NOTICE.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received information to satisfy him that British merchant ships, which cleared from their last port of departure before the outbreak of hostilities with Austria-Hungary, but have been, or may be, met with at sea by Austro-Hungarian ships of war after the outbreak of such hostilities, are to be detained during the war, or requisitioned in lieu of condemnation as prize, and he has accordingly addressed the undermentioned notification to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

My Lords,

I HAVE the honour to state that information has reached me of a nature to satisfy me that British merchant ships, which cleared from their last port before the outbreak of hostilities with Austria-Hungary, but have been, or may be, met with at sea by AustroHungarian ships of war after the outbreak of such hostilities, are to be detained during the war, or requisitioned in lieu of condemnation

Austro-Hungarian merchant vessels therefore, which cleared from their last port before the declaration of war, and are captured after the outbreak of hostilities with Austria-Hungary and brought before British Prize Courts for adjudication, will be detained during the war, or requisitioned subject to indemnity.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means, His Majesty the King has power and jurisdiction in Morocco:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and

it is hereby ordered, as follows:—
1.—(1) Where any Regulations relating to sanitary or police matters, or to public health, or to the control of any port, or for any similar purpose, are issued by the authorities in charge of any town or district in Morocco, and such Regulations are binding on the Moorish inhabitants of such town or district, and are, so far as they affect British subjects or Britishprotected persons, approved by the Secretary of State, the Court for Morocco may, subject and according to the provisions of this Order, entertain any complaint made against a British subject or British-protected person for a breach of such Regulations, and may enforce payment of any fine incurred by that subject or person in respect of that breach, in like manner, as nearly as may be, as if that breach were by this Order declared to be an offence against this Order.

(2) In any such case the fine recovered shall, notwithstanding anything in this Order, be disposed of and applied in manner provided by such Regulations.

2. Article 109 of the Morocco Order in Council, 1889, is hereby repealed, but such repeal

(a) Affect the past operation of such article or any right, title, obligation, or liability thereunder; or

(b) Interfere with the institution or pro-

secution of any legal proceedings thereunder.
3. This Order shall be cited as "The Morocco Order in Council, 1914," and shall be read as one with the Morocco Order in Council, 1889.

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 20th day of October,

1914, in the words following, viz.:-

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that Separation Allowances should be paid during the period of the present War to the wives and in respect of the children of Seamen, Marines, and Reservists borne on the books of Your Majesty's Ships, and to other persons who are in fact dependent upon them:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment of such allowances at rates not exceeding those set forth in the following Schedule, to take effect from the 1st day of October, 1914.

"The Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in this proposal.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. Persons tendering for Bills are hereby notified that, having regard to the provisions of the Acts 22 George III, cap. 45, and 41 George III, cap. 52, the acceptance of any such Tender is subject to the express condition that no Member of the House of Commons shall be admitted to any share or part in or to any benefit to arise from the Contract thereby made for the allotment of such Bills.

The provisions in question do not apply to Contracts entered into by an incorporated trading company in its corporate capacity and made for the general benefit of the company.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

In accordance with Regulations made under section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade, and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for certain branches of the Machine-made Lace and Net Finishing Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 16th March, 1914, have given notice, as required by section 4 (3) of the above Act, that they have fixed the following minimum or lowest rates of wages:—

For the finishing of those Hair Nets, Veilings and Quillings which are the product of plain net machines, 23d. per hour clear of all deductions.*

The above rate applies to workers other than

learners. For learners (as defined by the Trade Board) certain lower minimum time rates have been fixed.

- 2. Similar notice has also been given that the Trade Board have fixed General Minimum Piece Rates for the finishing of Hair Nets (whether they are the product of plain net machines or not) as follows:—
 - (a) For Threading:

Per gross Nets.

Hair Nets up to and including $12\frac{1}{2}$ inches, with 38 holes each or less ... 4d. Hair Nets from $12\frac{1}{2}$ inches up to and including 18 inches, with 48 holes each

All sizes over 18 inches, with 50 holes 6d. For every 4 holes additional to those above specified
(b) For Carding: ⅓d. . . .

Per gross Nets.

For Cards not exceeding 8 inches in diameter, or its equivalent in the case of cards which are not circular For Cards from 8 inches up to and including 10 inches in diameter 1d. For Cards over 10 inches in diameter ... 11d. The above rates apply also to Bundling in dozens without cards.

(c) For Ticketing:

Per gross Nets.

.For all Ticketing done at the same time as threading ...

When threading and carding are done at the same time the rate shall be the sum of the respective rates specified above.

In totalling up any weekly reckoning in the aggregate so arrived at, the reckoning shall be to the nearest farthing.

All piece rates are to be paid clear of all

deductions.*

On application to the Trade Board further information will (if in the opinion of the Trade Board the applicant is likely to be affected) be given as to the Minimum rates fixed.

SURREY AUDIT DISTRICT.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Dis-

And whereas by an Order dated the 23rd day of March, 1909, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of Walter Young, Barrister-at-Law, as a District Auditor, and assigned to him the duties therein mentioned and the District in which he should act as Auditor, and which in the said Order was termed "The Surrey Audit District '
