His MAJESTY THE KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the grant of the Victoria Cross to the undermentioned Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men for conspicuous bravery whilst serving with the Expeditionary Force:—

Rank.	Name.	Corps, etc.	Action for which commended.
13814 Private	Sidney Frank Godley	4th Battalion The Royal Fusiliers, City of London Regiment	For coolness and gallantry in fighting his machine gun under a hot fire for two hours after he had been wounded at Mons on 23rd August.
69960 Driver 71787 Driver	Job Henry Charles Drain Frederick Luke	37th Battery Royal S Field Artillery	At Le Cateau on 26th August, as volunteers, helping to save guns under fire from hostile infantry who were 100 yards away.
Major	Charles Allix Lavington Yate (deceased)	2nd Battalion The King's Own (York- shire Light In- fantry)	Commanded one of the two Companies that remained to the end in the trenches at Le Cateau on 26th August, and, when all other officers were killed or wounded and ammunition exhausted, led his nineteen survivors against the enemy in a charge in which he was severely wounded. He was picked up by the enemy and has subsequently idied as a prisoner of war,
