NOTICE TO IMPORTERS AND EXPORTERS.

1. The attention of importers and exporters is directed to the provisions of His Majesty's Proclamation dated the 9th September, relating to Trading with the Enemy. By paragraph 5 (7) of this Proclamation all persons resident, carrying on business, or being in His Majesty's Dominions are warned "not directly or indirectly to supply to or for the use or benefit of, or obtain from an enemy country or an enemy any goods, wares, or merchandise; nor directly or indirectly to supply to or for the use or benefit of, or obtain from any person any goods, wares, or merchandise, for or by way of transmission to or from an enemy country or an enemy; nor directly or indirectly to trade in or carry any goods, wares, or merchandise destined for or coming from an enemy country or an enemy." It is further provided by paragraph 3 that the expression "enemy" in the Proclamation means "any person or body of persons of whatever nationality resident or carrying on business in the enemy

country, but does not include persons of enemy nationality who are neither resident nor carrying on business in the enemy country. In the case of incorporated bodies, enemy character attaches only to those incorporated in an enemy country."

2. With a view to preventing breaches of this Proclamation it is hereby notified that the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise have been authorized by His Majesty's Government to require Certificates of Origin or Declarations of Ultimate Destination respectively to be presented in respect of all goods, wares, or merchandise imported into or exported from the United Kingdom in trade with any foreign place in Europe or on the Mediterranean or Black Seas, with the exception of those situated in Russia, Belgium, France, Spain, and Portugal.

3. Declarations of Ultimate Destination will consequently be required until further notice in respect of all exports, without regard to value of consignments, to all the foreign places referred to above.

4. For the present, however, Certificates of Origin will not be required in respect of imports of foodstuffs, of timber of any kind (including pit-props), strawboard, wood pulp, iron ore, granite, ice, tar, or carbide of calcium, or in respect of any imports from places other than those situated in Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Holland, Switzerland, and Italy, or in respect of individual consignments not exceeding £25 in value. The Certificates and Declarations referred to must be in the form prescribed by the Schedules I and II hereto.

5. Any goods, wares, or merchandise imported from the above-mentioned foreign places, except as provided in paragraph 4, unaccompanied by Certificates of Origin will be detained by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise until the requisite certificates are produced. The Commissioners, are, however, authorized in such cases, and at their discretion, to allow delivery of the goods on the security of a deposit or of a bond to the amount of three times the value of the goods with a view to the production of the necessary certificates within a prescribed period, provided that they see no reason for suspecting that the goods emanate from an enemy country.

6. Goods, wares, or merchandise sought to be exported to any foreign places in Europe or on the Mediterranean or Black Seas, with the exception of those situated in Russia, Bel-

gium, France, Spain and Portugal will not be allowed to be shipped until Declarations of Ultimate Destination in the form prescribed have been lodged with the proper Customs authority.

7. A single Declaration of Ultimate Destination may be used to cover any number of consignments by the same exporter from the same port by the same ship at the same time.

8. Declarations of Ultimate Destination must be made by the actual exporter or by some responsible representative of the actual exporter (or in the case of a Limited Company by a Director, Secretary, Manager, or other responsible officer) having a personal and first-hand knowledge of the enquiries made and of the facts stated in the Declaration. Carrying Agents are not regarded as competent to make the Declaration.

9. The following goods will be exempt from these requirements:—

(a) Goods imported under licence;

(b) Goods shipped for the United Kingdom on or before the 19th November and hitherto exempted;

(c) Goods in respect of which Customs export entries have been accepted before the publication of this Notice.

NORTHAMPTONSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 5).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Orders.

1. The Northamptonshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the Northamptonshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1914 (Nos. 3 and 4), are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Parts of Zone I.

2. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply without modification to the Area described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the Prohibited Parts).

Movement into and within Zone I (except the Prohibited Parts).

3. The provisions which were applied by Order (No. 4) to Zone II shall apply to Zone I (except the Prohibited Parts), except that for the purpose of movement into Zone I (except the Prohibited Parts) Zone II shall be treated as if it were not in the Scheduled District.

Free Movement into and within Zone II.

Movement out of Zone II into Zone I.

4.—(1.) The restrictions on movement of animals imposed by the Orders referred to in

Article 1 shall not apply to any movement of animals—

(a) within Zone II; or

(b) into Zone II from premises situate outside the Scheduled District.

(2.) No animal shall be moved out of Zone II except for the purpose of movement into Zone I (except the Prohibited Parts) under and in accordance with the provisions of Article 3 of this Order.

Holding of Markets and Sales in Zone II.

5.—(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in Zone II if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 6 of Order (No. 3).

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Short Title, etc.

7. This Order may be cited as the NORTHAMPTONSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 5), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

2. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply without modification to the borough of Deal.

Movement into and within Zone I. (excluding the borough of Deal).

3.—(1.) The provisions which were applied by Order (No. 4) to Zone II. shall apply to Zone I. (excluding the borough of Deal) except that for the purpose of movement into Zone I. (excluding the borough of Deal), Zone II. shall be treated as if it were not in the Scheduled District.

(2.) Article 4 of Order (No. 4) is hereby revoked.

Free Movement into and within Zone II.

Movement out of Zone II. into Zone I.

4.—(1.) The restrictions on movement of animals imposed by the Orders referred to in Article 1 shall not apply to any movement of animals—

(a) within Zone II.; or

(b) into Zone II., from premises situate outside the Scheduled District.

(2.) No animal shall be moved out of Zone II. except for the purpose of movement into Zone I. (excluding the borough of Deal) under and in accordance with the provisions of Article 3 of this Order.

Holding of Markets and Sales in Zone II.

5.—(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in Zone II. if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 6 of Order No. 3.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

institution, fund, object, or movement now or hereafter existing, or in operation, or proposed to be formed or carried on wholly or partly within the Diocese of Truro in connection with the Church of England, or designed for the benefit, promotion, or development of that Church, or any of its works, agencies, or operations, and whether or not in connection with or support of or forming a branch or agency of any like body or object existing outside of or not confirmed to that Diocese.

(c) To carry on in the Association's own name any purposes, objects, or measures for which any such body as mentioned in the preceding clause might exist.

(d) To act or to nominate or recommend any of the Association's officers or other persons to act as manager, or the committee of management, or as treasurer, trustee, auditor, inspector of, or in any other capacity for any such body as mentioned in clause (b) hereinafter referred to as any such body.

(e) To nominate persons to act as trustees for the Association in respect of any of its purposes, and to appoint and employ agents and persons in any capacity for the furtherance of any of the Association objects or purposes.
