutenants - - - £40.
" Sub-Lieutenants - - - £30.

"3. *Pensions*.—Officers who may receive hurts or wounds whilst on active service or whilst performing their duties to receive pensions and allowances on the same scale as that applicable to Officers of corresponding rank on the Permanent List of the Royal Navy in similar circumstances.

"4. *Widows' Pensions and Compassionate Allowances to Children* to be granted on the same scale and under the same conditions as those applicable to the Widows and Children of Officers of corresponding Rank on the Permanent List of the Royal Navy."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The following Statutes made by the University of Oxford, on the 27th day of *October*, 1914, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Rawlinson and Bosworth Professor of Anglo-Saxon.

Whereas it is expedient to amend Sect. I § 3 and Sect. II F. § 5 of Title IV of the Statutes of the University of Oxford, so as to make further provision with regard to the duties of the Rawlinson and Bosworth Professor of Anglo-Saxon:

Now the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

1. In *Statt. Tit. IV Sect. I § 3, Schedule B* (p. 70, ed. 1914), the words "Rawlinsonian Professor of Anglo-Saxon" shall be struck out.

2. In *Statt. Tit. IV Sect. II F. § 5* (p. 115), in clause 1 all the words after the words "lecture and give instruction" to the end of the clause shall be struck out, and the words "on the Anglo-Saxon Language and Literature, and on the other Old Germanic Languages especially Gothic and Old Icelandic" shall be substituted therefor.

3. *Ibid.*, after clause 4 the following new clause shall be added:—

"5. The Professor shall be subject to the General Regulations laid down in *Statt. Tit. IV Sect. I § 3*."

Linacre Professor of Comparative Anatomy.

Whereas under and by virtue of the powers conferred on them by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, the University of Oxford Commissioners made on the 9th day of *April*, 1881, a Statute concerning the Duties of Professors, and on the 16th day of *June*, 1881, a Statute concerning the Linacre Professor of Human and Comparative Anatomy, which Statutes were approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the 3rd day of *May*, 1882;

And whereas the said Statutes were amended by the University on the 5th day of *March*, 1892, by an Amending Statute, which Amending Statute was approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the 16th day of *May*, 1893;

And whereas the said Statutes have been incorporated in the Statutes of the University, and are now known and hereinafter referred to as *Statt. Tit. IV Sect. I § 3* and *Statt. Tit. IV Sect. II E. § 9* respectively;

And whereas under and by virtue of the powers conferred on the University by the said Act the University of Oxford on the 18th day of *June*, 1912, made a Statute concerning the Faculties and the Boards of Faculties partly by

way of alteration of certain Statutes made by the said Commissioners, which Statute was approved by His Majesty in Council on the 11th day of February, 1913, and forms part of Titulus V of the Statutes of the University;

And whereas it is expedient to amend the provisions of the said Statutes so far as they relate to the title of the said Linacre Professor and to the Collections placed in his charge;

Now the University under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of any other power enabling it, hereby enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

1. In *Statt. Tit. IV Sect. 1 § 3*, Particular Regulations, clause 4 (*d*) (p. 69, ed. 1914), before the words "Comparative Anatomy" the words "Zoology and" shall be inserted; the words "Anatomical and Ethnological Collections and the Anatomical Laboratories" shall be struck out, and the words "Department of Comparative Anatomy" shall be substituted therefor; the words "or such part thereof as the University may by Statute assign to him" shall be struck out; and after the words "carried on there" the following words shall be added, viz. "He shall also have charge of such collections illustrative of Zoology and Comparative Anatomy as the University may by Statute or Decree assign to him."

2. *Ibid.*, Schedule C (p. 70), before the words "Comparative Anatomy" the words "Zoology and" shall be inserted.

3. In *Statt. Tit. IV Sect. 11 E. § 9* (p. 99), in the title, before the words "Comparative Anatomy" the words "Zoology and" shall be inserted.

4. *Ibid.*, cl. 1 (p. 99), after the word "Physiology" the words "the Linacre Professorship of Human and Comparative Anatomy, and the Linacre Professorship of Comparative Anatomy" shall be inserted; and before the words "Comparative Anatomy" the words "Zoology and" shall be inserted.

5. *Ibid.*, cl. 2, before the words "Comparative Anatomy" (in both places where they occur) the words "Zoology and" shall in each case be inserted.

6. *Ibid.*, cl. 4, before the word "Anatomy" the words "Zoology and Comparative" shall be inserted.

7. In *Statt. Tit. V Sect. v* (p. 140), in the Schedule, before the words "Comparative Anatomy" the words "Zoology and" shall be inserted.

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Merton College, Oxford, on the 7th day of October, 1914, (and sealed on the 27th day of October, 1914), have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

The Warden and Fellows of Merton College, Oxford, respectfully submit for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council the following

amending Statutes which were duly made in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, section 54, having been passed unanimously at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the 7th of October, 1914.

It was resolved at the said General Meeting—

I. That in Statute III, 11, the following new clause be inserted immediately after (*a*) (ii.):—

"(iii.) The Professor of English Literature, who shall receive from the College a stipend of £700 per annum, clear of income tax, in addition to the emolument of his Fellowship."

II. That in Statute IX (*b*), £300 be substituted for £500.

Persons tendering for Bills are hereby notified that, having regard to the provisions of the Acts 22 George III., cap. 45, and 41 George III., cap. 52, the acceptance of any such tender is subject to the express condition that no Member of the House of Commons shall be admitted to any share or part in or to any benefit to arise from the contract thereby made for the allotment of such Bills.

The provisions in question do not apply to contracts entered into by an incorporated trading company in its corporate capacity and made for the general benefit of the company.

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a note from the United States Ambassador stating that, according to information furnished to the United States Government by their Ambassador at Vienna, the Austro-Hungarian Government will grant protection to money belonging to British subjects lying in Austrian and Hungarian Banks until the conclusion of peace, on the basis of reciprocity.

Where an Approved Society has in accordance with Section 27 of the Act made provision by rules with respect to the matters for which provision is required by that section to be made by a Society with branches, any branch of that Society in respect of which separate accounts have been kept and which before the date of this Order has applied or has given notice to the Commissioners of its intention to apply under the Friendly Societies Act, 1896, to be separately registered and which before the 31st day of December, 1914, has or may become so registered, shall, for the purposes of the Act, be deemed to have been a registered branch of the Society from the date when it commenced to transact business under Part I of the Act as a branch of the Society, and the provisions of the Act relating to branches of an Approved Society shall apply accordingly.

2. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Registration of Branches) Order, 1914.
