“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said

late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘the said Benefice’) of Saint Peter, Oughtrington, in the County and Diocese of Chester, and a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘the said Benefice’) of Norley, in the same County and Diocese.

“Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Oughtrington, is vested for an estate in fee simple, in possession, free from incumbrances, in the Reverend Geoffrey Egerton Warburton, of Warburton, in the said County of Chester, Clerk in Holy Orders, and the Reverend Alfred James Blencowe, of West Kirby, in the same County, Canon of Chester Cathedral, and Clerk in Holy Orders, upon trust to present such Clerk or Clerks as the Bishop of Chester for the time being should himself select or nominate for presentation.

“And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Norley is vested for an estate in fee simple, in possession, free from incum-

brances, in the Right Reverend Francis John, Bishop of Chester, in his private capacity.

"And whereas the said Geoffrey Egerton Warburton, and Alfred James Blencowe, as regards the advowson of the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Oughtrington, and the said Francis John, Bishop of Chester, as regards the advowson of the said Benefice of Norley, are desirous that the whole advowsons or perpetual rights of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefices, now respectively vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the said Right Reverend Francis John, Bishop of Chester, and his successors in the same Bishoprick.

"And whereas the said Francis John, Bishop of Chester, acting as such Bishop, is willing to accept the transfer of the said advowsons, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore-mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Francis John, Bishop of Chester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said Benefices of Saint Peter, Oughtrington, and Norley, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the several Parishes or Districts in, or in respect of which, the rights of patronage or advowsons so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arise or exist, that is to say in the New Parish of Saint Peter, Oughtrington, and the Parish of Norley, respectively.

"Now, therefore, with the consent as regards the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Oughtrington, of the said Geoffrey Egerton Warburton and Alfred James Blencowe (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent as regards the said Benefice of Norley, of the said Francis John, Bishop of Chester, in his private capacity, and with the consent as regards both Benefices of the said Francis John, Bishop of Chester, as such Bishop, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Saint Peter, Oughtrington, and Norley, shall be transferred to the said Francis John, Bishop of Chester, and his successors in the same Bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Francis John, Bishop of Chester, and his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accord-

ance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

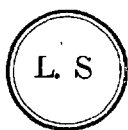

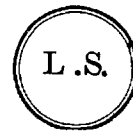
